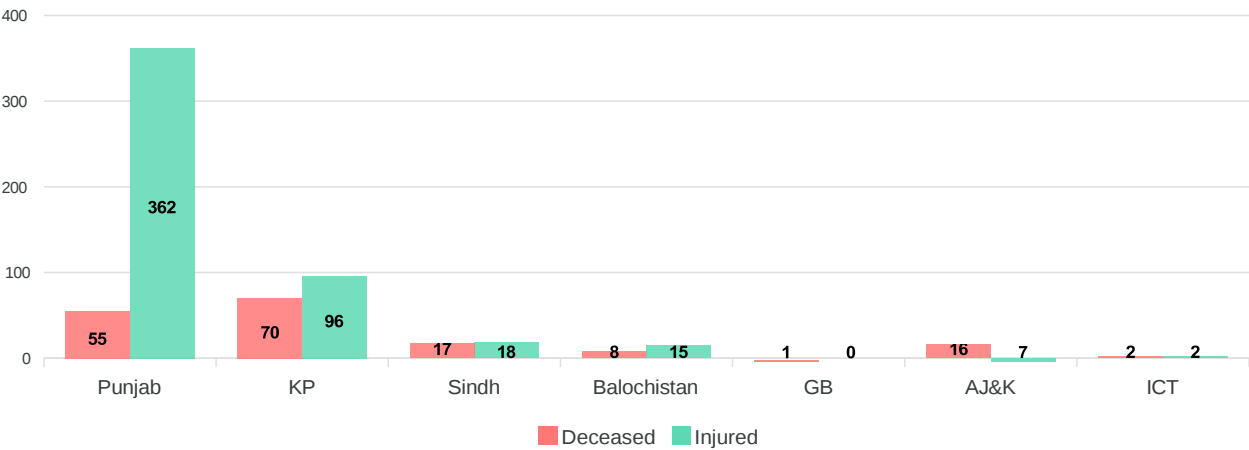

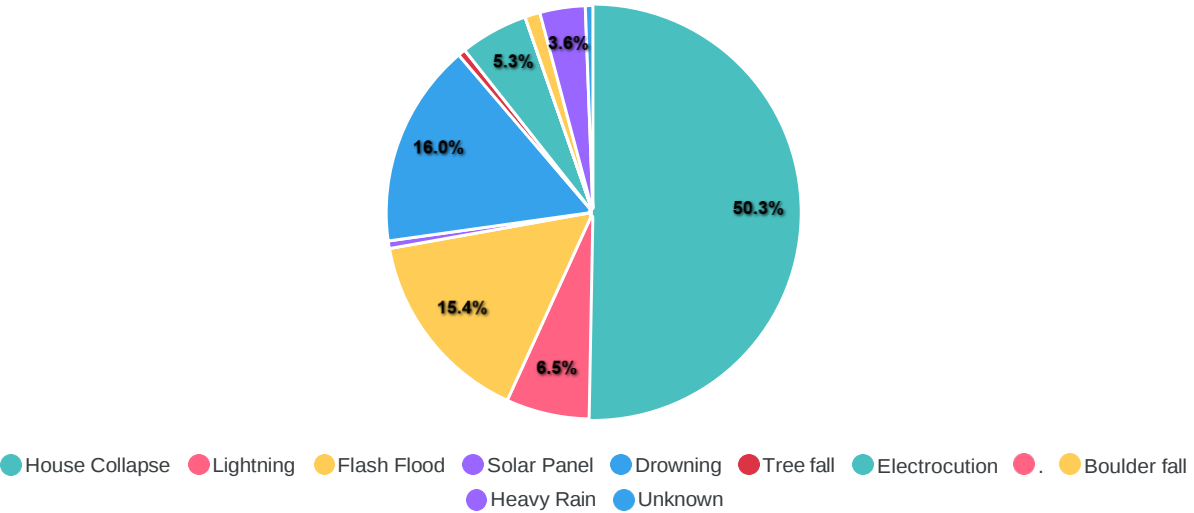

Causes of Death

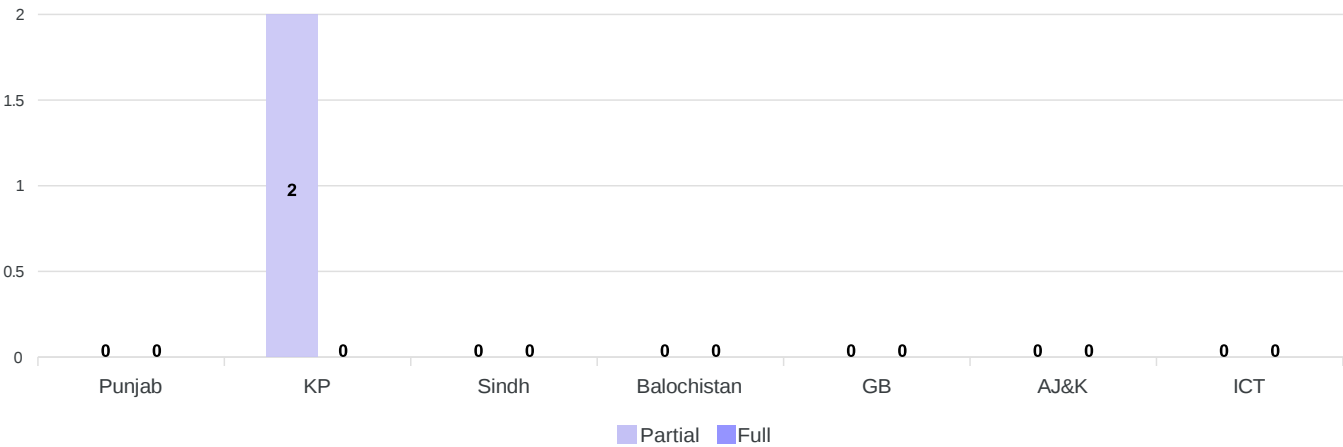

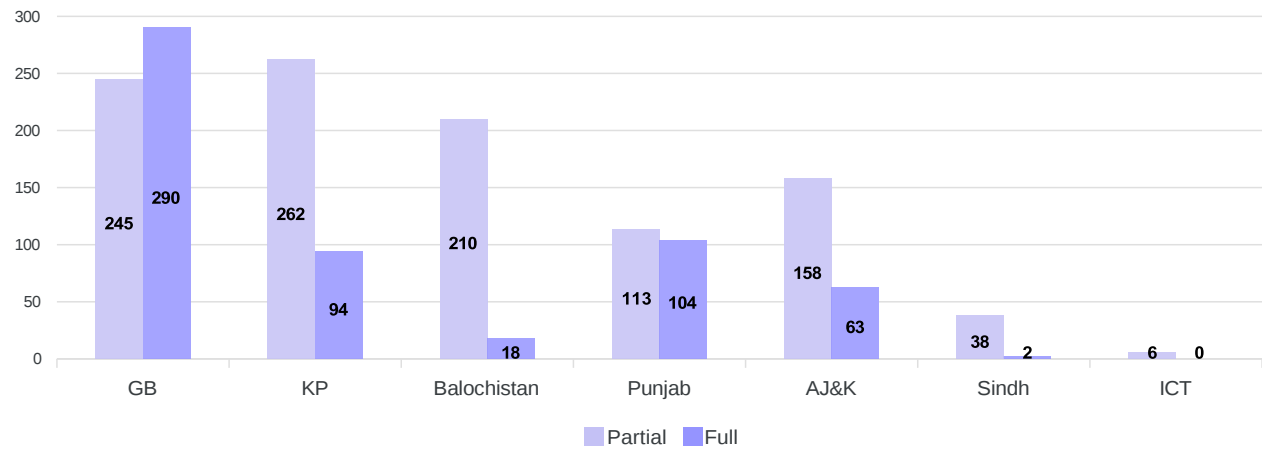

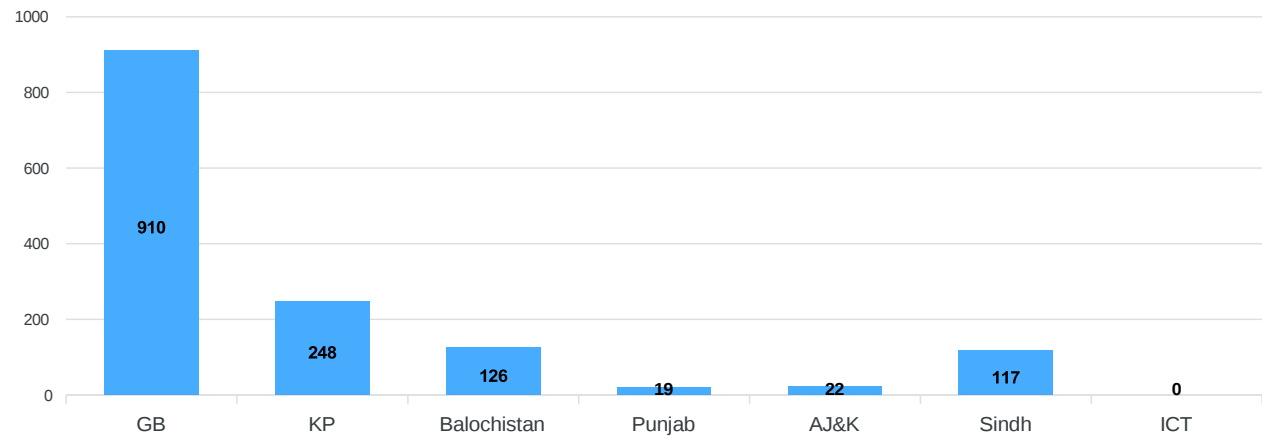

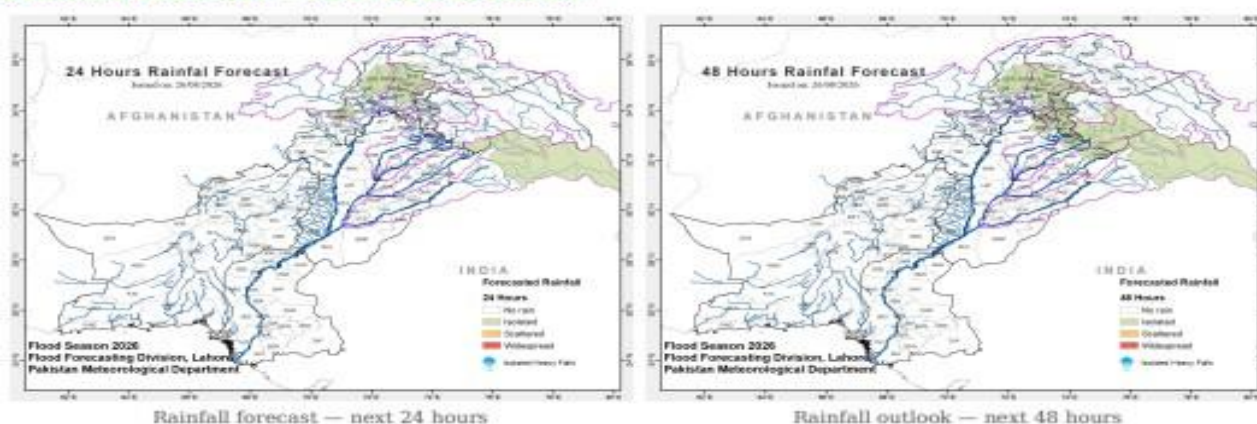

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- A fresh trough of westerly wave lies over northwest of Iran.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northeast Balochistan.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over south Jharkhand has moved westwards and today lies over northeast Madhya Pradesh (India).
- Weak moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating into the upper parts of the country up to 3,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Mainly hot and humid weather** is expected over most parts of the country, however, **Isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the **upper catchments of Sutlej and Ravi rivers**.

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- **Tarbela reservoir** is currently at its **Maximum Conservation Level**, while **Mangla reservoir** is 75% filled.
- **River Indus** at Chashma, Taunsa, Guddu and Sukkur is at **Low Flood Level** (downstream).

IV. HYDROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **River Indus at Guddu** is likely to remain **Medium Flood Level** (upstream) within next **24-hours**.

V. WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Mainly hot and humid weather** is expected over most parts of the country with increasing trend in temperatures, however, **Isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the **upper catchments** of **Sutlej and Ravi rivers**.

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Batagram, Khyber, Kohistan, Mansehra, Orakzai, Shangla, Swat and Dir.

VI. WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-HOURS

- **Mainly hot and humid weather** is expected over most parts of the country, however, **Isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the **upper catchments** of **Sutlej, Ravi and Chenab rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir,**

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Abbottabad, Batagram, Dir, Kohistan, Mansehra, Shangla and Swat.

Punjab: Gujrat, Narowal, Rawalpindi and Sialkot.

WEEKLY SIGNIFICANT OUTLOOK

(27th August, 2026 to 02nd September, 2026)

I. RAINFALL OUTLOOK

- A monsoon trough is expected to affect upper catchments of all the major rivers moderately from **28th August to 02nd September**. Consequently, scattered to widespread rainfall activity is expected in the upper catchments of all the major rivers during the period.

II. FLOOD OUTLOOK

- On account of expected monsoon trough from **28th August to 02nd September**, flows in rivers **Jhelum, Chenab and Ravi** along with their associated nullahs are expected to **increase moderately** during the period.
