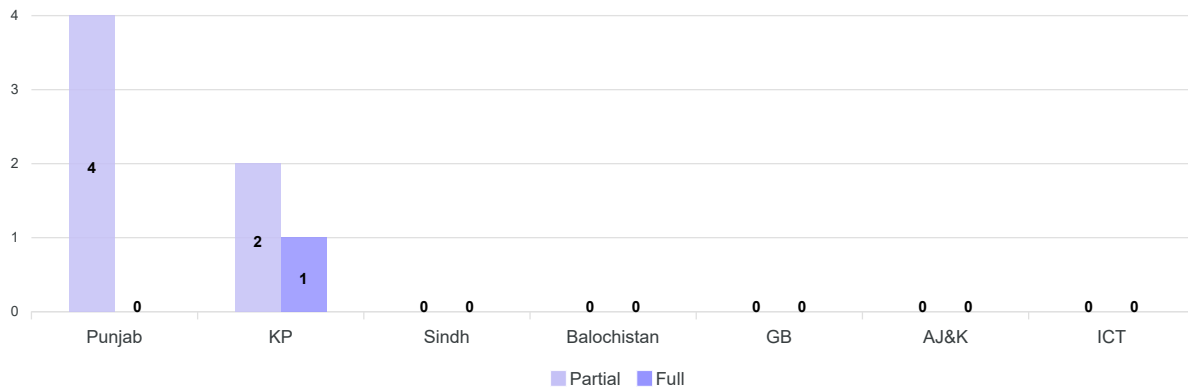

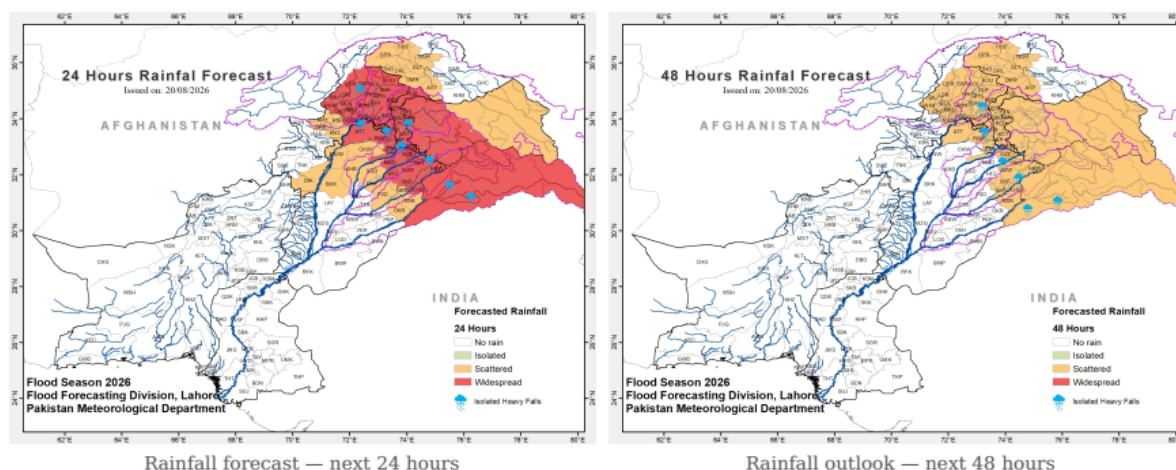

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northern parts of the country continues persisting.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over west Jharkhand has moved westwards and today lies over north Chattisgarh (India).
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northeast Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating into the upper parts of the country up to 5,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated heavy falls is expected over the upper catchments of Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir, upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and upper Punjab during next 24-hours.**

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- **Tarbela reservoir** is currently at its **Maximum Conservation Level** and is at **full capacity**, while **Mangla reservoir** is **71% filled**.
- **River Indus** at Kalabagh, Chashma, Taunsa, Guddu and Sukkur is in **Low Flood Level** at downstream.
- **River Chenab** at Marala is in **Low Flood Level** at downstream.
- **River Ravi** at Balloki is in **Low Flood Level** at upstream.

IV. HYDROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **River Indus** at Kalabagh and Chashma is expected to attain **Medium Flood Level** within next **24-hours** on account of heavy rainfall in Rawalpindi/Islamabad.
- **River Chenab** including their associated nullahs are likely to attain **Low to Medium Flood Level** during next **24-36 hours**.
- **Nullahs** of river Ravi are likely to attain **Low to Medium Flood Level** during next **24-hours**.
- **Flash flooding** is also expected in the **tributaries of river Kabul** during next **24-hours**.
- **Urban flooding** is expected in Rawalpindi, Lahore, Gujranwala, Sialkot, Faisalabad and Gujrat during next **24-hours**.

V. WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy falls** is expected over the **upper catchments of Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi & Suttlej rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir,**
Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Abbottabad, Bajaur, Batagram, Buner, Charsadda, Haripur, Kohistan, Dir, Malakand, Mansehra, Mardan, Mohmand, Nowshera, Shangla, Swabi, Swat and Tor Ghar.
Punjab: Attock, Gujranwala, Gujrat, Hafizabad, Jhelum, Lahore, Mandi Bahauddin, Narowal, Rawalpindi, Sheikhupura and Sialkot.
- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the **upper catchments of river Indus,**
Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: DI Khan, Khyber, Kohat, Orakzai and Peshawar.
Punjab: Bhakkar, Chakwal, Chiniot, Faisalabad, Kasur, Khushab, Mianwali, Nankana Sahib, Okara and Sargodha.
Gilgit-Baltistan: Astore, Darel, Diamir, Ghizer, Gilgit, Gupis, Nagar and Tangir.

WEEKLY SIGNIFICANT OUTLOOK

(21st August, 2026 to 27th August, 2026)

I. RAINFALL OUTLOOK

- **Scattered to Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated heavy falls** are expected over the **upper catchments of Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej rivers**, including **Islamabad, Kashmir, Gilgit-Baltistan, upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa**, and **upper Punjab** from **22nd to 24th August**.

II. FLOOD OUTLOOK

- **River Chenab** including their associated nullahs are likely to attain **Low to Medium Flood Level** during next 24-36 hours.
- **Urban flooding** is expected in Rawalpindi, Lahore, Gujranwala, Sialkot, Faisalabad and Gujrat during next **48-hours**.
