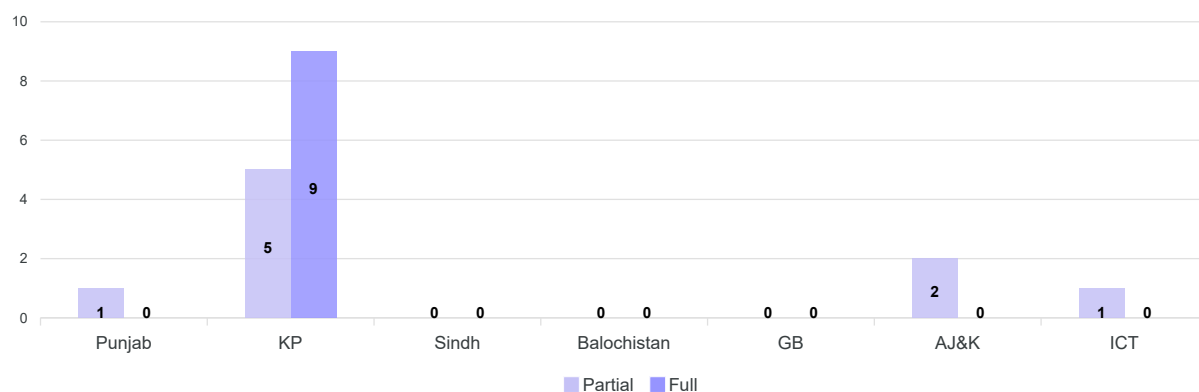

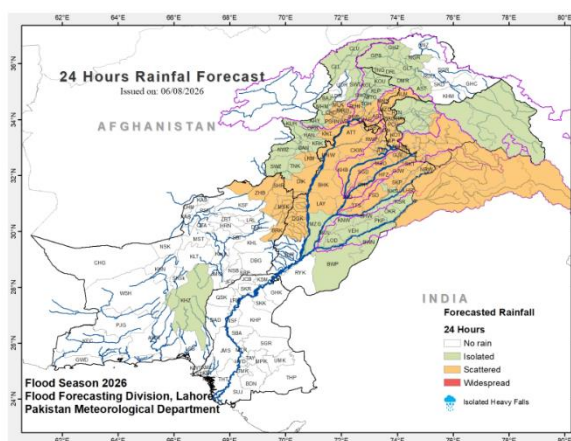

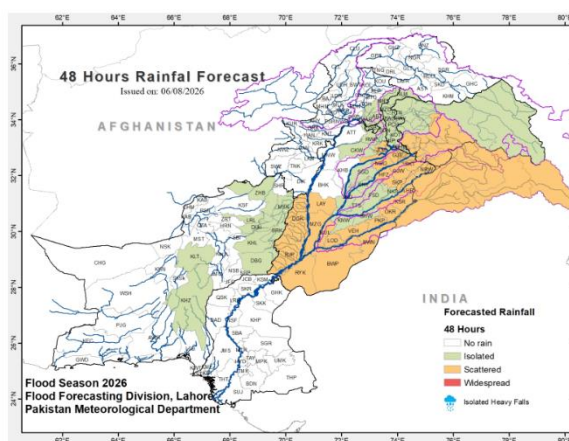

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's westerly wave over northeast Afghanistan has moved eastwards and its trough is lying over northern parts of the country.
- The upper-air cyclonic circulation associated with low-pressure system over central parts of Uttar Pradesh (India) persists.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northeast Balochistan.
- Weak moist currents from Arabian sea and Bay of Bengal are penetrating into central and upper parts of the country up to 3,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- Scattered thunderstorm/rain is expected over upper catchments of eastern rivers, Islamabad, upper Punjab, Kashmir, and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa during next 24-hours.



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III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- **River Indus** at Kalabagh and Chashma is in **Low flood level** at downstream.
- All other major rivers are flowing in their normal flows at other gauging stations.

IV. HYDROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- No significant change.

V. WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over **upper catchments of Sutlej, Ravi and Chenab rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir,**

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Abbottabad, Buner, Charsadda, DI Khan, Haripur, Kohat, Lakki Marwat, Malakand, Mansehra, Mardan, Nowshera, Peshawar and Swabi.

WEEKLY SIGNIFICANT OUTLOOK

(07th August, 2026 to 13th August, 2026)

I. RAINFALL OUTLOOK

- Current meteorological conditions and analysis indicate that a fresh wet spell is likely to commence from 8th August. Under the influence of upcoming weather system moderate rainfalls at scattered places are expected over Punjab, northeast Sindh and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.
- A westerly weather system is likely to affect upper parts of the country from 10th August, consequently moderate to heavy rainfalls are expected in the upper catchments of all major rivers, along with Islamabad, Kashmir, Gilgit Baltistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and upper Punjab.

II. FLOOD OUTLOOK

- Flows are likely to increase moderately in all the major rivers and associated tributaries 10th August.
