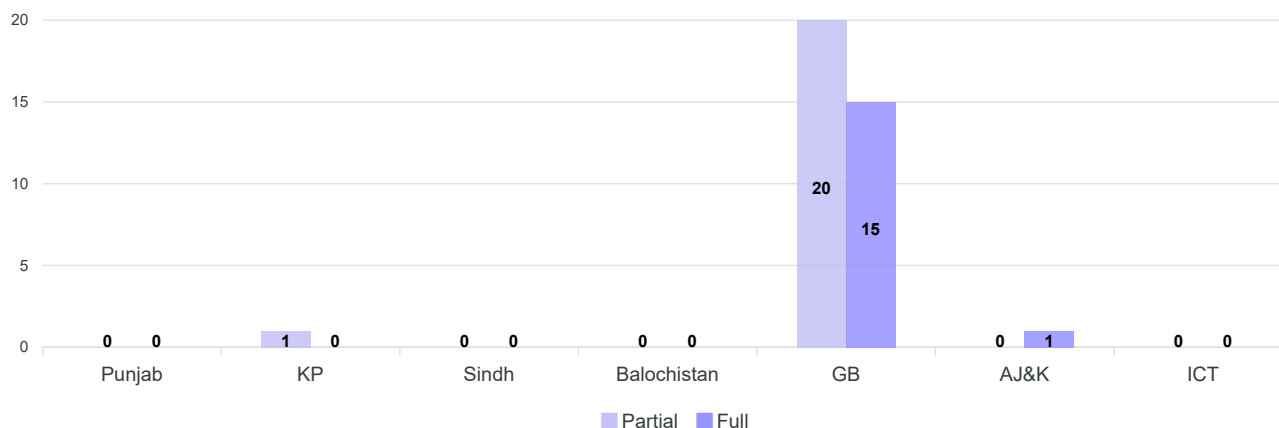

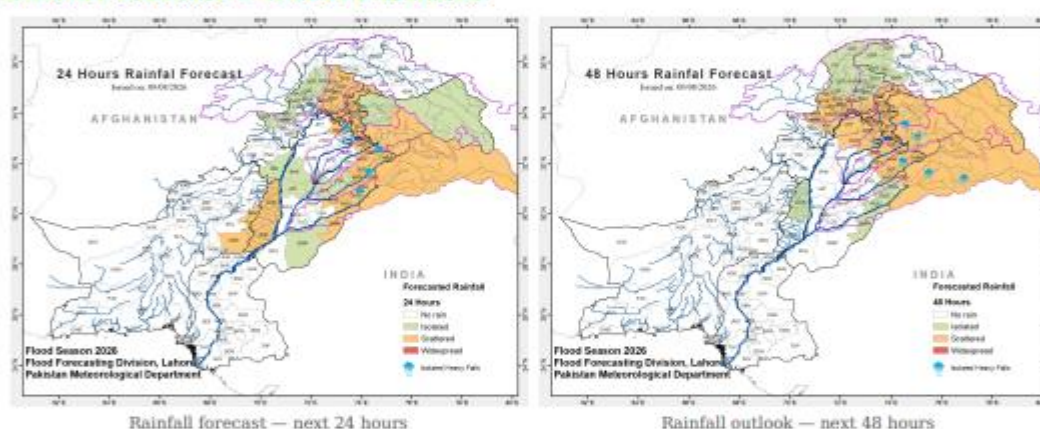

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northeast Iran, today lies over northwest Afghanistan.
- The monsoon trough extends from northwest Rajasthan and adjoining areas of Pakistan towards West Bengal (India) along side the foothills of Himalayan mountains.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northeast Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Bay of Bengal are penetrating into the upper parts of the country up to 7,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated heavy falls** is expected over the **upper catchments of eastern rivers including Islamabad, Kashmir and Punjab during next 24-hours.**

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- **River Indus** at Kalabagh, Chashma, Taunsa and Guddu is in **Low flood level** at downstream.
- All other major rivers are flowing in their normal flows at other gauging stations.

IV. HYDROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Flows are expected to increase** in the **hill torrents of DG Khan & northern Balochistan**.
- **Urban Flooding** is also expected in **Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, Sialkot, Narowal, Faisalabad, Okara and Lahore**.

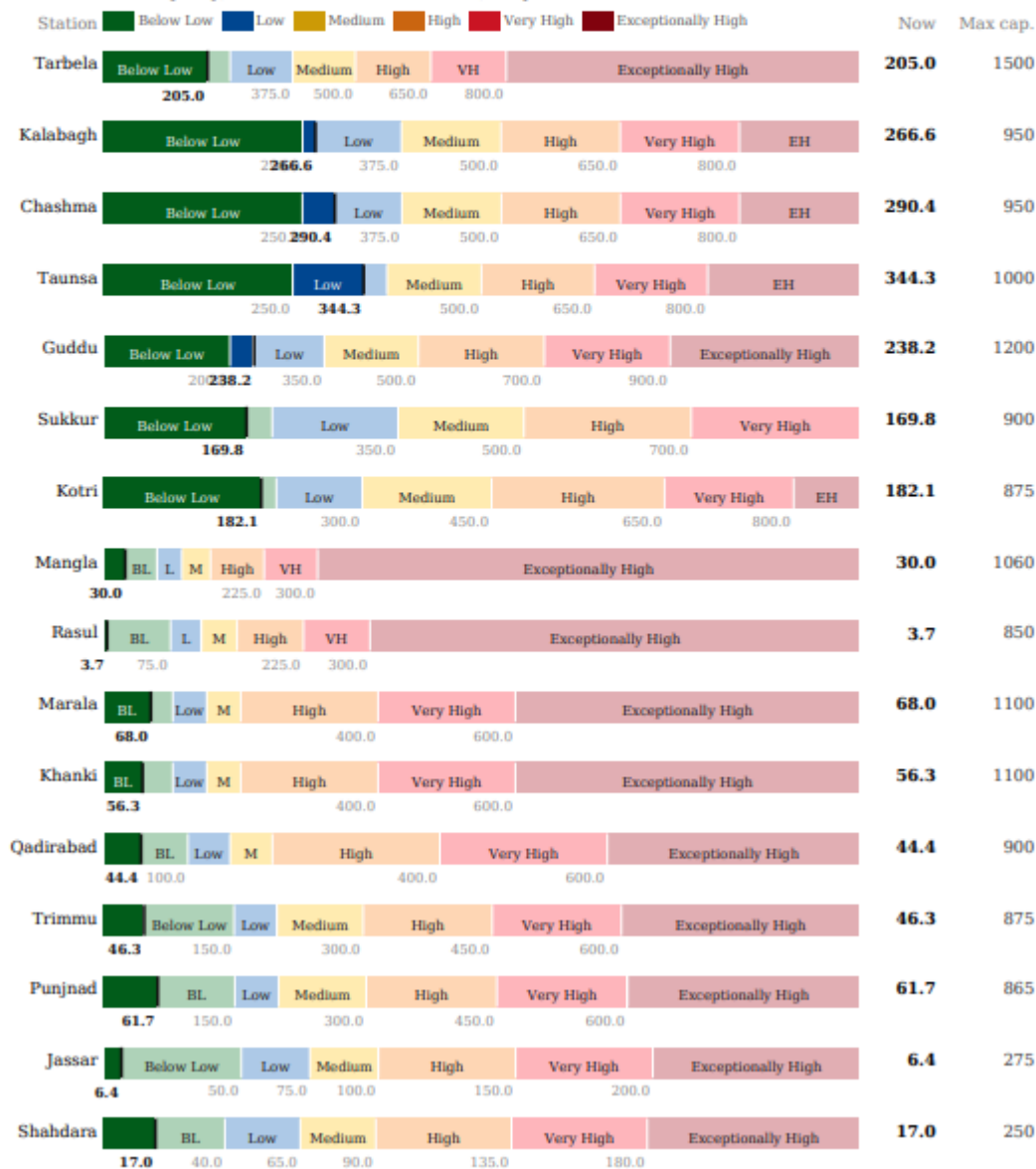
