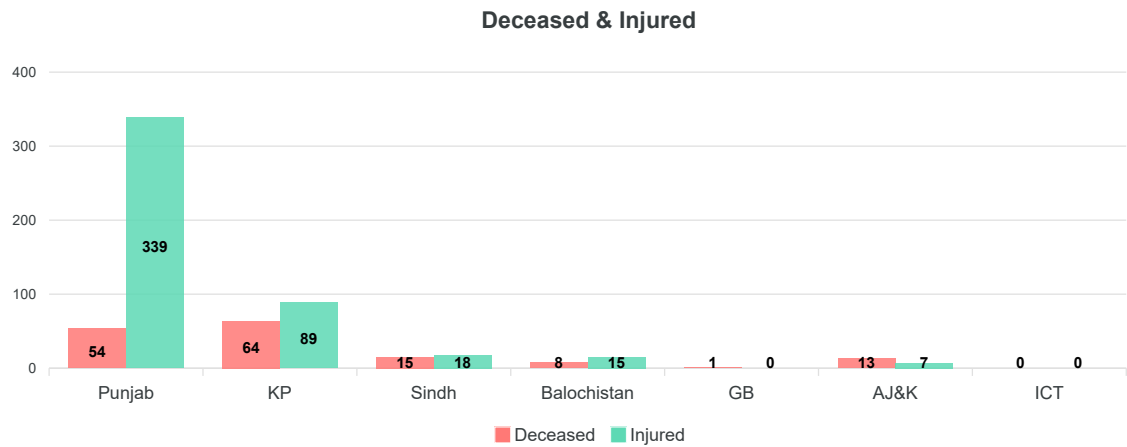

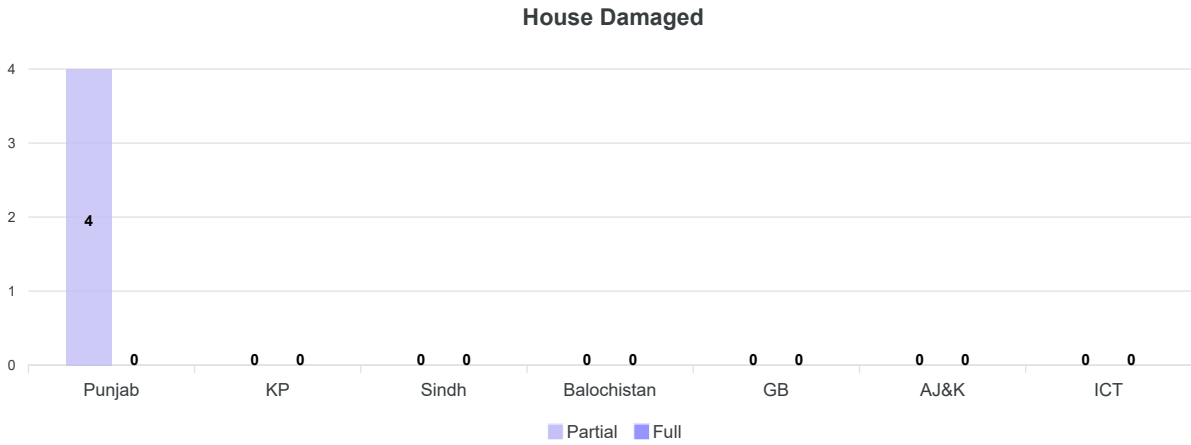

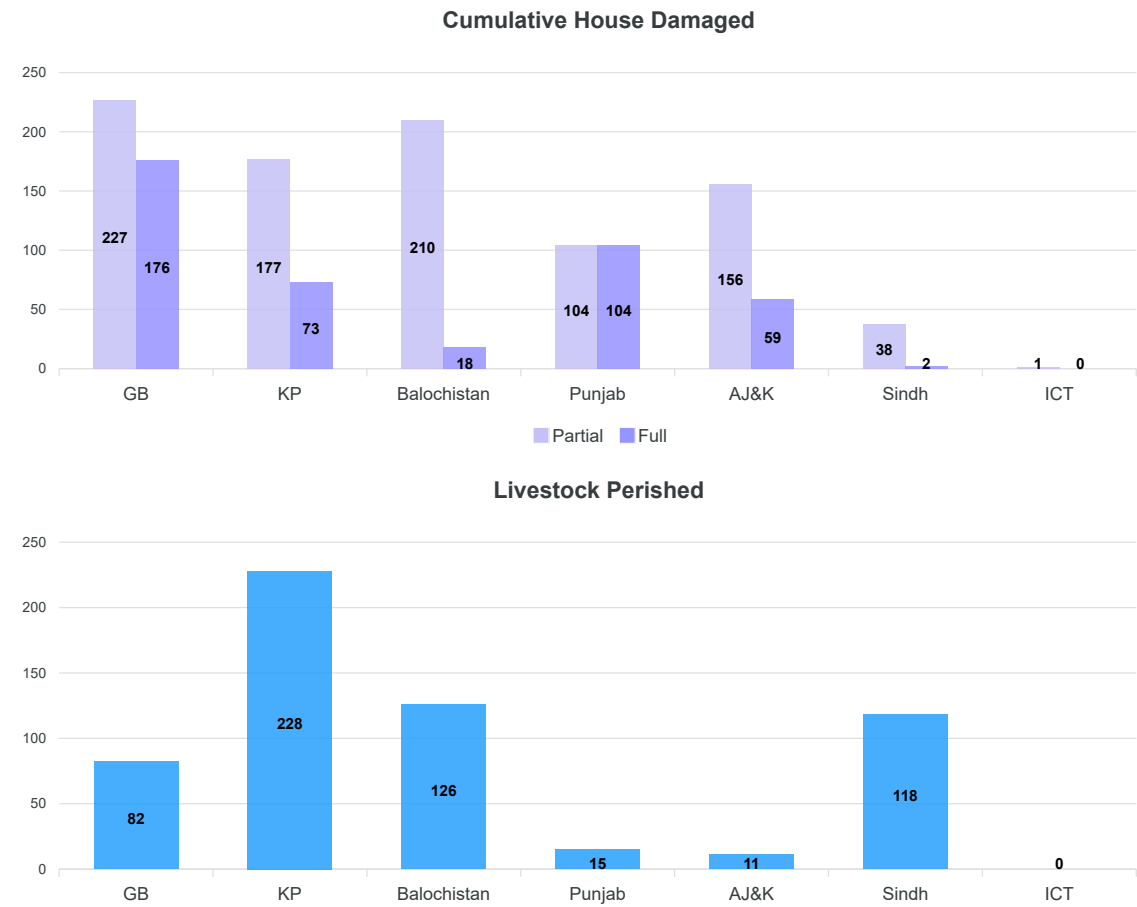

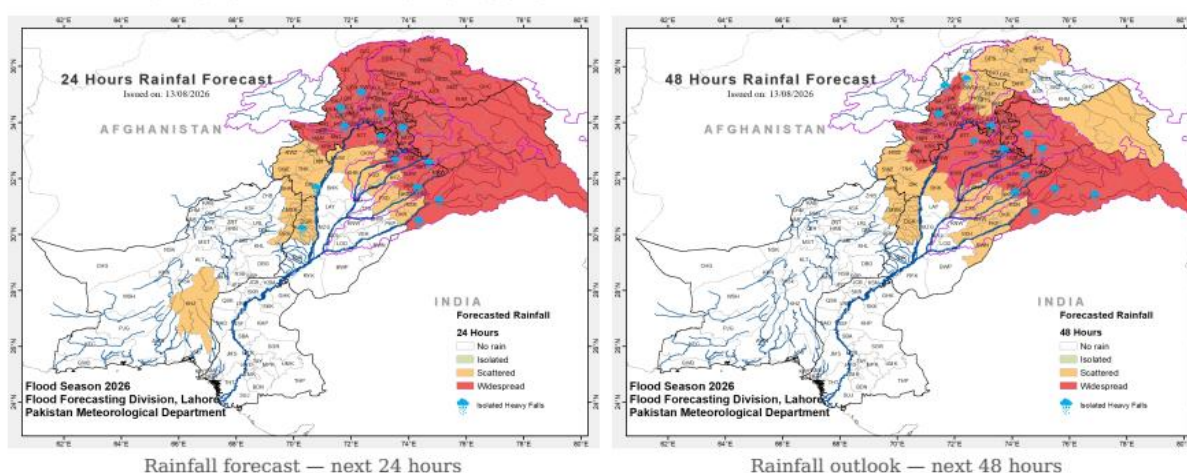

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northeast Afghanistan and adjoining Pakistan still persists.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over northwest Madhya Pradesh (India) has become insignificant.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over south of West Bengal (India) has slightly moved westwards and still persists over south of West Bengal (India).
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over north Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Arabian sea and Bay of Bengal (along the foothills of Himalaya) are penetrating into the upper parts of the country up to 3,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy falls** is expected over the **upper catchments of all the major rivers, including Islamabad, Gilgit Baltistan, Kashmir, upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and upper Punjab** during next 24-hours.

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- **Tarbela reservoir** is currently at its **Maximum Conservation Level** and is at **full capacity**, while **Mangla reservoir** is **66%** filled.
- **River Indus** at Tarbela, Kalabagh, Chashma and Guddu is in **Low flood level** at downstream.

IV. HYDROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Ravi and Chenab rivers** are likely to attain **Low Flood Level** during the next 48 hours. Moreover, their associated nullahs may attain **Low to Medium Flood Level** during the same period,

WEEKLY SIGNIFICANT OUTLOOK

(14th August, 2026 to 20th August, 2026)

I. RAINFALL OUTLOOK

- **Scattered to Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy falls** are expected over the upper catchments of **all the major rivers**, including Islamabad, Kashmir, Gilgit-Baltistan, upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, and upper Punjab for the period mentioned above with occasional gaps.
- Wet spell is likely to intensify from 17th August

II. FLOOD OUTLOOK

- Flows in all major rivers are expected to increase along with their associated tributaries. However **river Ravi, Chenab** may occasionally attain **Low Flood Level** during the period. The nullahs of **river Ravi and Chenab** are expected to attain **Low to Medium Flood Level** and may attain **High Flood Level** occasionally during the period.
- Flash flooding is also expected in the hill torrents of DG Khan during next 48 hours and the tributaries of **river Kabul from 17th August to 19th August.**
