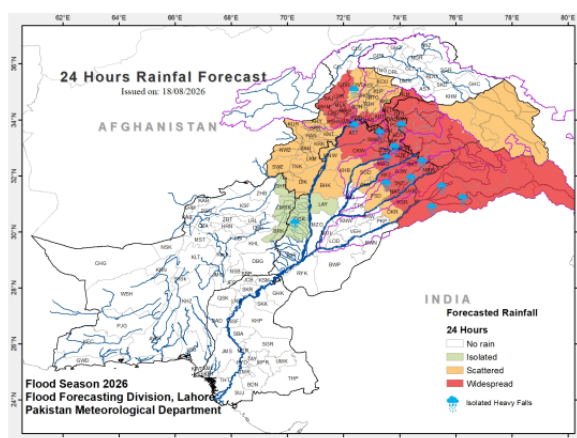

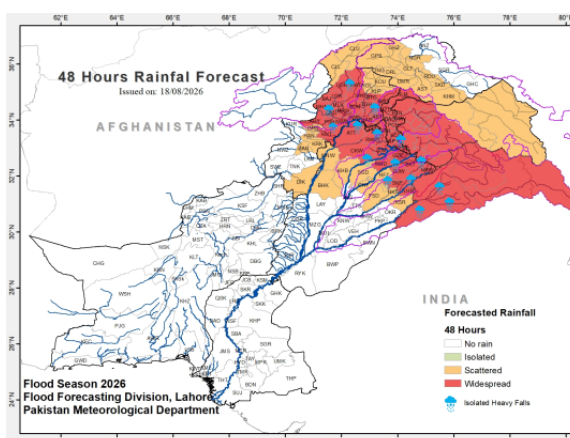

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northern parts of the country persists.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over south West Bengal has moved northwards and today lies over north West Bengal and adjoining Jharkhand (India).
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northeast Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Arabian sea and Bay of Bengal are penetrating into the upper parts of the country up to 5,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated heavy falls is expected over the upper catchments of Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir, upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and upper Punjab during next 48-hours.**

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- **Tarbela reservoir** is currently at its **Maximum Conservation Level** and is at **full capacity**, while **Mangla reservoir** is **70%** filled.
- **River Indus** at Kalabagh, Chashma, Taunsa and Guddu is in **Low flood level** at downstream.

IV. HYDROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **River Ravi and Chenab** including their associated nullahs are likely to attain **Low to Medium Flood level** during next 48-hours.
- **River Jhelum at Mangla (upstream)** may attain **Low Flood Level** during next **48-hours**.
- **Urban flooding** is expected in Rawalpindi, Lahore, Gujranwala, Sialkot, Faisalabad and Gujrat during next **48-hours**.

V. WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy falls** is expected over the **upper catchments of Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir,**

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Abbottabad, Bajaur, Charsadda, Haripur, Dir, Malakand, Mardan, Mohmand, Nowshera, Peshawar and Swabi.
