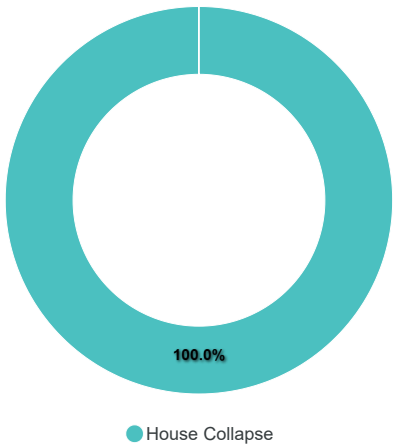

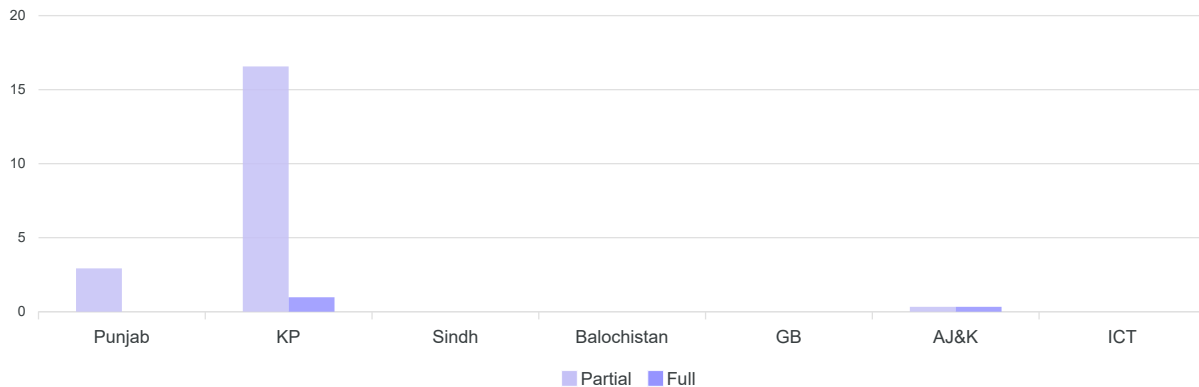

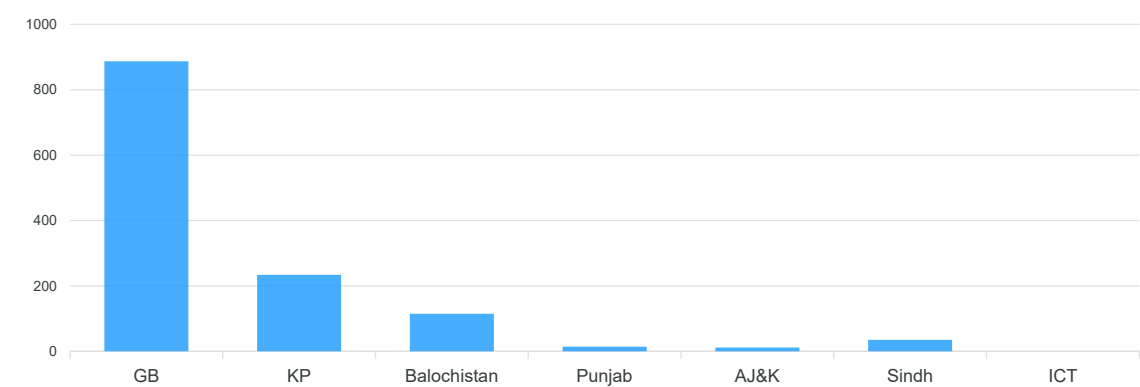

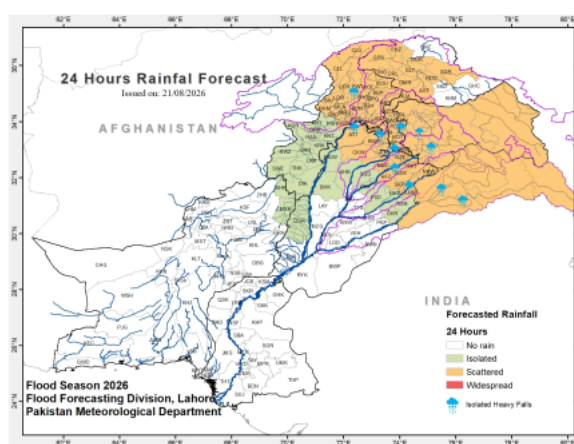

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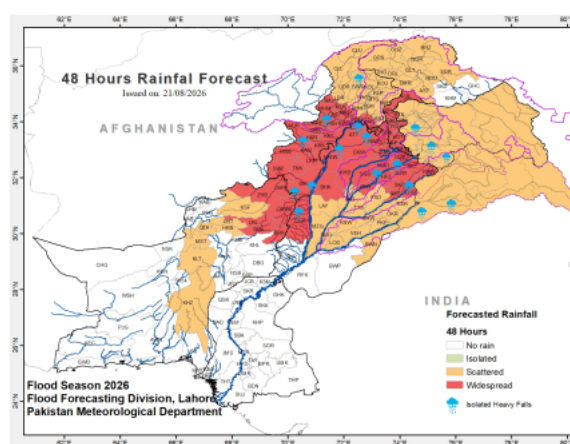

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- A fresh westerly wave lies over north Iran and its trough is penetrating over Afghanistan and adjoining northern parts of the country.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over north Chattisgarh has moved westwards and today lies over east Madhya Pradesh (India).
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northeast Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating into the upper parts of the country up to 3,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated heavy falls** is expected over the **upper catchments of all the major rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir, upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and upper Punjab** during next 24-hours.

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- **Tarbela reservoir** is currently at its **Maximum Conservation Level**, while **Mangla reservoir** is 72% filled.
- **River Indus** at Kalabagh is at **Medium Flood Level** while Tarbela, Chashma, Taunsa, Guddu and Sukkur is at **Low Flood Level** (downstream).
