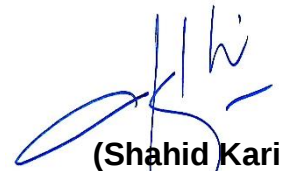

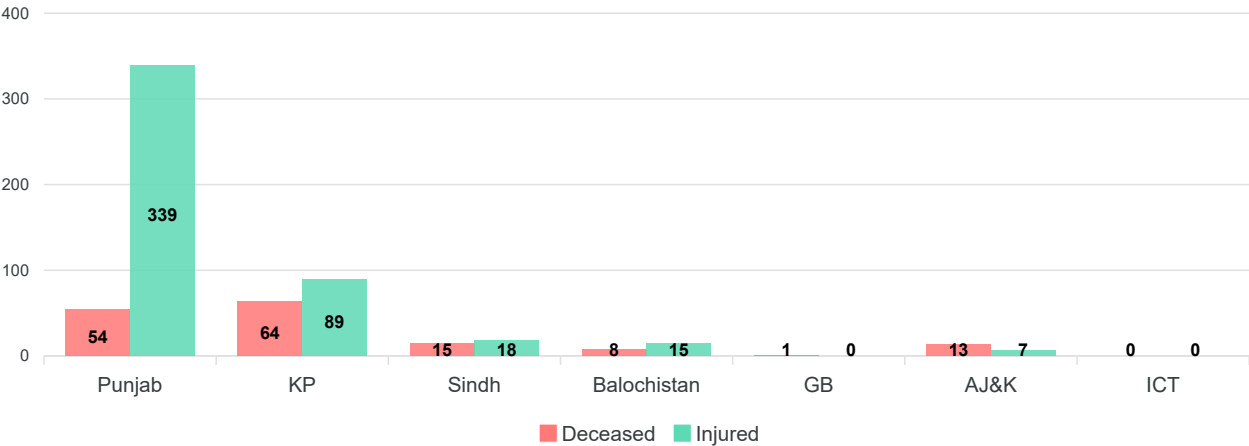

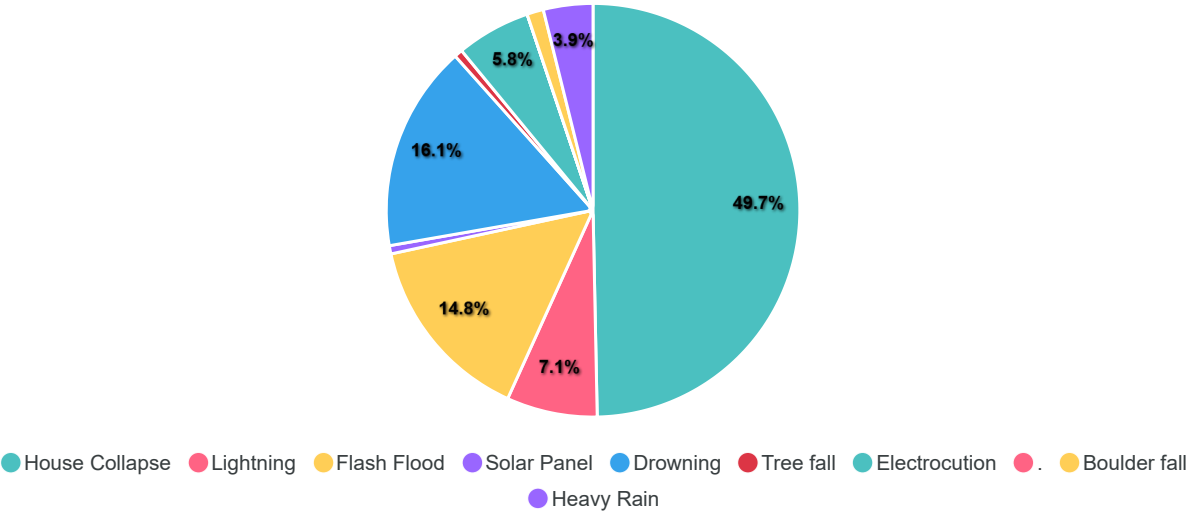

Causes of Death

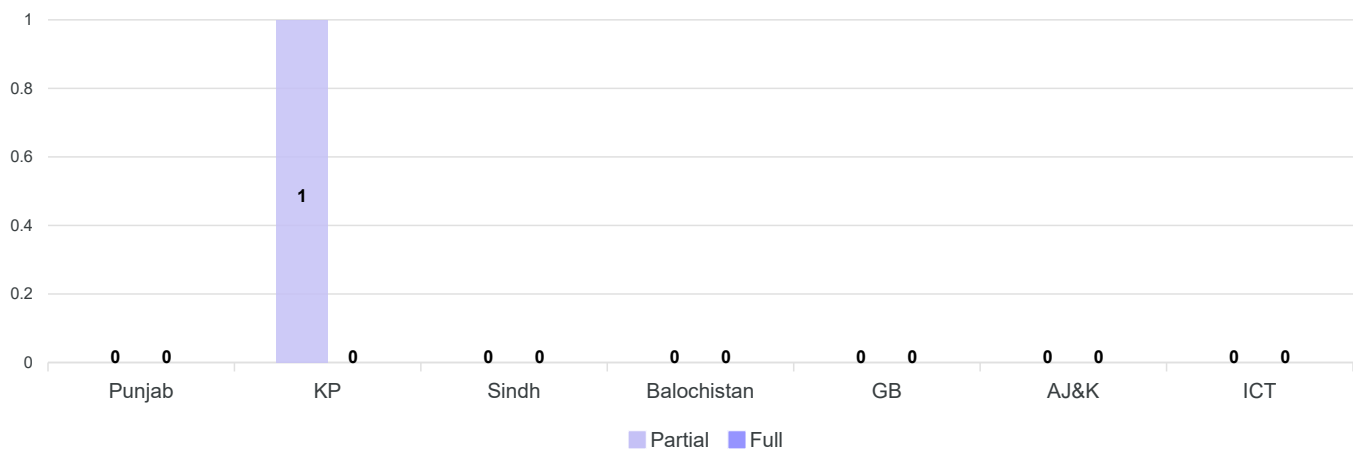

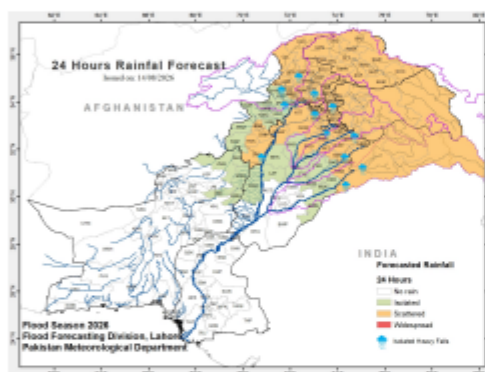

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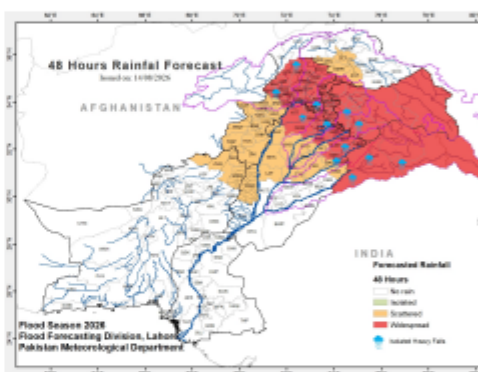

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northeast Afghanistan, today lies over northern parts of Pakistan.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over south of West Bengal (India), today lies over northeast Orissa (India) with central pressure 998 hPa .
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over north Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Arabian sea and Bay of Bengal (along the foothills of Himalaya) are penetrating into the upper parts of the country up to 3,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy falls** is expected over the upper catchments of all the major rivers, including Islamabad, Gilgit Baltistan, Kashmir, upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and upper Punjab during next 24-hours.

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- **Tarbela reservoir** is currently at its **Maximum Conservation Level** and is at **full capacity**, while **Mangla reservoir** is **67%** filled.
- **River Indus** at Tarbela, Kalabagh, Chashma and Guddu is in **Low flood level** at downstream.

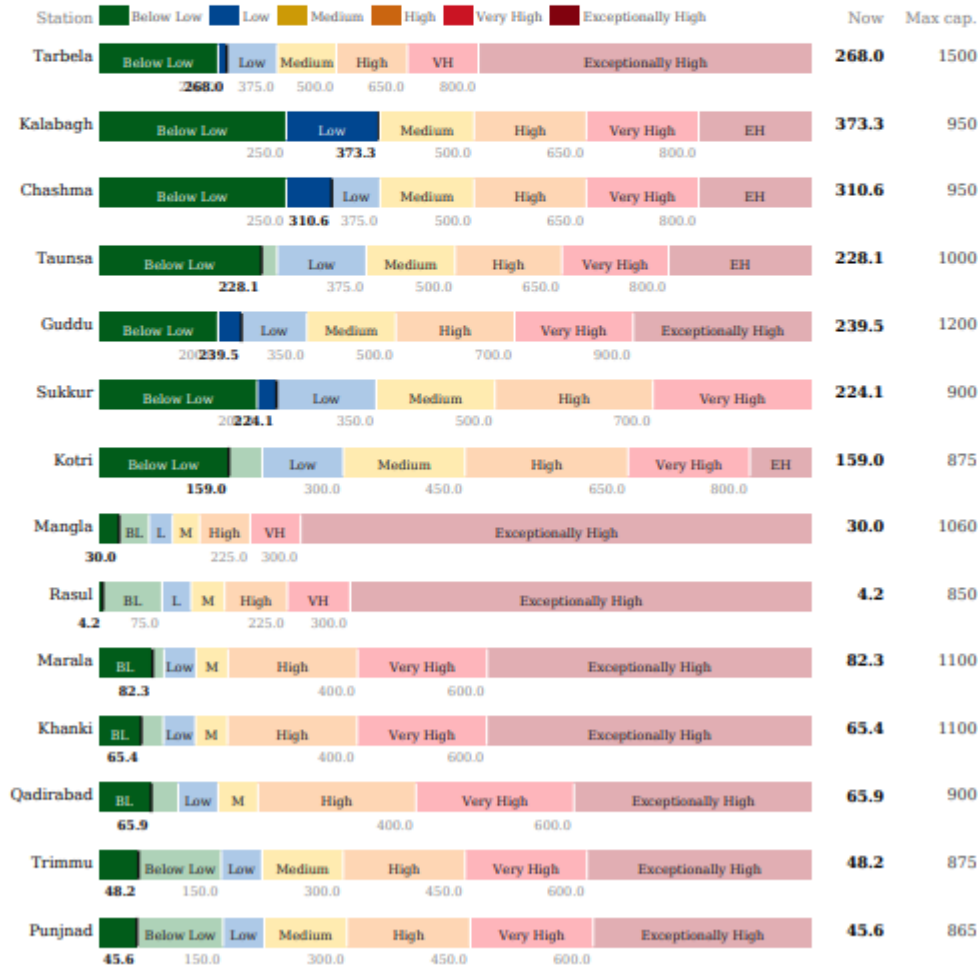
