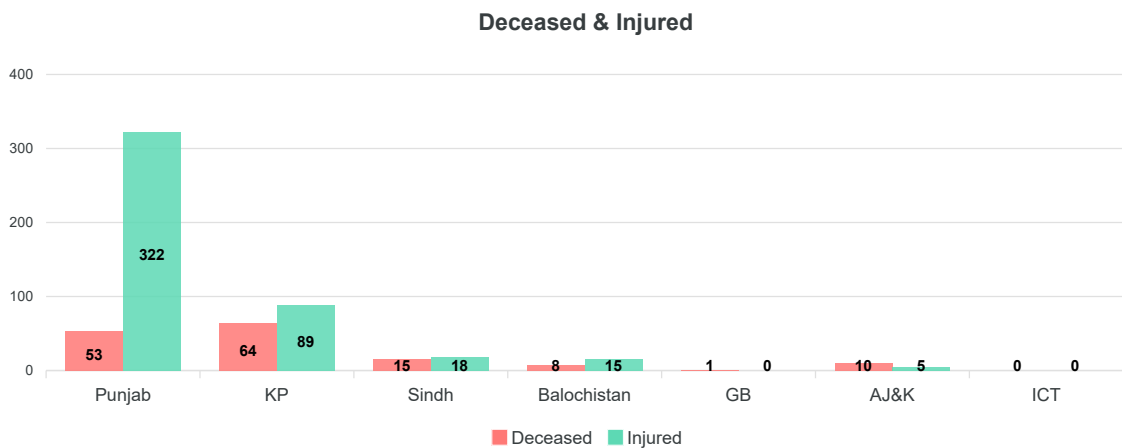

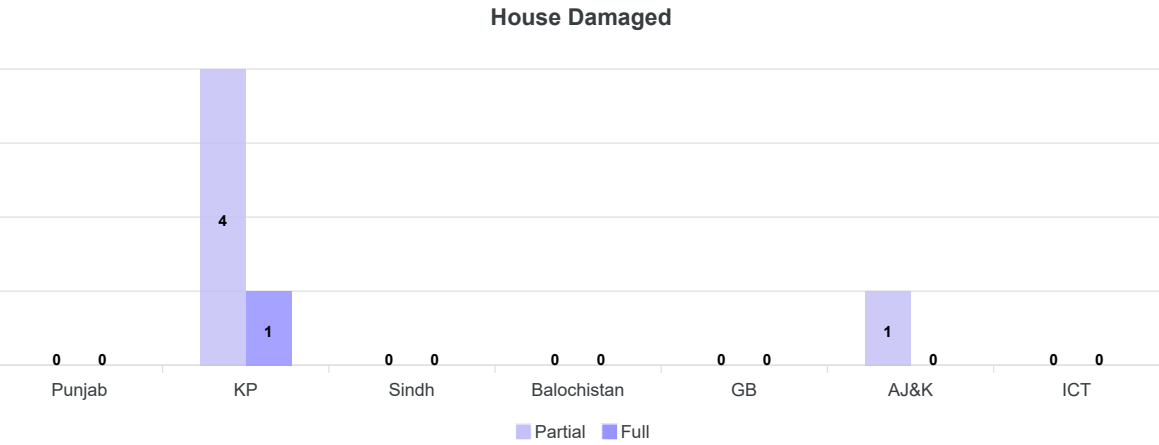

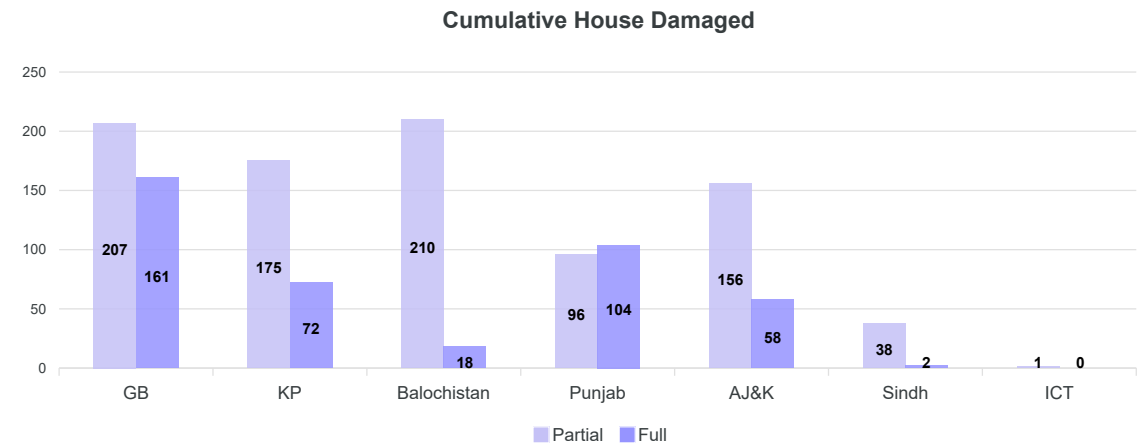

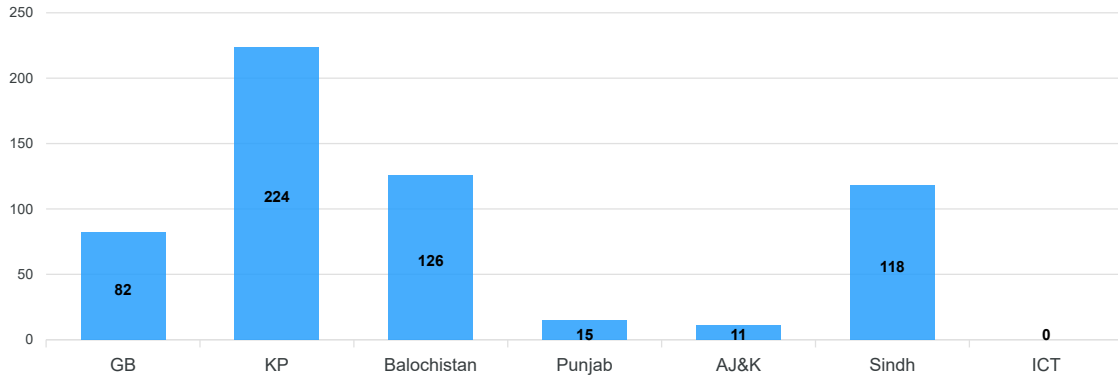

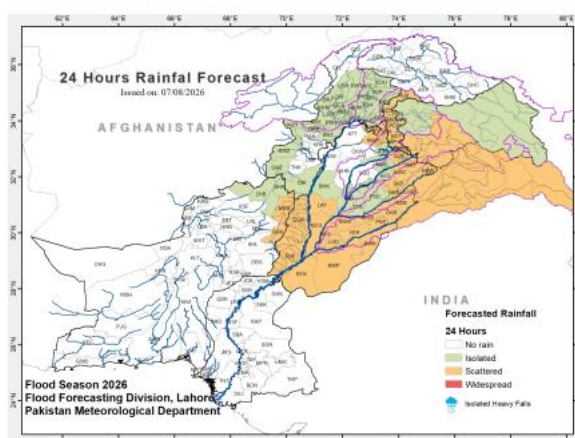

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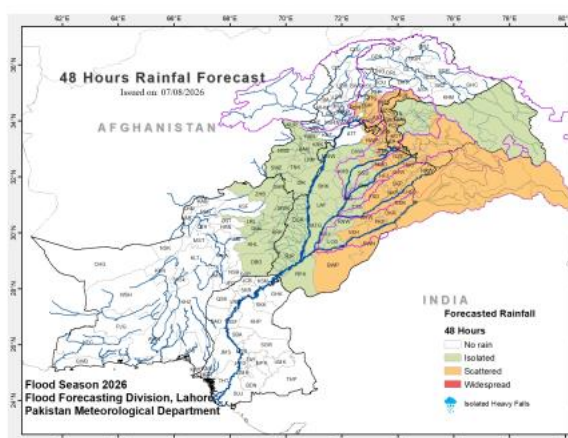

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Weak trough of westerly wave lies over northern parts of the country.
- The low-pressure system over central parts of Uttar Pradesh (India) persists with central pressure of 997 hPa.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northeast Balochistan.
- Weak moist currents from Arabian sea and Bay of Bengal are penetrating into central and upper parts of the country up to 3,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm is expected over upper catchments of eastern rivers including Islamabad, Kashmir, northeast & south Punjab during next 24-hours.

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- River Indus at Kalabagh and Chashma is in **Low flood level** at downstream.
- All other major rivers are flowing in their normal flows at other gauging stations.
