## > RAINFALL OUTLOOK:

Scattered Rainfall of moderate to heavy intensity with Isolated very heavy fall is likely over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers and Widespread Rainfall of heavy to very heavy intensity is expected over Suleman Range along with Sindh & Balochistan from 10<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> August 2022.

## > FLOOD SITUATION IN MAJOR RIVERS:

- Heavy Rains may generate urban flooding in Rawalpindi/Islamabad, Peshawar, Nowshera, Mardan, Faisalabad, Lahore and Gujranwala from 10<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> August.
- Flash flooding is expected in local Nullahs of Islamabad/Rawalpindi, Shakargarh, Sialkot, Narowal, Abbottabad, Mansehra, Dir, Karak, Lakki Marwat, Bannu and Kashmir from 10<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> August.
- Heavy Rains may generate urban flooding in Karachi, Thatta, Badin, Hyderabad, Dadu, Jamshoro, Sukkur, Larkana, Shaheed Benazirabad and Mirpurkhas from 11<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> August.
- Flash flooding is expected in Qilla Saifullah, Loralai, Barkhan, Kohlu, Mosa Khel, Sherani, Sibbi, Bolan, Kalat, Khuzdar, Lasbella, Awaran, Turbat, Panjgur, Pasni, Jiwani, Ormara, Gwadar and hill torrents of Dera Ghazi Khan during the same period.
- Catchment areas of Rivers Ravi, Jhelum and Chenab may receive heavy downpour causing water level to rise during the forecast period.

## Subject: Monsoon Activity Likely to Continue – More Rains from 6 to 13 Aug

Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) has issued weather advisory informing that Monsoon currents are continuously penetrating the Country and likely to become stronger from 10 August (Wednesday); (details enclosed at *Annex-A*): -

- a. Rain-wind/thundershower (with isolated heavy falls) is expected in Kashmir, Islamabad, northeast Punjab, upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, eastern Balochistan and southeastern Sindh from 06<sup>th</sup> to 09<sup>th</sup> August with occasional gaps.
- b. Rain-wind/thundershower (with scattered heavy falls) are expected in Kashmir, Gilgit-Baltistan, Islamabad, Punjab, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Sindh and parts of Balochistan from 10<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> August with occasional gaps.
- All concerned Federal Ministries / Departments, respective Provincial Governments and their line departments including PIDs / PDMAs / GBDMA / SDMA, District Administrations / DDMAs, Municipal / City Administrations are advised to ensure following: -
  - Identification of vulnerable / choke points / at-risk communities based on recent patterns of rainfall and take necessary measures.
  - Maintain enhanced alert level / monitoring of developing situation to reduce reaction / response time.
  - c. All civic agencies / rescue services (Rescue 1122 / Fire Brigade / Ambulance / Civil Defence) to remain alert and ensure availability of personnel and equipment during the forecasted period, especially in at-risk urban areas.
  - d. Restrict vehicle movement in areas / nullahs prone to flash floods, low lying areas and close to water channels.
  - People living along the banks of Rivers Canals and Nullahs be sensitized about potential dangers.
  - f. Timely evacuation of at-risk population from low-lying / flood prone areas as per evacuation plans and provision of shelter, food and medicines in camps.
  - g. DISCOs and relevant Local Administration / Departments to ensure that necessary arrangements are undertaken to avoid electrocution incidents and timely restoration of power supply.

- h. Mass awareness campaign for general public on urban / flash / riverine flooding and associated risks in vulnerable areas on following aspects: -
  - Avoid unnecessary movement in such areas.
  - (2) Evacuation plan of at-risk communities and its timely evacuation.
  - (3) Risk and consequent danger of submerging of vehicles in such inundated low-lying areas.
  - (4) Alerting masses living in low-lying areas to exercise extra caution including community-based alert system.
  - (5) Risk of electrocution during heavy rain fall / urban flooding in major metropolises.
- Provision of relief / medical supplies to affectees in timely manner.
- LEAs along with Traffic police to advise travelers regarding likely situations / dangers of waterlogged areas and underpasses.
- k. Coordinate with concerned departments for clearance of roads in case of any landslides / blockage / obstruction, waterlogging and pre-placing of necessary emergency equipment at vulnerable / appropriate locations.
- I. Travelers and Tourists are forewarned about risks posed at landslide / flash flood vulnerable locations and may be diverted to safe lay-by / waiting areas with sufficient supply of water / food and essential medicines in case of adverse / dangerous road conditions by Police, NH&MP and Local Administrations.
- In case of any eventuality, special SITREP / update be shared immediately with NDMA.
