Subject: Infrastructure Advisory 01/25 – Risk Preparedness for Forecasted
Hailstorm/ Windstorm 18-20 Apr 2025

- 1. The Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD), in its forecast issued on 18th April 2025, has warned that a westerly weather system will affect Upper and Central Pakistan from the night of 18 April (evening) through 20 April (morning). This system is expected to bring hailstorms, windstorms, and lightning.
- 2. A severe hailstorm on 16 April 2025 caused widespread damage to **solar panels, vehicles, rooftops, and utility infrastructure**. To reduce the risk of similar or greater impact, all relevant departments and the public are advised to take precautionary measures immediately.

3. **Recommended Actions**

a. **Solar and Green Infrastructure**

- Cover exposed solar panels with thick plastic sheets or jute tarpaulin (tarpaal) available in local markets.
- (2) Shut off and isolate solar systems during lightning to prevent electrical surges or short circuits.
- (3) Check and tighten panel mounts to ensure basic anchoring against wind and hail impact.

b. Vehicles and Public Parking

- (1) Park vehicles in covered areas such as verandas, basements, or car sheds.
- (2) Encourage mosques, schools, and commercial plazas to open covered parking for public use during hail alerts.
- (3) In absence of shelter, cover windshields with quilts, blankets, or thick cardboard to minimize breakage.

c. Residential Property Protection

- (1) Tape windows (from outside) in a cross pattern or place cloth or foam cushions behind glass to reduce shattering.
- (2) Reinforce fiber / corrugated sheet rooftops using additional nails, bricks, or sandbags above them to hold panels down temporarily.
- (3) Tie down awnings, shades, and rooftop items with ropes or remove them where possible.

d. Roof-top Structures

- (1) Remove or secure loose items such as plastic tanks, dish antennas, satellite receivers, or chairs.
- (2) Clean drainage pipes and outlets on roof-tops to prevent water accumulation from hail melt.
- (3) Seal visible cracks and leaks using quick-dry cement or silicone tubes available at hardware stores.

e. **Power and Communication Lines**

- (1) Trim overhanging branches near electric poles or wires, especially in streets and public compounds.
- (2) Keep linemen teams on alert with essential repair tools, especially in areas with prior outages.
- (3) Ensure generators at hospitals are fuelled and protected from water or debris.

f. Urban Trees and Landscaping

- (1) Prune unstable or large trees near roads or buildings in coordination with Municipal teams.
- (2) **Pre-alert Municipal/ Administrative staff** for quick clean-up in case of fallen branches.
