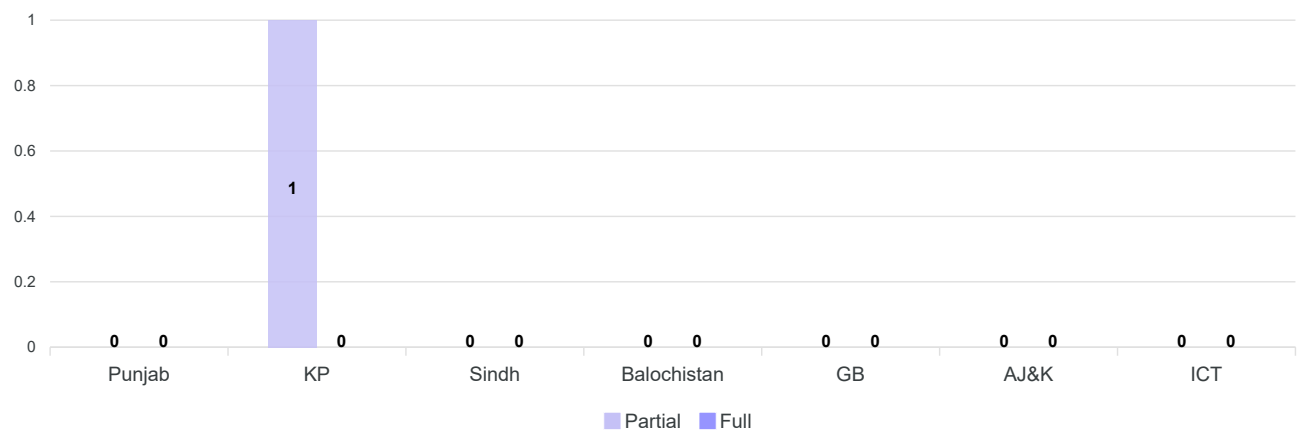

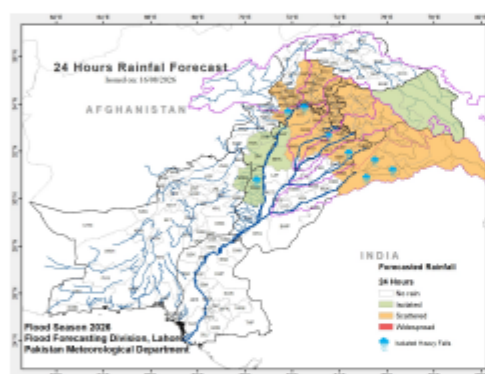

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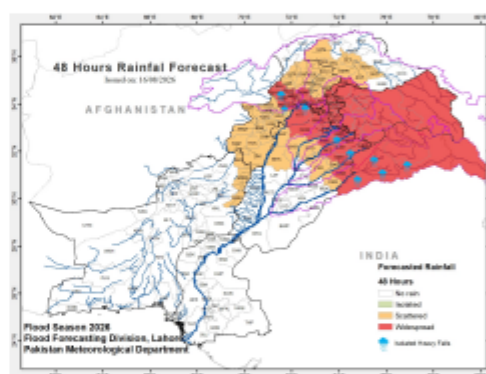

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- A fresh trough of westerly wave lies over north Afghanistan.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over south Jharkhand (India) persists with central pressure 998 hPa .
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northwest Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating into the central parts of the country up to 5,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy falls** is expected over the **upper** catchments of **Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej** rivers, **Islamabad, Kashmir, Gilgit Baltistan,** upper **Khyber Pakhtunkhwa** and upper **Punjab** during next 24-hours.

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- **Tarbela reservoir** is currently at its **Maximum Conservation Level** and is at **full capacity**, while **Mangla reservoir** is **68%** filled.
- **River Indus** at Tarbela, Kalabagh, Chashma & Taunsa is in **Low flood level** at downstream.

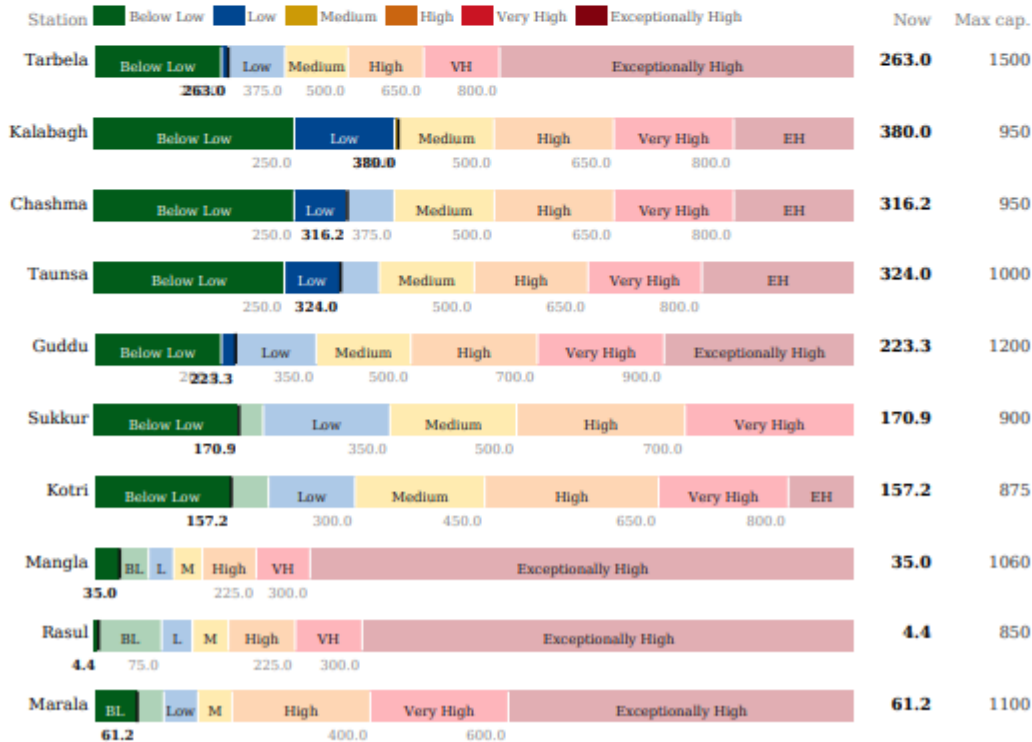
