Subject: PRE-MONSOON RAINS-THUNDERSHOWERS FROM 15 JUNE 2022

Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) has issued a press release informing that pre-monsoon rains / thundershowers are expected in Islamabad, Gilgit-Baltistan, AJ&K and areas of Balochistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Punjab and Sindh; details enclosed at Annex-A. Respective PDMAs / GBDMA / SDMA, District Administrations, Municipal Administrations and Line Departments are advised to promptly ensure following precautionary measures: -

- Coordinate with concerned departments (NHA, FWO and C&W) for restoration of a. roads in case of any blockage / obstruction / closures.
- b. Billboards and hoardings are secured from effects of thunderstorms / wind.
- Preplace necessary emergency equipment at vulnerable / strategic locations. C.
- d. Availability of emergency services personnel and equipment (Rescue 1122 / Fire Brigade / Ambulance / Civil Defence) during the forecasted period.
- Travellers / Visitors are forewarned about risks posed at landslide / flash flood e. vulnerable locations. Furthermore, Local Administration / Police / Rescue Services are to guide / provide assistance to safe area in case of any emergency.
- f. In case of any eventuality, twice daily updates be shared with NDMA.

# MORE PRE-MONSOON RAINS-THUNDERSHOWERS FROM WEDNESDAY, 15 JUNE (EVENING / NIGHT)

Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) has informed that moist currents from the Arabian Sea are likely to penetrate in Upper Parts of the Country from **Wednesday**, **15 June** (evening / night). Under the influence of this system the following weather conditions are expected: -

# > Islamabad

- Rain-wind / thundershowers are expected in Islamabad from Thursday,
  16 June Tuesday, 21 June.
- Heavy Falls are expected in Islamabad on Thursday, 16 June (evening / night) and Friday, 17 June which may generate Urban Flooding.

# **Balochistan**

Rain-wind / thundershowers with isolated heavy falls are expected in Sibbi,
 Bolan, Naseerabad, Jhalmagsi, Mastung, Barkhan, Ziarat, Quetta, Kalat,
 Khuzdar, Chaman and Harnai from Friday, 17 June (evening / night) –
 Monday, 20 June.

# Khyber Pakhtunkhwa

 Rain-wind / thundershowers with isolated heavy falls expected in Abbottabad, Bannu, Chitral, Dera Ismail Khan, Dir, Haripur, Kohat, Kohistan, Kurram, Lakki Marwat, Mansehra, Nowshera, Peshawar, Swabi, Swat and Waziristan from Wednesday, 15 June – Wednesday, 22 June (with occasional gaps).

#### Punjab

- Rain-wind / thundershowers are expected in Attock, Rawalpindi, Murree, Chakwal, Jhelum, Mianwali, Sargodha, Khushab, Hafizabad, Mandibahauddin, Sialkot, Narowal, Lahore, Sheikhupura, Faisalabad, Toba Tek Singh from Thursday, 16 June – Tuesday, 21 June.
- Rain-wind / thundershowers are expected in Multan, Dera Ghazi Khan,
  Rajanpur, Bhakkar, Layyah, Muzaffargarh, Kot Adu, Sahiwal, Khanewal,
  Pakpattan, Okara, Bahawalnagar, Bahawalpur, Khanpur and Rahim Yar Khan
  from Friday, 17 June Monday, 20 June (with occasional gaps).
- Heavy Falls are expected in Rawalpindi, Jhelum, Gujranwala, Sialkot, Lahore, Kasur and Sheikhupura on Thursday, 16 June (evening / night) and Friday, 17 June that may generation Urban Flooding.

## > Sindh

 Hot and dry weather in most parts of the Province with chances of dust-thunderstorms / rain in Sukkur, Jacobabad and Larkana from Friday,
 17 June (evening / night) – Sunday, 19 June.

## > Gilgit-Baltistan

Rain-wind / thundershowers with a few heavy falls expected in Astore,
 Diamer, Ghizer, Gilgit, Hunza & Skardu from Wednesday, 15 June (evening / night) – Thursday, 23 June.

# Azad Jammu & Kashmir

Rain-wind / thundershowers with a few heavy falls expected in Bagh,
 Bhimber, Hattian, Haveli, Kotli, Mirpur, Muzaffarabad & Neelum Valley from
 Wednesday, 15 June (evening / night) – Thursday, 23 June.

## Possible Impacts

- Heatwave conditions are likely to subside.
- Water availability may improve for crops, vegetables and orchards.
- Wind / dust-thunderstorms may cause damages to loose structures in Islamabad,
  Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Punjab, Gilgit Baltistan and AJ&K during the forecasted period.
- Heavy rainfall may trigger landslides in Gilgit Baltistan, AJ&K & Upper Parts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and may generate flash flooding in Eastern Parts of Balochistan (Bolan, Harnai, Jhalmagsi, Jaffarabad, Naseerabad and Sibbi).

NOTE: All concerned authorities are advised to remain ALERT during the forecasted period.
