Parliamentary Delegation Visited NEOC

01-09-2025



A high-level delegation of parliamentarians, led by Speaker National Assembly, Raja Ayaz Sadiq, visited the National Emergencies Operation Center (NEOC) to review the ongoing disaster management operations.

During the visit, NDMA officials provided a comprehensive briefing on the current monsoon and flood situation, highlighting the early warning mechanisms, rescue and relief efforts, and preventive measures being undertaken across the country.

Chairman NDMA, Lieutenant General Inam Haider Malik, apprised the delegation that the Authority, in close coordination with civil and military departments, has been operating round the clock to ensure timely response and safety of communities at risk. He briefed the delegation about relief and evacuation efforts with support of Provincial Governments, Armed Forces and humanitarian organisations.

The parliamentary delegation lauded NDMA's proactive approach and commended its tireless efforts in disaster preparedness and response. The members also pledged full national-level support to strengthen disaster management systems and enhance community resilience across Pakistan.

Pakistan Dispatched Relief Assistance for Earthquake-Affected People of Afghanistan 04-09-2025



On the instructions of the Prime Minister of Pakistan, the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) dispatched 105 tons of humanitarian relief assistance for the earthquake-affected people of Afghanistan. The relief consignment included ration bags, tents, blankets, floor mats, and essential medicines, providing immediate support to families impacted by the devastating earthquakes.

The aid was transported to Afghanistan via the Torkham border, using five 40-foot container trucks for timely delivery to affected regions. A dispatch ceremony was held on September 3 at NDMA's warehouse in Islamabad, attended by Federal Minister for Sports, Das Kohistani, along with officials from NDMA and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

The initiative reflected Pakistan's continued solidarity and humanitarian commitment to supporting the people of Afghanistan in their time of need.

U.S. Disaster Response Group Visited NEOC 06-09-2025



The National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) held a two-day consultative session with the United States Disaster Response Group at the National Emergencies Operation Center (NEOC), Islamabad.

The U.S. delegation was led by H.E. Natalie Baker, Deputy Chief of Mission, and Lt Gen Patrick Frank, Commanding Officer of U.S. ARCENT, followed by Ivana Vuco, Disaster Expert for Asia, and her team from the U.S. State Department.

Chairman NDMA, Lt Gen Inam Haider Malik, briefed the participants on NEOC's advanced early warning systems, risk communication, international coordination, and the success of Comprehensive International Simulation Exercises (CISE). He highlighted NDMA's anticipatory approach, risk financing, and use of technology in disaster management.

The U.S. delegation praised NDMA's proactive and technology-driven framework, reaffirming commitment to collaborate in disaster risk reduction and simulation exercises to enhance regional resilience.

VEON–Jazz Leadership Visited NDMA to Strengthen Digital Disaster Collaboration

A senior-level delegation from VEON and Jazz, led by Mr. Kaan Terzioğlu, CEO VEON Group, and Mr. Aamir Ibrahim, CEO Jazz, visited the National Emergencies Operation Center (NEOC) at NDMA Headquarters. The delegation was received by Chairman NDMA, Lt Gen Inam Haider Malik, and briefed on NEOC's advanced capabilities for disaster monitoring, preparedness, and response.

Discussions focused on technology-driven solutions, including predictive AI models, real-time alerts, and resilient communication networks to enhance Pakistan's national preparedness against climate-related and natural disasters.

The NDMA–Jazz partnership has so far delivered over 300 million early warning alerts for heatwaves, rains, and floods, along with active relief support during major calamities. As part of its humanitarian contribution, Jazz handed over 80 tons of relief goods, comprising 2,500 aid packages containing food and medicines, for flood-affected communities.

The engagement reflects a shared commitment between NDMA and VEON–Jazz to harness digital innovation for protecting lives and livelihoods and to strengthen Pakistan's resilience in the face of evolving climate challenges.

NDMA Dispatched 23rd Relief Consignment for Palestine 22-09-2025



The National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) dispatched its 23rd relief consignment, comprising 100 tons of aid, for the people of Palestine in collaboration with the Al-Khidmat Foundation. The relief goods were dispatched from Allama Iqbal International Airport, Lahore, via a special flight.

The consignment included ration bags containing flour, rice, cooking oil, chickpeas, ready-to-eat meals, and canned fruit. To date, 23 consignments totaling 2,227 tons of humanitarian assistance have been sent.

Governor Punjab, Sardar Salim Haider Khan, attended the dispatch ceremony as chief guest, joined by NDMA officials, Al-Khidmat representatives, and government dignitaries. The Governor appreciated NDMA and partner organizations for their timely relief efforts and reaffirmed Pakistan's solidarity with the people of Palestine in this difficult time.

China Extended Monsoon Relief Assistance to Pakistan

The People's Republic of China demonstrated its steadfast friendship with Pakistan by extending Monsoon Relief Assistance through the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) for flood-affected communities in Punjab. 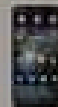

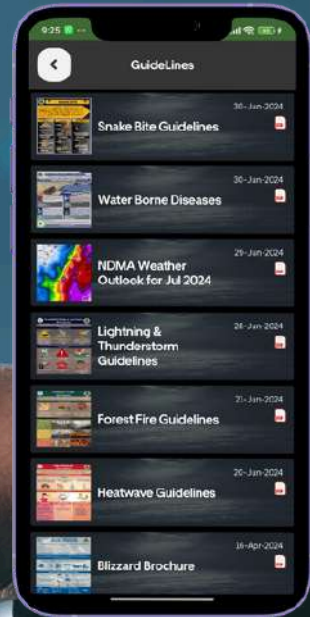
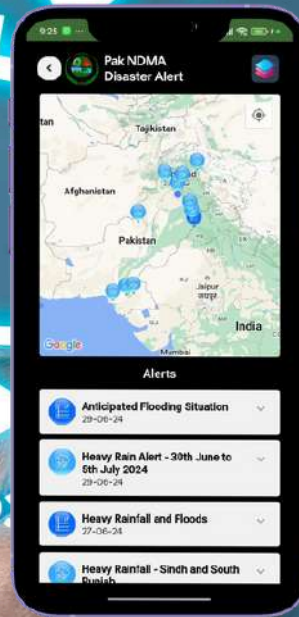
