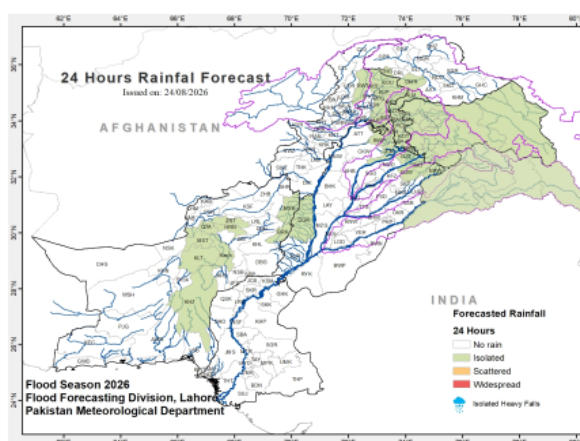

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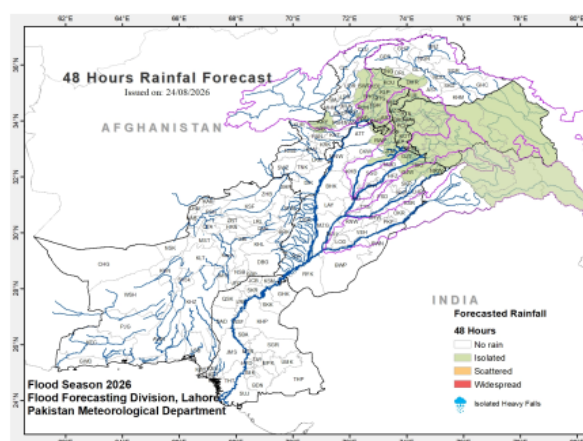

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's weak trough of westerly wave over northern parts of the country persists.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northeast Balochistan.
- Weak moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating into the lower half of the country up to 3,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Mainly hot and humid weather** is expected over most parts of the country, however, **Isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the **upper catchments** of all the **major rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir, upper Balochistan, upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and upper Punjab** during next 24-hours.

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- **Tarbela reservoir** is currently at its **Maximum Conservation Level**, while **Mangla reservoir** is 74% filled.
- **River Indus** at Kalabagh is at **Medium Flood Level** while Tarbela, Chashma, Taunsa, Guddu and Sukkur is at **Low Flood Level** (downstream).

IV. HYDROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Flows are likely to increase slightly** in the **Hill Torrents of DG Khan** and **local streams/nullah's of north Balochistan** in next 24 hours.

V. WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Mainly hot and humid weather** is expected over most parts of the country, however, **Isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the **upper catchments of all the major rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir,**
