Deceased & Injured



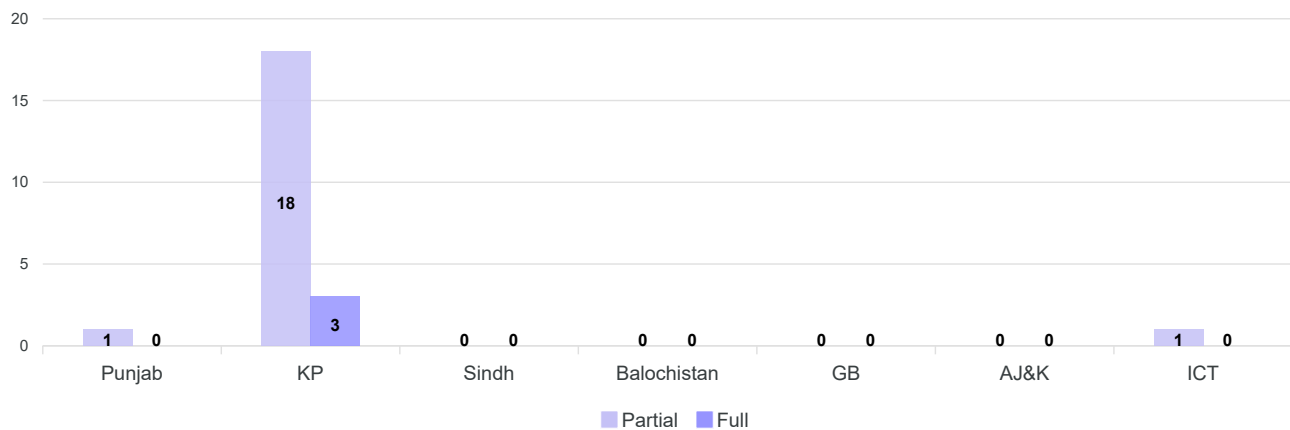

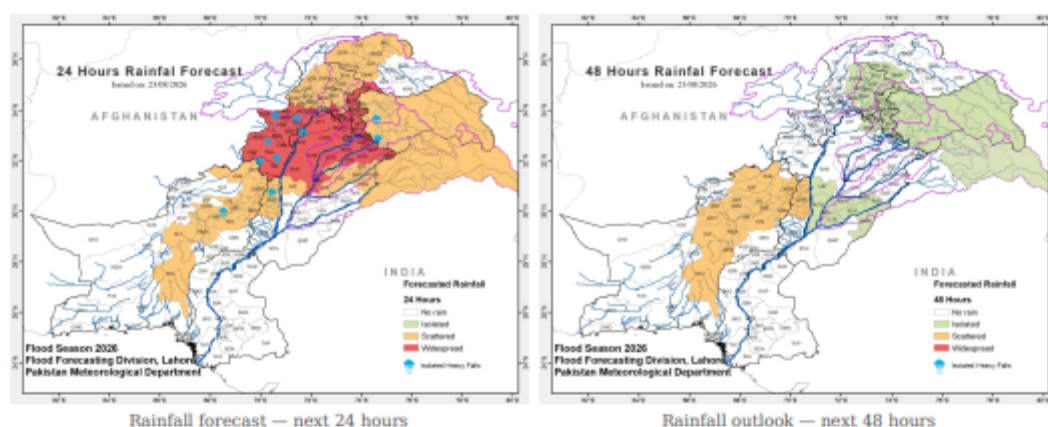

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over north Afghanistan today lies over northern parts of the country.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over east Madhya Pradesh (India) has become insignificant.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northeast Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating into the upper parts of the country up to 3,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Scattered to widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated heavy falls** is expected over the **upper catchments of all the major rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir, upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and upper Punjab** during next 24-hours.

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- **Tarbela reservoir** is currently at its **Maximum Conservation Level**, while **Mangla reservoir** is 73% filled.
- **River Indus** at Kalabagh is at **Medium Flood Level** while Tarbela, Chashma, Taunsa, Guddu and Sukkur is at **Low Flood Level** (downstream).

IV. HYDROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **River Indus** at **Chashma** and **Taunsa** is likely to attain **Medium Flood Level** during next 24-hours.
- **Flows are likely to increase** in the **Hill Torrents of DG Khan** and **local streams/nullah's of north Balochistan** in next 24 hours.

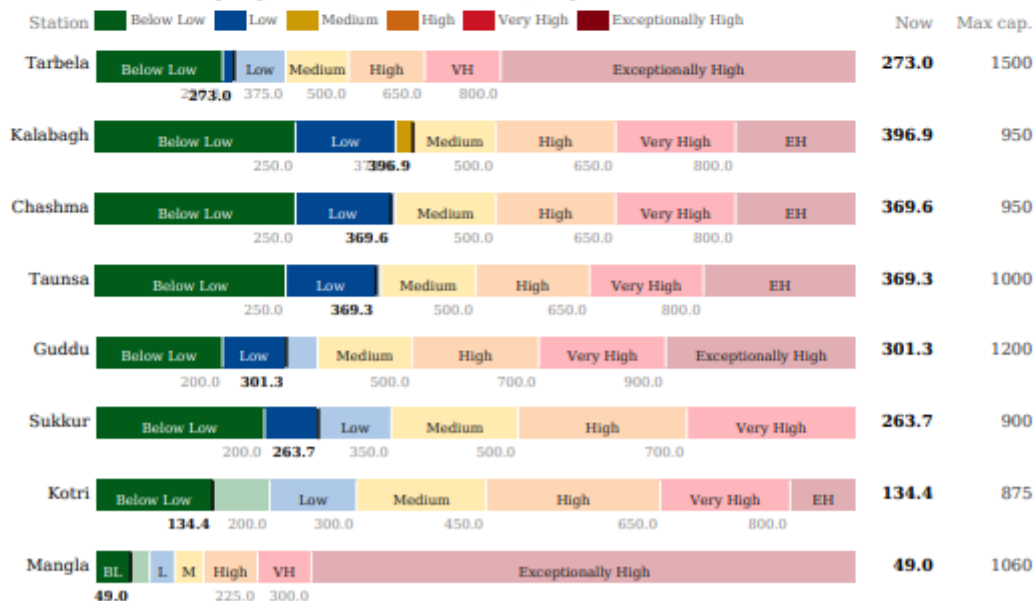
