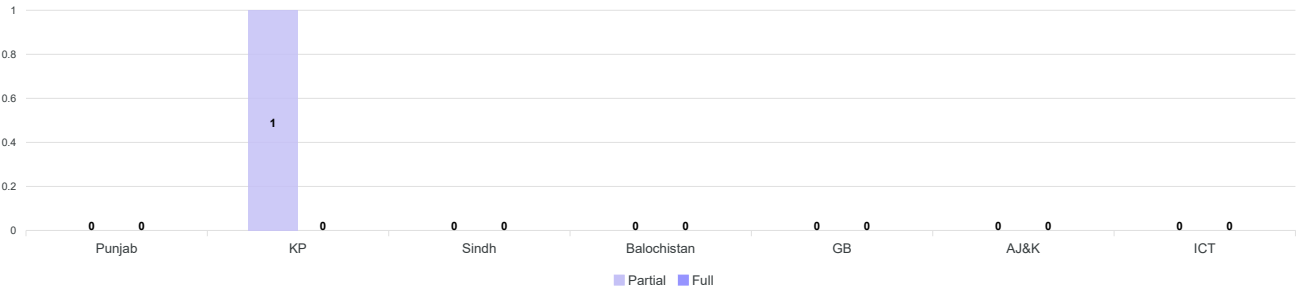

DAILY FLOOD BULLETIN

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- All the major rivers are flowing within their normal flows.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- A fresh trough of westerly wave lies over north Afghanistan and approaching to the northern parts of the country within next 24-hours.
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over northwest Balochistan.
- Yesterday's well-marked Low with central pressure (992 hPa) today lies over South Jharkhand (India). It is expected to move westwards over Northeast Madhya Pradesh and adjoining Chattisgarh (India) within next 24 hours.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated heavy falls** is expected over the upper catchments of **all the major rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir, Gilgit Baltistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa**: Abbottabad, Adam khel, Bajaur, Bannu, Buner, Charsadda, Dir, Hangu, Haripur, Karak, Khyber, Kohat, Kohistan, Kurram, Lakki Marwat, Malakand, Mansehra, Mardan, Mohmand, Nowshera, Orakzai, Peshawar, Waziristan, Shangla, Swabi and Swat.
