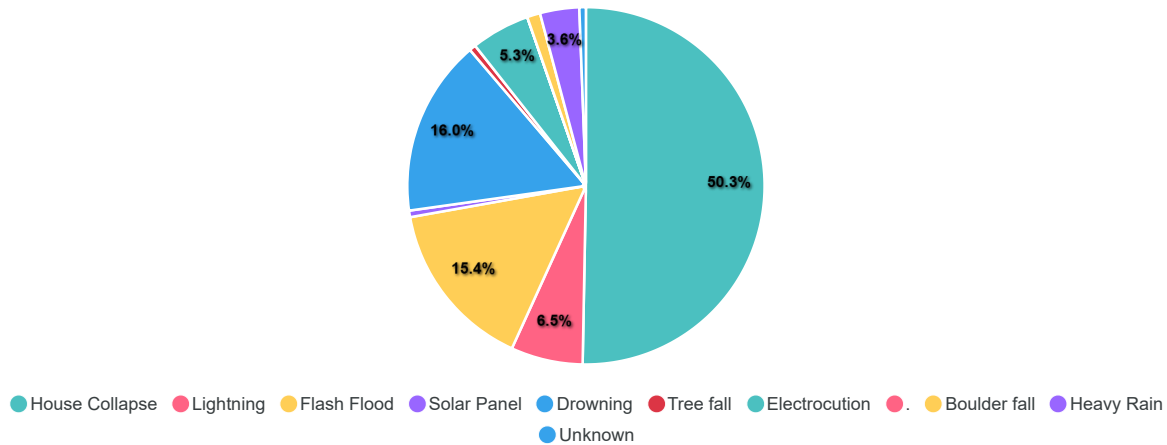

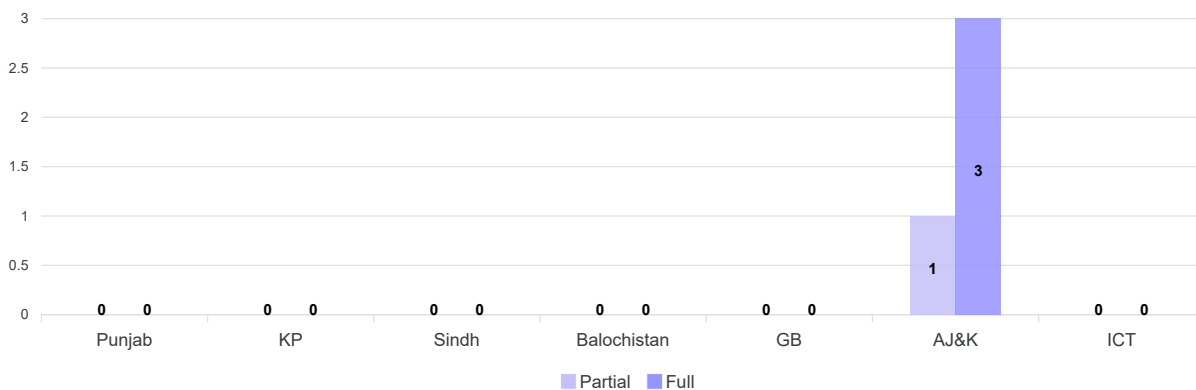

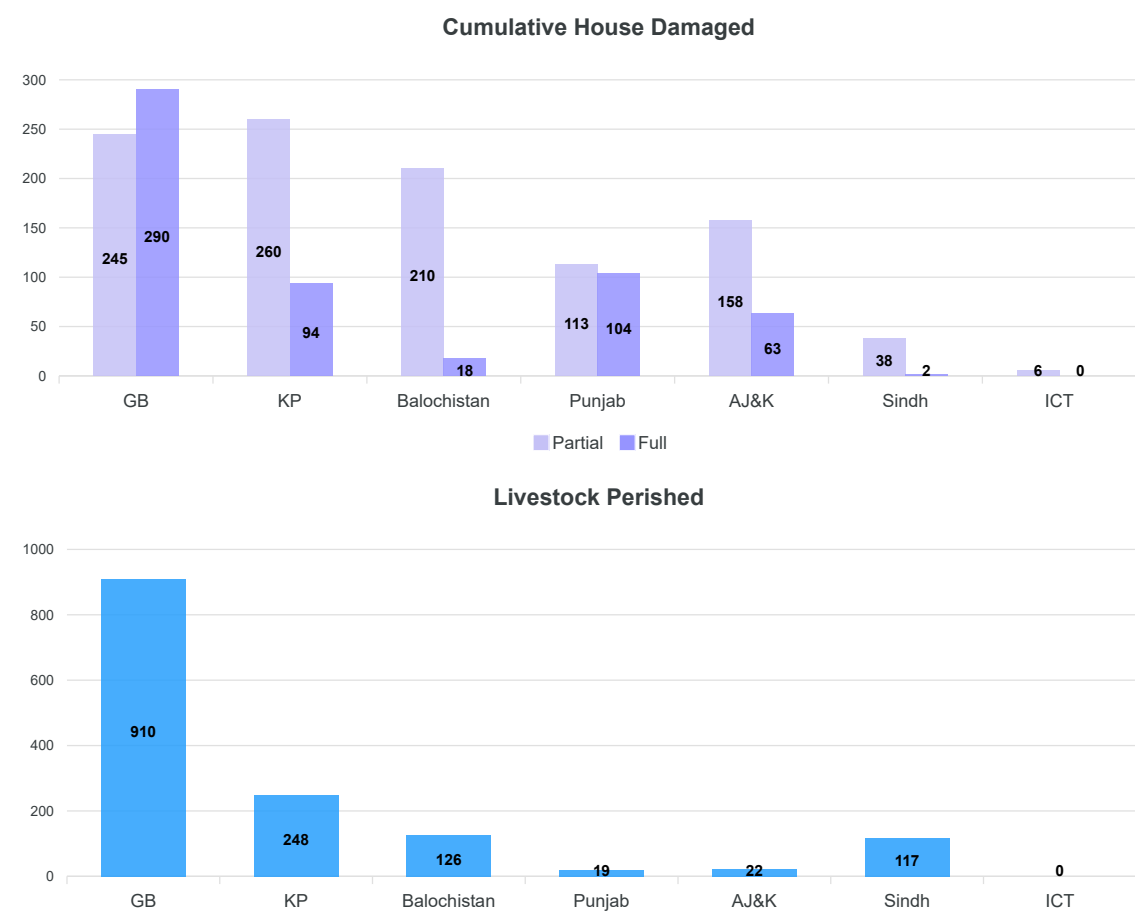

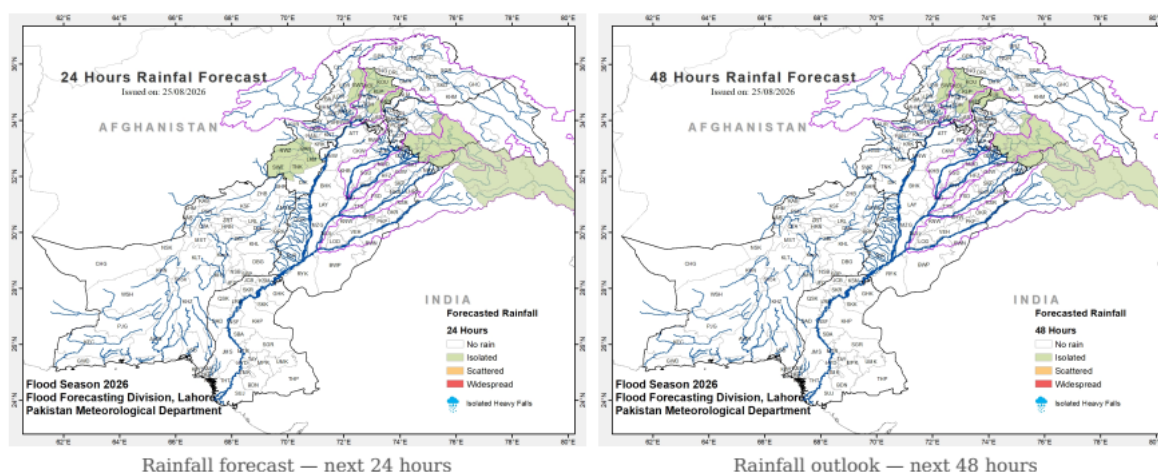

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's weak trough of westerly wave over northern parts of the country has moved eastwards.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northeast Balochistan.
- A fresh low pressure system lies over south Jharkhand (India).
- Weak moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating into the upper parts of the country up to 2,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Mainly hot and humid weather** is expected over most parts of the country, however, **Isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the **upper catchments** of **Sutlej, Ravi and Chenab** rivers.

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- **Tarbela reservoir** is currently at its **Maximum Conservation Level**, while **Mangla reservoir** is 74% filled.
- **River Indus** at Kalabagh, Chashma, Taunsa, Guddu and Sukkur is at **Low Flood Level** (downstream).

IV. HYDROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **River Indus** at **Guddu** is likely to attain **Medium Flood Level** during next **24-36 hours**.

V. WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Mainly hot and humid weather** is expected over most parts of the country with increasing trend in temperatures, however, **Isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the **upper catchments** of **Sutlej, Ravi and Chenab rivers**.

- No significant change in flows is expected in all major rivers during the period, however, **river Indus** at **Guddu** is likely to attain **Medium Flood Level** during next **24-36 hours**.
