Cumulative House Damaged





SUBJECT: RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

The River Indus is in low flood level at Tarbela, Kalabagh, Chashma, Taunsa, Guddu and Sukkur, while River Chenab at Khanki is also in low flood level. All other major rivers are flowing within their normal flows.

Low to Medium level flows are likely to continue in rivers Indus, Chenab and Jhelum during next 24-Hours.

Warning: Urban flooding is expected in Rawalpindi, Gujranwala and Lahore Divisions for next 24-hours. Flash Flooding is also expected in hill torrents of DG Khan Division along with tributaries of river Kabul during

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northern parts of the country persists.
- Moderate Monsoon currents from Arabian Sea penetrating to the upper parts of the country and are likely to weaken after 24hours.
- Seasonal low lies over North Balochistan.
- 4. A fresh monsoon low is likely to develop over northwest Bay of Bengal during next 48-Hours.
