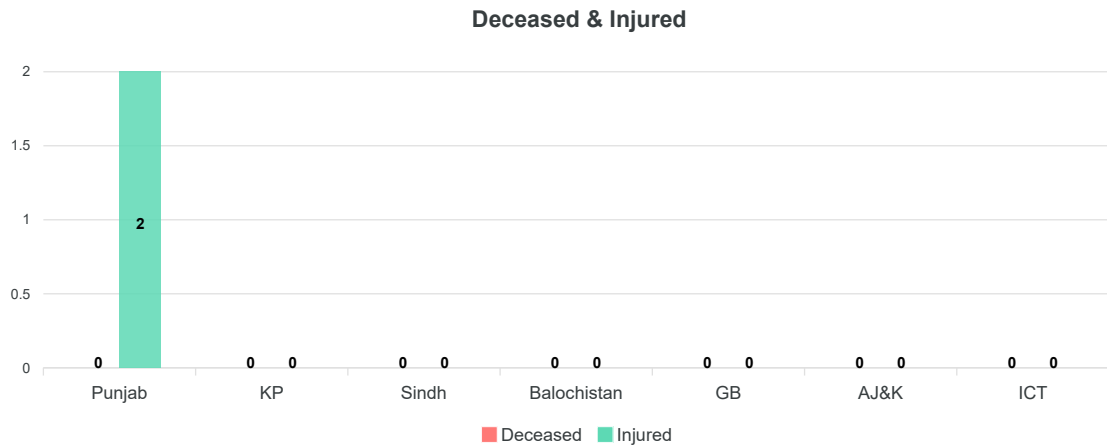

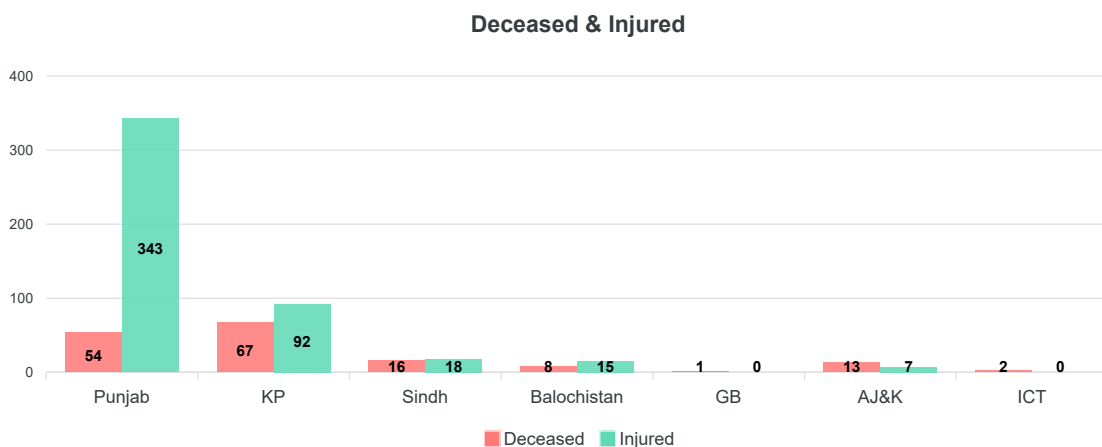

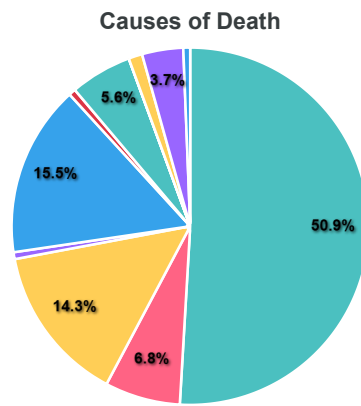

Cumulative Casualties and Injuries - (From 26 June 2026 to 19 August 2026)



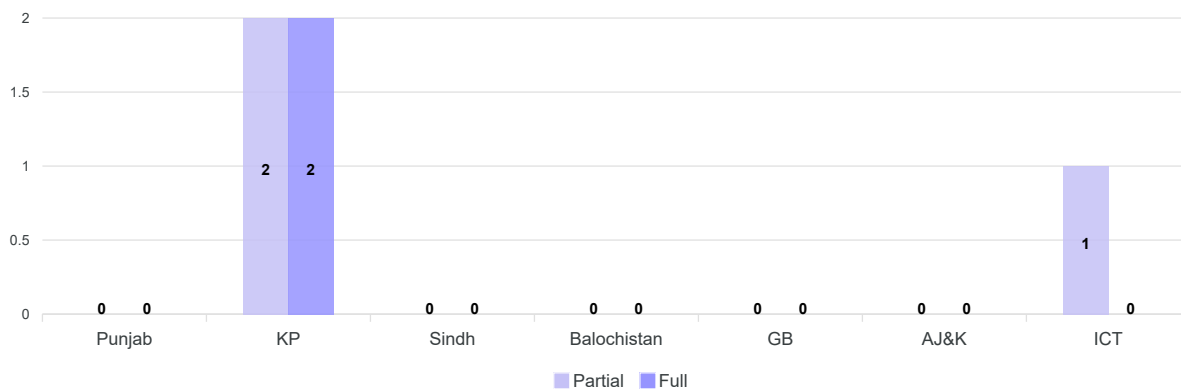

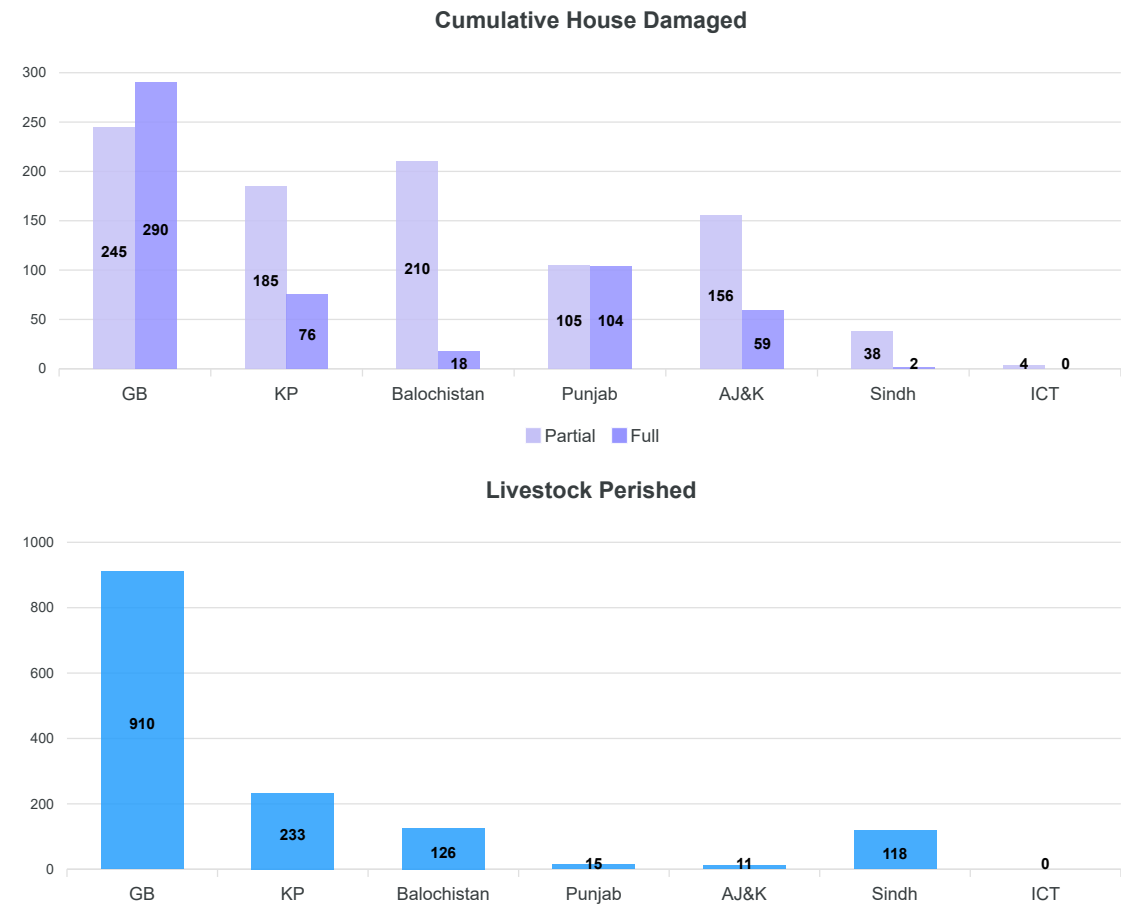

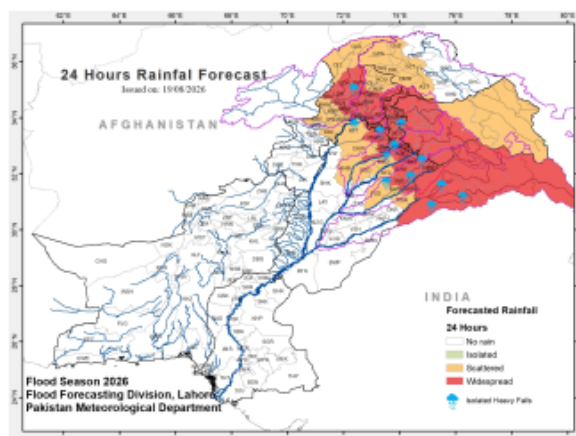

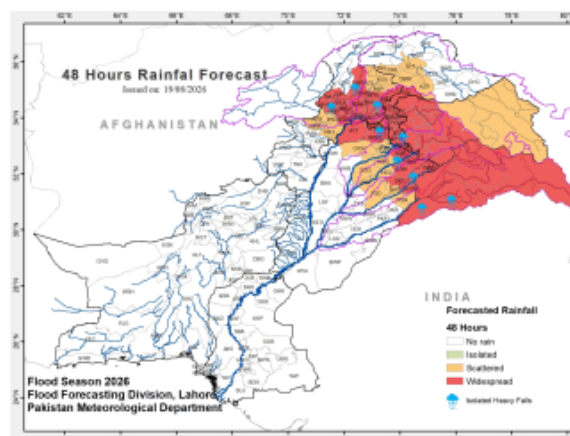

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northern parts of the country still persists.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over north West Bengal and adjoining Jharkhand has moved westwards and today lies over west Jharkhand (India).
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northeast Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating into the upper parts of the country up to 5,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated heavy falls is expected over the upper catchments of Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir, upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and upper Punjab during next 48-hours.**

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- **Tarbela reservoir** is currently at its **Maximum Conservation Level** and is at **full capacity**, while **Mangla reservoir** is **70%** filled.
- **River Indus** at Kalabagh, Chashma, Taunsa and Guddu is in **Low flood level** at downstream.

IV. HYDROLOGICAL OUTLOOK
