
Forecasted Impact Next 24-48 Hours

- **Balochistan**. **Mainly hot** and **very humid weather** is expected in most districts. **Rain-wind / thundershowers** likely at **isolated places** in Zhob, Musakhel, Barkhan, Kohlu, Loralai, Sibbi and Khuzdar.
- Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Mainly hot and very humid weather is expected in most districts. Rain-wind / thundershowers expected at isolated places in Dir, Chitral, Swat, Kohistan, Abbottabad, Buner, Malakand, Bajaur, Khyber, Kurram, Bannu, Dera Ismail Khan and Waziristan.
- Punjab. Mainly hot and very humid weather is expected in most districts. Rain-wind / thundershowers expected at isolated places in Murree, Rawalpindi, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Sialkot, Narowal, Mandi Bahauddin, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Hafizabad, Lahore, Kasur, Okara, Sheikhupura, Sahiwal, Sargodha, Khushab, Faisalabad, Jhang, Toba Tek Singh, Nurpur Thal, Bhakkar, Layyah, Dera Ghazi Khan and Bahawalnagar.
- Sindh. Mainly hot and very humid weather is expected in most districts. Rain-wind / thundershowers expected at isolated places in Tharparkar, Sanghar, Mirpurkhas, Umerkot, Larkana, Dadu and Jamshoro.
- Islamabad Capital Territory. Hot and very humid weather and rain may occur during night hours.
- Gilgit Baltistan. Mainly partly cloudy to cloudy weather conditions expected. However, rainfall also expected in Diamer, Astore,
 Skardu, Gilgit, Ghanche, Shigar from up to 27th July with occasional gaps.
- AJ&K. Rain-wind / thundershowers with few heavy falls expected in Neelum Valley, Muzaffarabad, Rawalakot, Poonch, Hattian, Bagh, Haveli, Sudhnoti, Kotli, Bhimber, Mirpur up to 27th July with occasional gaps.
- Flash flooding and land sliding in hilly / mountainous regions of Balochistan, KP, GB and AJ&K
- Rains-windstorms / lightning may cause roof/wall collapse of kacha houses, electric poles, billboards and solar panels.
- Higher Temperatures & Rains may trigger GLOF Incidents in vulnerable valleys of KP and GB

Guidance Issued

- PDMAs to ensure early warning & prompt response in vulnerable areas in light of forecasted conditions
- PDMAs to undertake regular public awareness on all media channels / social media to maximise general public's knowledge on risks associated with monsoon season; heavy rains, urban flooding, flash flooding, landslides, etc.
- City / District Administrations are to ensure contingency plans for areas vulnerable to flooding in urban centres, catering for prompt de-watering operations in flooded areas.
- NHA / FWO / Local C&W Depts to ensure pre-placement of machinery and timely restoration of damaged road linkages.
- Rescue Services, Armed Forces and leading NGOs / CSOs to ensure availability of personnel / equipment in the indicated areas & be on stand-by for rapid response.
- Ensure that public avoid crossing nullahs and keep livestock away during adverse weather conditions.
- Ensure that **public** Does Not Venture Outside during Thunderstorms and Do Not Seek Shelter Under Trees to avoid risk of lightning strike.
- Ensure that public undertakes adequate measures to maintain their homes from adverse effects of heavy rainfall
 in order to avoid roof / wall collapses.
