
Forecasted Impact Next 24-48 Hours

- Balochistan. Mainly hot and humid weather is expected in most districts. Rain-wind / thundershowers with isolated heavy falls expected in Khuzdar, Kalat, Lasbela, Awaran, Panjgur, Kech, Ziarat, Zhob, Barkhan, Musakhel, Sherani, Kohlu, Harnai, Naseerabad and Jaffarabad from 29th to 31st July with occasional gaps.
- Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Rain-wind / thundershowers with isolated heavy falls expected in Dir, Swat, Kohistan, Malakand, Bajaur, Shangla, Battagram, Buner, Kohat, Mohmand, Khyber, Mansehra, Abbottabad, Galiyat, Haripur, Peshawar, Swabi, Nowshera, Mardan, Charsadda, Hangu, Kurram, Orakzai, Waziristan, Bannu, Lakki Marwat and DI Khan from 28th to 31st July with occasional gaps.
- Punjab. Rain-wind / thundershowers with few heavy falls expected in Rawalpindi, Murree, Attock, Chakwal, Tala Gang, Jhelum, Mandi Bahauddin, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Hafizabad, Wazirabad, Sahiwal, Jhang, Toba Tek Singh, Nankana Sahib, Chiniot, Faisalabad, Lahore, Sheikhupura, Sialkot, Narowal, Okara, Pakpattan, Kasur, Khushab, Sargodha, Bhakkar and Mianwali from 28th to 31st July with occasional gaps. Furthermore, rain-wind / thundershowers expected in Bahawalpur, Bahawalnagar, DG Khan, Multan, Khanewal, Lodhran, Muzaffargarh, Kot Addu, Rajanpur, Rahim Yar Khan and Layyah from 29th July to 31st July with occasional gaps.
- Sindh. Mainly hot and very humid weather is expected in most districts. Rain-wind / thundershowers expected in Mithi, Sanghar, Umarkot, Tharparkar, Mirpurkhas, Thatta, Badin, Sujawal, Karachi, Hyderabad, Shaheed Benazirabad, Sukkur, Larkana, Jacobabad and Dadu from 29th to 30th July with occasional gaps.
- Islamabad Capital Territory. Rain-wind / thundershowers with few heavy falls expected from 28th to 31st July with occasional gaps.
- **Gilgit Baltistan**. **Mainly partly cloudy** to **cloudy weather** conditions. However, **rainfall** is expected in Diamer, Astore, Skardu, Gilgit, Ghanche, Shigar from **28**th **to 29**th **July** with **occasional gaps**.
- AJ&K. Rain-wind / thundershowers with few heavy falls expected in Neelum Valley, Muzaffarabad, Rawalakot, Poonch, Hattian, Bagh, Haveli, Sudhnoti, Kotli, Bhimber, Mirpur from 27th (night) to 31st July with occasional gaps.
- From 30th July to 4th August, Medium to High Level Flood flows expected Upstream Mangla Dam in River Jhelum with Sharp Peak of Very High Flood level flows.
- River Kabul and is tributaries, River Chenab at Marala, Khanki, Qadirabad along with Nullahs may also experience increased flows up to Medium Flood level
- Flash flooding and landsliding in hilly / mountainous regions of Balochistan, KP, GB and AJ&K
- Heavy rains may generate flash flooding in local streams / nullahs.
- Hill Torrents of Balochistan and Punjab may remain active.
- Heavy rains may cause urban flooding in Islamabad, Rawalpindi, Peshawar, Lahore, Gujranwala, Sialkot, Sargodha, Faisalabad, and other urban areas.
- Rains-windstorms / lightning may cause roof/wall collapse of kacha houses, electric poles, billboards and solar panels.
- Higher Temperatures & Rains may trigger GLOF Incidents in vulnerable valleys of KP and GB

Guidance Issued

- PDMAs to ensure early warning & prompt response in vulnerable areas in light of forecasted conditions.
- PDMA Punjab to ensure all necessary precautionary measures downstream Mangla Dam on River Jhelum in-light of forecasted flood flows.
- PDMAs to undertake regular public awareness on all media channels / social media to maximise general public's knowledge on risks
 associated with monsoon season; heavy rains, urban flooding, flash flooding, landslides, etc.
- City / District Administrations are to ensure contingency plans for areas vulnerable to flooding in urban centres, catering for prompt de-watering operations in flooded areas.
- NHA / FWO / Local C&W Depts to ensure pre-placement of machinery and timely restoration of damaged road linkages.
- Rescue Services, Armed Forces and leading NGOs / CSOs to ensure availability of personnel / equipment in the indicated areas & be on stand-by for rapid response.
- Ensure that public avoid crossing nullahs and keep livestock away during adverse weather conditions.
- Ensure that public Does Not Venture Outside during Thunderstorms and Do Not Seek Shelter Under Trees to avoid risk of lightning strike.
- Ensure that public undertakes adequate measures to maintain their homes from adverse effects of heavy rainfall
 in order to avoid roof / wall collapses.
