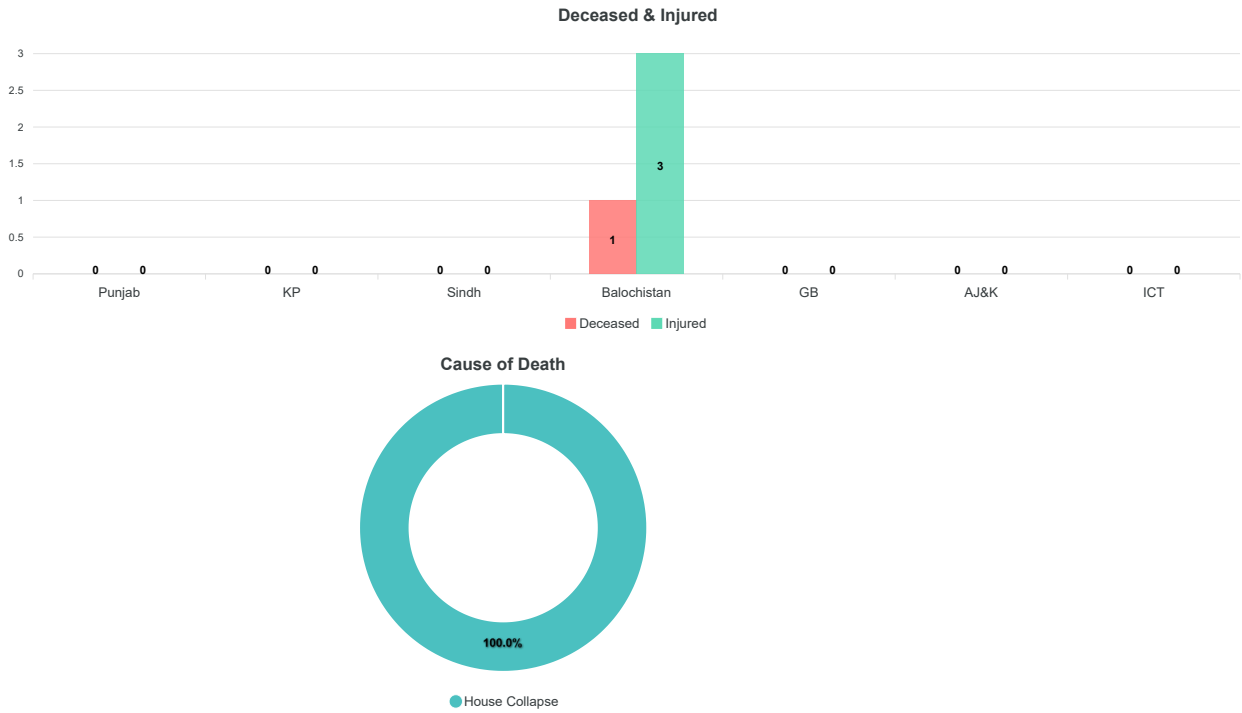

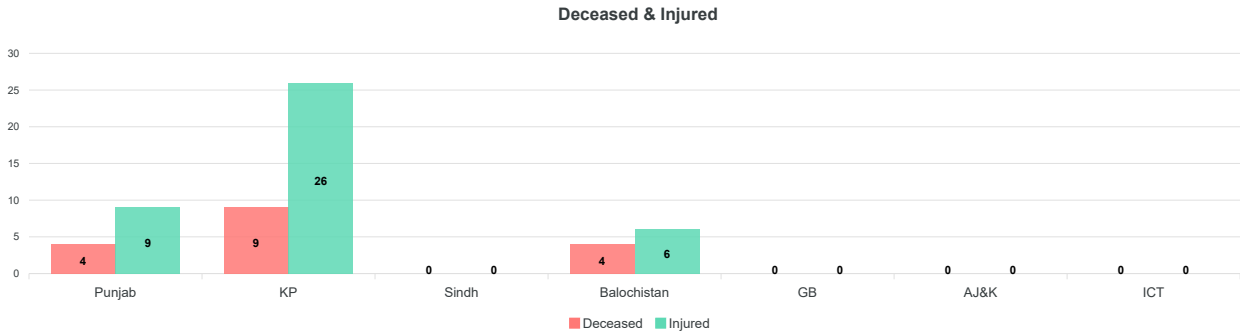

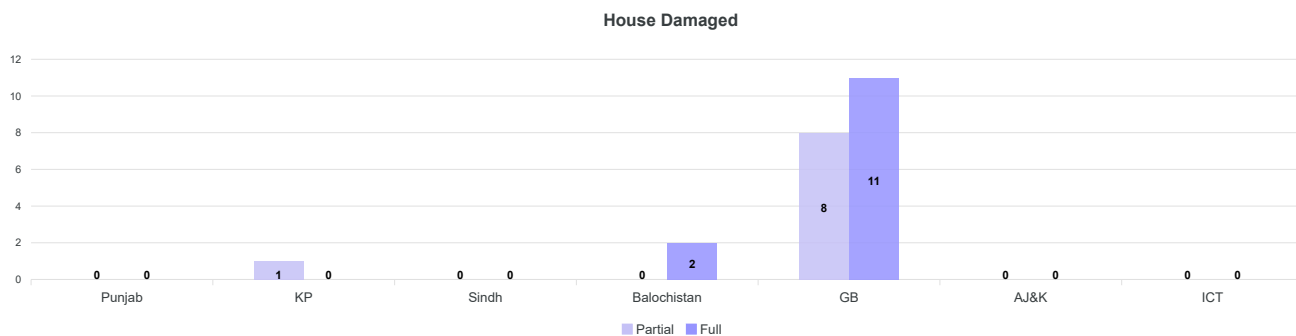

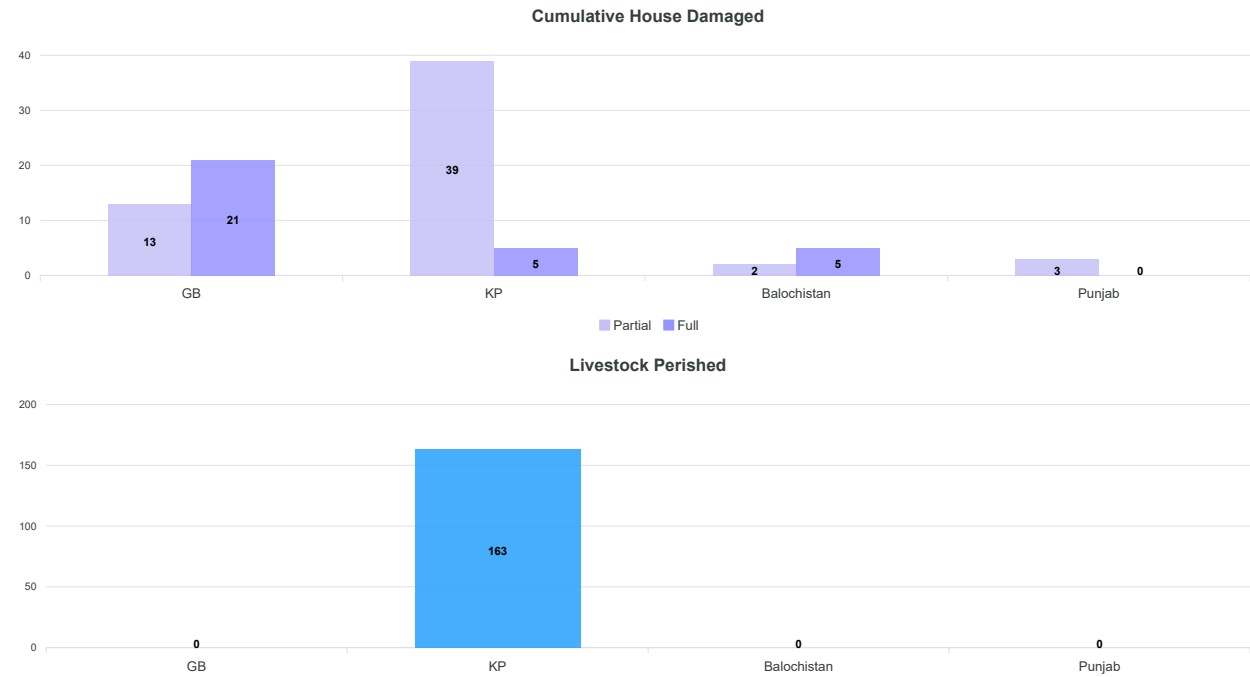

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- All the major rivers are flowing within their normal flows.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- A trough of westerly wave continues to persist over the northwestern parts of country.
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over northwest Balochistan.
- Moist currents are penetrating the lower half of the country and extending up to an altitude of 2,000 feet

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the upper catchments of all the major rivers, Islamabad, **Kashmir, Gilgit Baltistan.**
