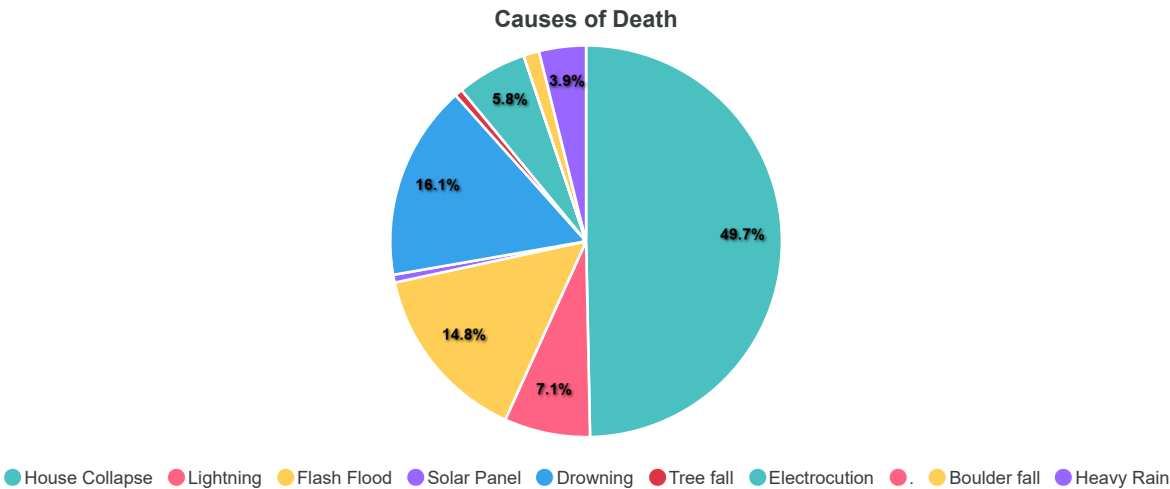

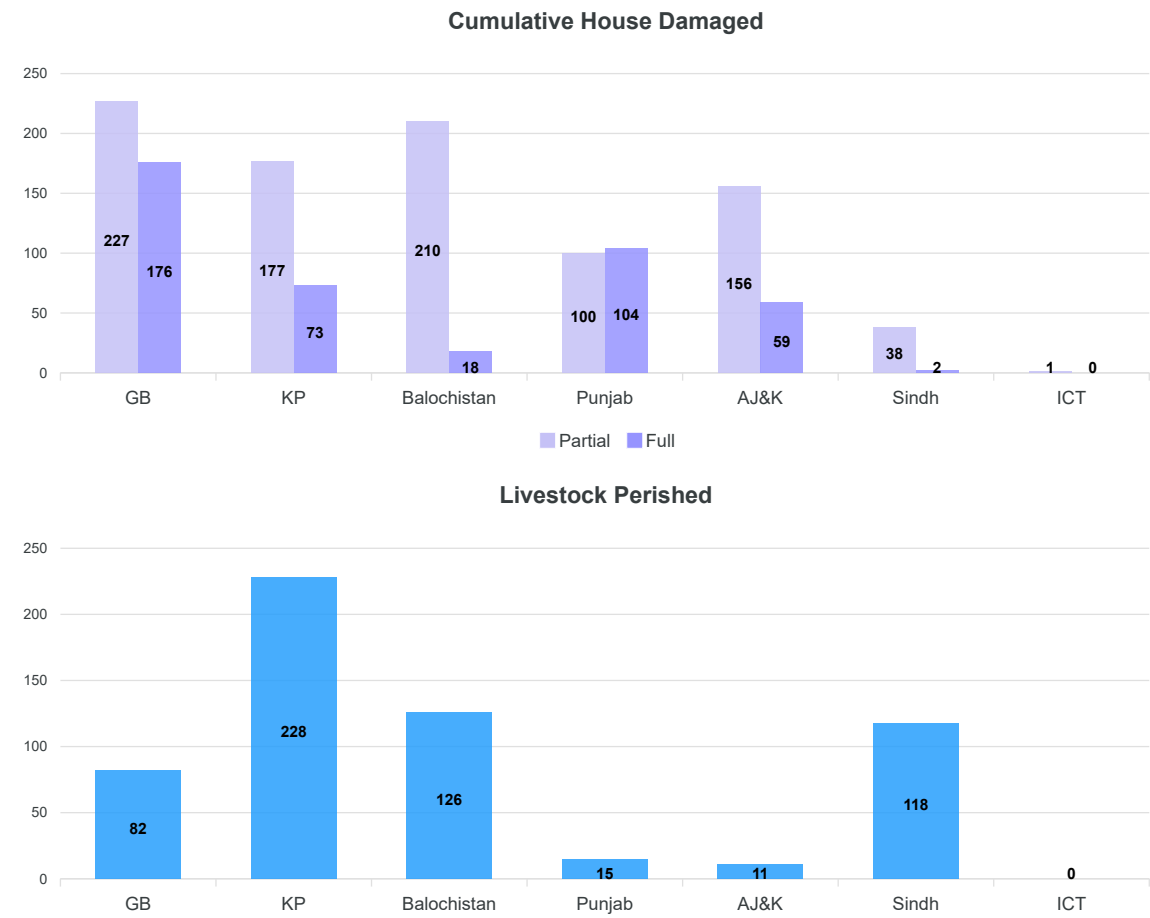

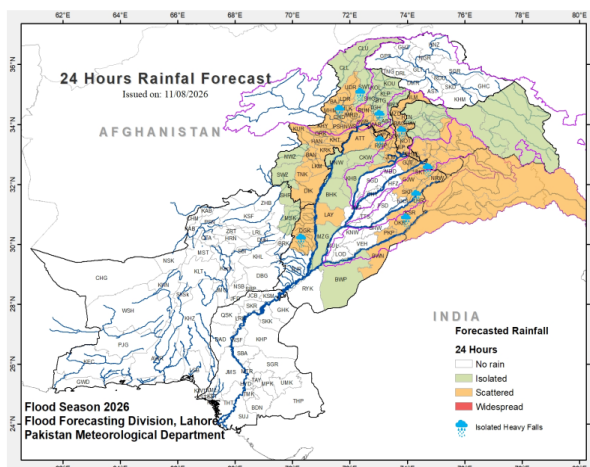

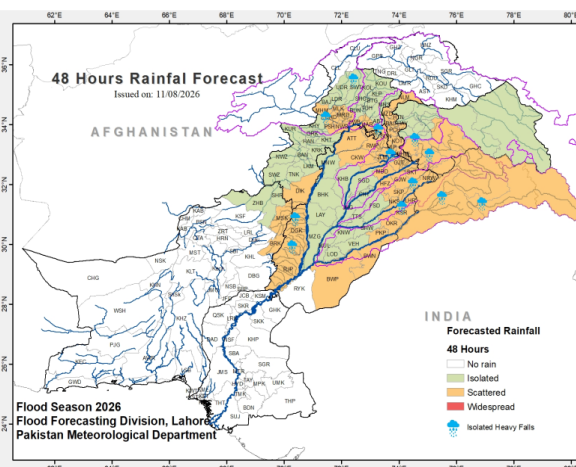

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northeast Afghanistan and adjoining Pakistan persists.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over north Madhya Pradesh (India) today lies over northwest Madhya Pradesh (India) with central pressure 999 hPa.
- A fresh low pressure system has developed over south West Bengal (India) with central pressure 999 hPa.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over north Balochistan.
- Weak moist currents from Arabian sea and Bay of Bengal are penetrating into the upper parts of the country up to 3,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy falls** is expected over the **upper catchments of eastern rivers including Islamabad, Kashmir and upper Punjab** during next 24-hours.



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III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- **Tarbela reservoir** is currently at its **Maximum Conservation Level** and is at **full capacity**, while **Mangla reservoir** is **66%** filled.
- **River Indus** at Kalabagh and Guddu is in **Low flood level** at downstream.

IV. HYDROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- Flows in all major rivers are expected to remain in the normal flow limits. However **river Ravi** and **Chenab** may attain Low Flood Level. Moreover, the nullahs of **river Ravi and Chenab** can also attain **low to medium flood level** during next 24 hours.

V. WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy falls** is expected **over the upper catchments of Sutlej, Ravi, Chenab and Jhelum rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir,**

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Abbottabad, Bajaur, Buner, Charsadda, Chitral, Dir, DI Khan, Hangu, Haripur, Karak, Khyber, Kohat, Kurram, Malakand, Mardan, Mohmand, Nowshera, Peshawar, Swabi and Swat.

Punjab: Attock, Bahawalnagar, Chakwal, DG Khan, Gujranwala, Gujrat, Jhelum, Kasur, Lahore, Mianwali, Narowal, Okara, Pakpattan, Rawalpindi, Sheikhupura and Sialkot.

- **Isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the **upper catchments of river Indus,**

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Batagram, Kohistan, Mansehra, Orakzai, Shangla and Tor Ghar.

Punjab: Bhakkar, Chiniot, Faisalabad, Hafizabad, Jhang, Khanewal, Khushab, Layyah, Mandi Bahauddin, Multan, Muzaffargarh, Nankana Sahib, Rajanpur, Sahiwal, Sargodha, Toba Tek Singh and Vehari.

Gilgit-Baltistan: Darel, Diamir, Ghizer, Gilgit, Gupis and Tangir.

VI. WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-HOURS

- **Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy falls** is expected over the **upper catchments of all the major rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir, Gilgit-Baltistan,**

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Abbottabad, Bajaur, Batagram, Buner, Charsadda, Chitral, Dir, Haripur, Kohistan, Malakand, Mansehra, Mardan, Mohmand, Peshawar, Shangla, Swabi, Swat and Tor Ghar.

Punjab: Attock, Gujranwala, Gujrat, Jhelum, Lahore, Narowal, Rawalpindi, Sheikhupura and Sialkot.

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over

I. RAINFALL OUTLOOK

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy falls** are expected over the upper catchments of **all the major rivers**, including Islamabad, Kashmir, Gilgit-Baltistan, upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, and upper Punjab for the period mentioned above with occasional gaps.

II. FLOOD OUTLOOK

- Flows in all major rivers are expected to remain in the normal flow limits, however **river Ravi** and **Chenab** may occasionally attain **Low Flood Level** during the period, moreover the nullahs of **river Ravi and Chenab** are expected to attain **Low to Medium Flood Level** and may attain **High Flood Level** occasionally during the period.



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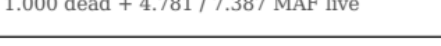
