Subject: Tropical Cyclone "TAUKTAE" in the Southeast Arabian Sea

Fresh Pakistan Meteorological Department (PMD) Tropical Cyclone (TC) Alert No. 8 dated 17 May 2021 is attached as "Annex-A". It is informed that, The Very Severe Cyclonic Storm "TAUKTAE" has gained more strength and moved North/northwestward at a speed of 18 Kmph during last 12 hours and now lay centered near latitude 18.9N and longitude 71.5E. at a distance of about 730 km south of Thatta & 800 km south-southeast of Karachi at 0800 PST of 17 May 2021. Maximum sustained winds around the system centre are 190-210 Kmph gusting 230 Kmph. The system is likely to move further northward and cross Indian Gujarat by 17 May night /18 May morning. None of the Pakistan coastal area is under threat however under the influence of this system:-

- a. Dust/thuderstorm-rain with few moderate to heavy falls and gusty winds of 40-60 Kmph are likely to occur in Tharparker, Umerkot & Sanghar districts and at isolated places of Badin district during 17- 19 May 2021.
- Very hot & dry weather with occasional gusty winds likely to continue in Karachi,
 Hyderabad, Shaeed- Banzirabad, Badin & Thatta districts till 18th May 2021.
- Sea Conditions will remain rough to very rough and fishermen of Sindh are advised to suspend their activities till 19 May 2021.
- All concerned are requested to remain Alert and ensure following precautionary measures to avoid any loss of life or property: -
 - Joint Maritime Information Control Centre (JMICC) to closely monitor the situation and apprise all concerned accordingly.
 - PDMAs to coordinate with concerned departments for restoration of basic services and ensure following:-
 - Advise Fishermen community to avoid going into deep sea till 20th May 2021.
 - (2) Travelers be apprised about weather forecast.

- Relevant departments may issue necessary instructions to stakeholders in the light of weather forecast.
- d. In case of any eventuality, twice daily updates should be shared with NDMA.
