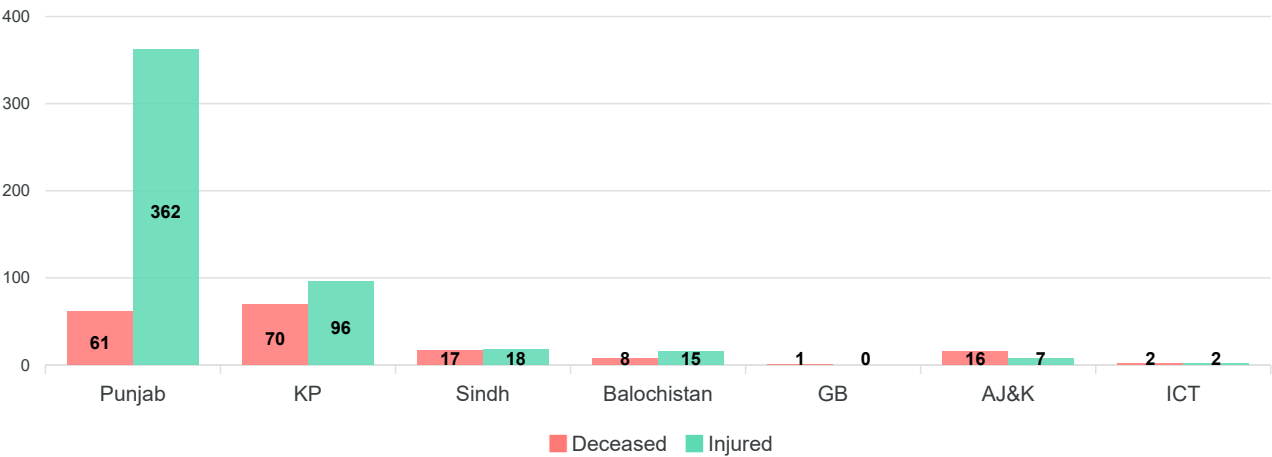

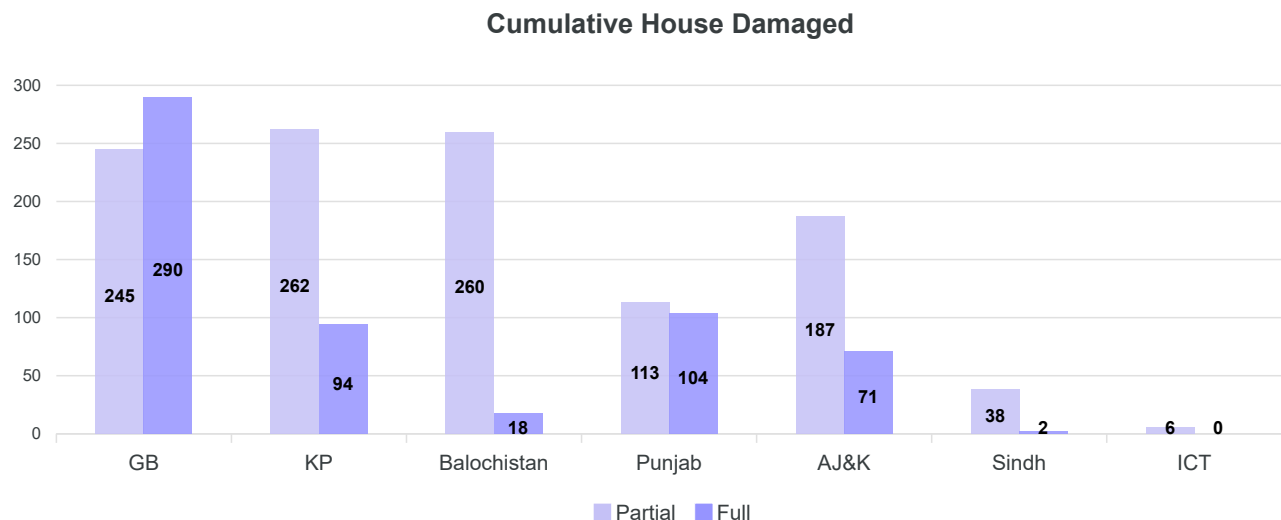

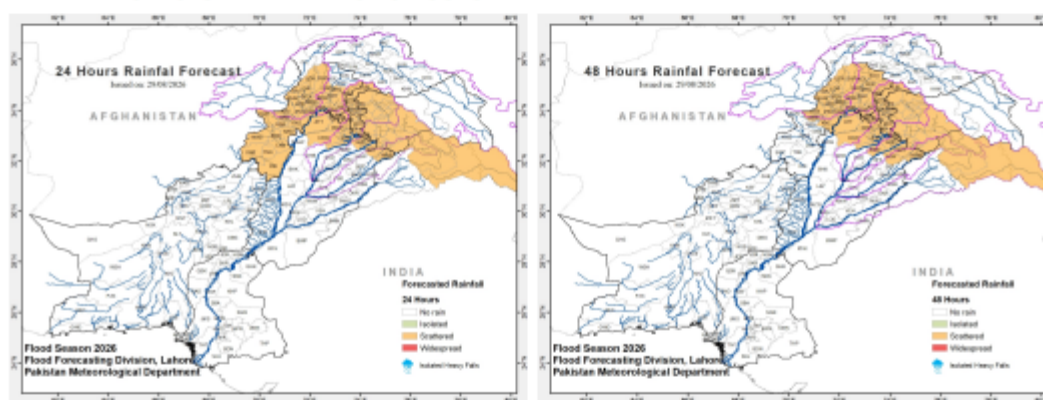

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northwest Afghanistan today lies over north Afghanistan.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northeast Balochistan.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over northwest Jharkhand (India) has become weakened.
- Weak moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating into the upper parts of the country up to 3,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Mainly hot and humid weather** is expected over most parts of the country, however, **Isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the **upper catchments** of **Sutlej, Ravi, Chenab and Jhelum** rivers, Kashmir.

- **River Indus** at Guddu and Sukkur is at **Low Flood Level** (downstream).

- Flows in **rivers Chenab at Marala** is expected to **increase** slightly during **24-hour**.

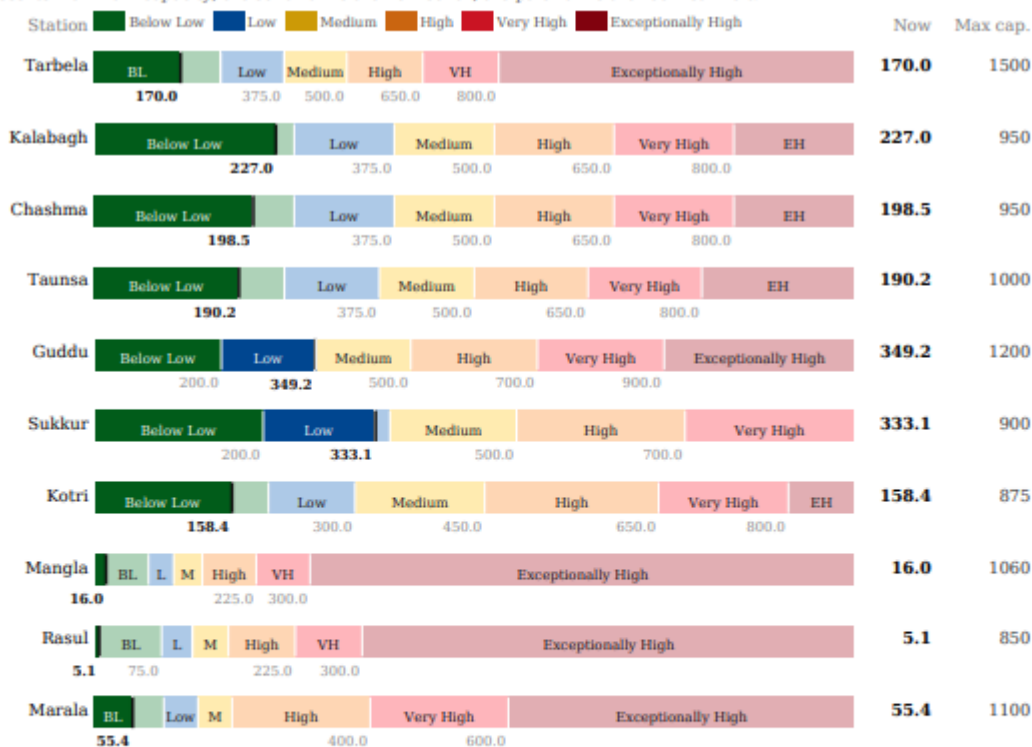
