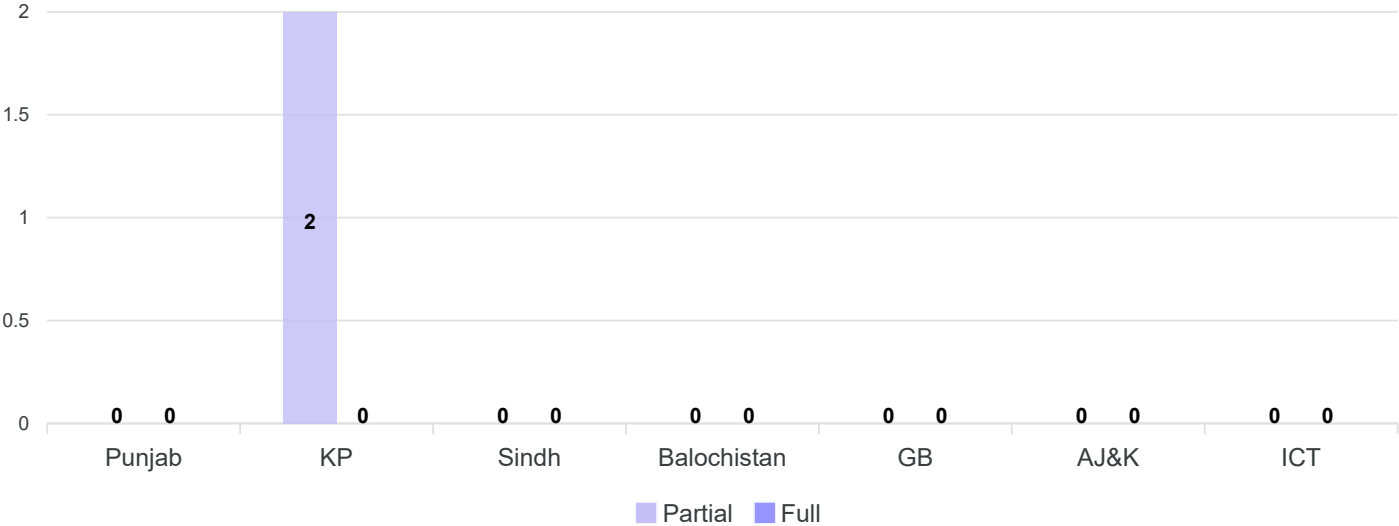

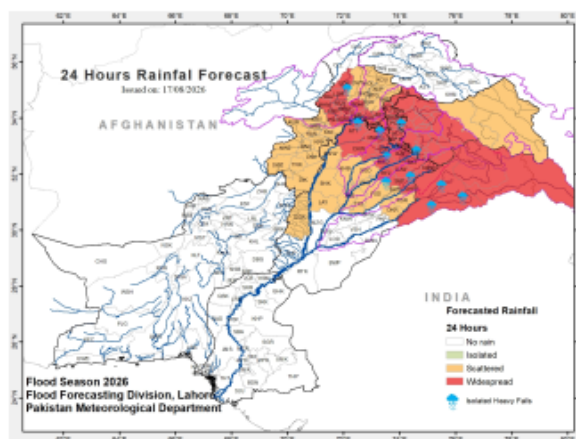

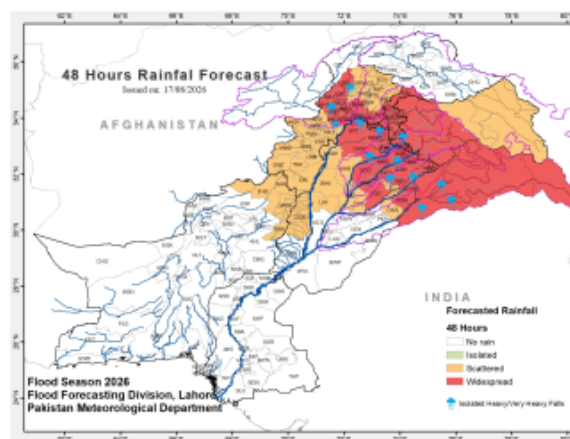

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over north Afghanistan today lies over northern parts of the country.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over south Jharkhand (India) moved eastwards and today lies over south West Bengal (India).
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northeast Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Arabian sea and Bay of Bengal are penetrating into the central parts of the country up to 5,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated heavy falls** is expected over the **upper catchments of Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir, Gilgit Baltistan, upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and upper Punjab** during next 24-hours.

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- **Tarbela reservoir** is currently at its **Maximum Conservation Level** and is at **full capacity**, while **Mangla reservoir** is **69%** filled.
- **River Indus** at Kalabagh, Chashma, Taunsa and Guddu is in **Low flood level** at downstream.

IV. HYDROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Ravi and Chenab rivers** are likely to attain **Low Flood Level**, while their associated nullahs may attain **Low to Medium Flood Level** from **17th August** to **21st August**.
- **River Jhelum at Mangla (upstream)** may attain **Low Flood Level** during next **48-hours**.
- **Urban flooding** is expected in Rawalpindi, Lahore, Gujranwala, Sialkot, Faisalabad and Gujrat during next **48-hours**.

V. WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy falls** is expected over the **upper catchments of Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir,**

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Abbottabad, Bajaur, Buner, Charsadda, Haripur, Dir, Malakand, Mardan, Mohmand, Nowshera, Peshawar and Swabi.

Punjab: Attock, Chakwal, Gujranwala, Gujrat, Hafizabad, Jhelum, Lahore, Mandi Bahauddin, Narowal, Rawalpindi, Sheikhupura and Sialkot

I. RAINFALL OUTLOOK

- **Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy to very heavy falls** are expected over the upper catchments of **all the major rivers**, including Islamabad, Kashmir, Gilgit-Baltistan, upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, and upper Punjab from **18th to 21st August** with occasional gaps.

II. FLOOD OUTLOOK

- Flows in all major rivers are expected to increase along with their associated tributaries. However **river Ravi, Chenab** may occasionally attain **Low Flood Level** during the period. The nullahs of **river Ravi and Chenab** are also expected to attain **Low to Medium Flood Level** and may attain **High Flood Level** occasionally during the period.
- Flash flooding is also expected in the **hill torrents of DG Khan** during next 24 hours and the **tributaries of river Kabul** from **18th to 19th August**.
