Punjab & ICT:

The province is expected to remain mainly dry and warm, with isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm activity possible in upper Punjab including Islamabad/Rawalpindi, Attock, Jhelum, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Sialkot, Narowal and surrounding areas, particularly from 25–27 September. Daytime temperatures are expected to remain relatively warm.

Balochistan:

The province is expected to remain mainly hot and dry, with generally clear to partly cloudy conditions.

Sindh:

The province is expected to remain mainly hot and dry. Daytime temperatures are likely to remain high, particularly over central and southern Sindh.

KP:

The province is expected to experience isolated to scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm activity, particularly over upper KP including Kohistan, Swat, Shangla, Mansehra, Batagram, Dir, Chitral and adjoining areas, with activity becoming more likely following the arrival of the westerly system from around 25 September. Temperatures are expected to remain relatively warm in the southern districts.

GB & AJK:

The region is expected to experience isolated to scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm activity, particularly over upper catchments and mountainous areas, including Gilgit, Hunza, Ghizer, Diamer, Astore, Skardu, Shigar, Neelum, Muzaffarabad, Bagh and adjoining areas.
