### SUBJECT: -RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST:

### I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST:

River Sutlej at Ganda Singh Wala & Sulemanki is in High flood level . River Sutlej at Islam and River Indus at Guddu are in low flood level.

Sharp peaks of Medium to High level floods may occur during 24th to 25th August, 2023, in River Jhelum at Mangla(upstream).

Moderate to Heavy rainfall has been observed over the Upper catchment of River Sutlej during last 24hours. Flows in River Sutlej may rise again subject to releases from India.

### **II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES:**

- a. Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over Northern parts of Afghanistan today lies over Northeast Afghanistan and adjoining areas.
- b. Moderate to strong moist currents from Arabian Sea are penetrating to upper parts of the country up to 4000 feet.
- Well-marked seasonal low lies over Northeast Balochistan and its trough is extending Northeastwards.

### III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR NEXT 24-HOURS:

Scattered to widespread wind thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity with isolated heavy falls is expected over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers, Islamabad along with Peshawar, Kohat, Bannu, Rawalpindi & Gujranwala Divisions. Isolated wind thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity is expected over Sargodha & Lahore Divisions.

### IV: WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-HOURS:

Wet spell is likely to continue.
