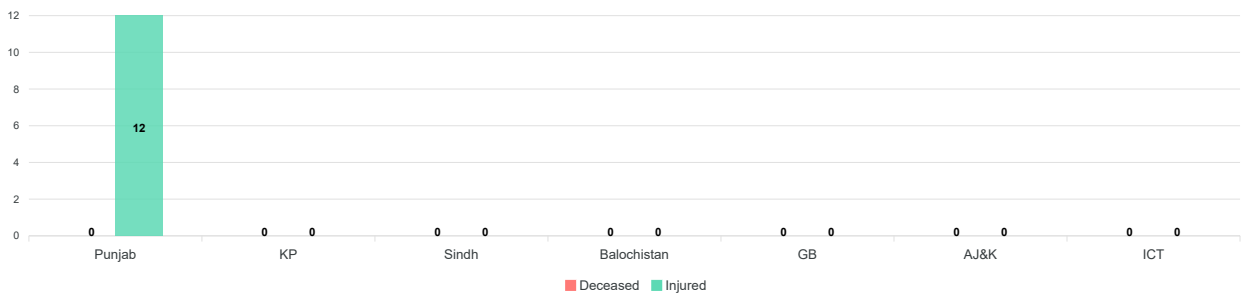

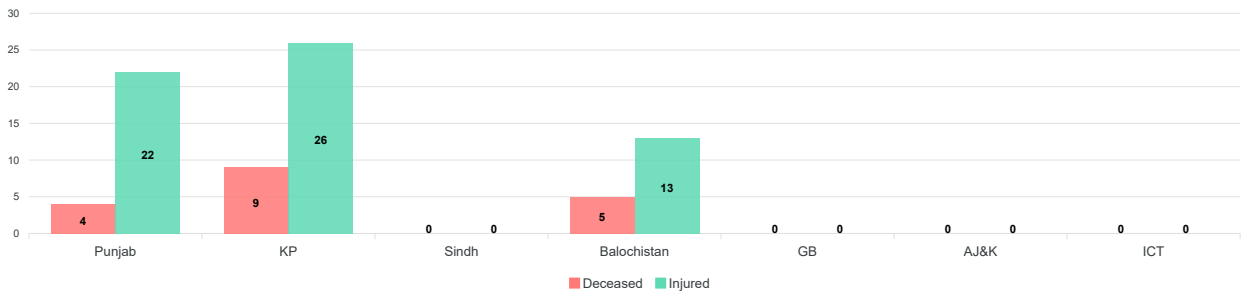

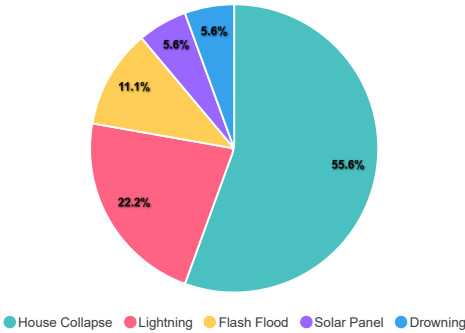

Causes of Death

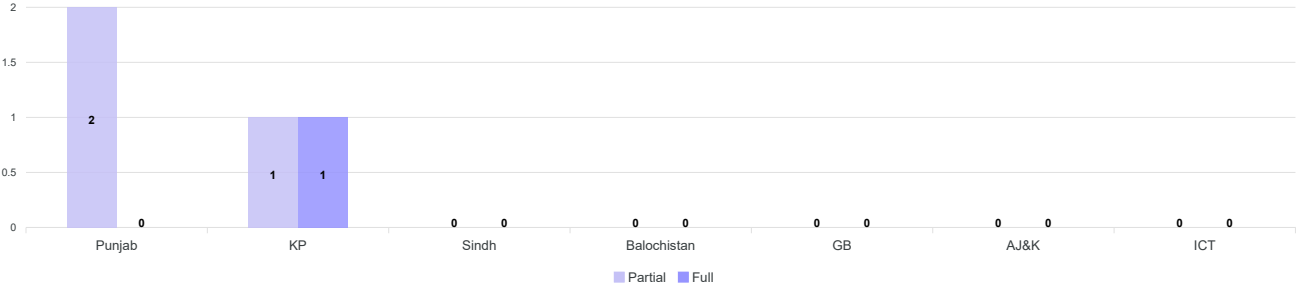

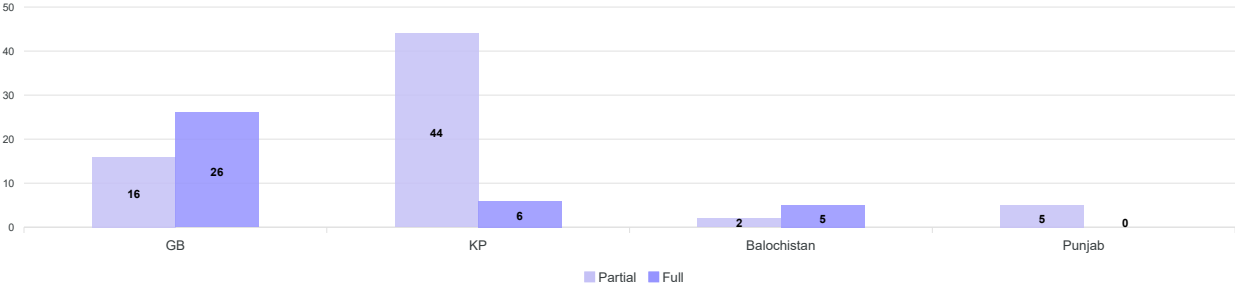

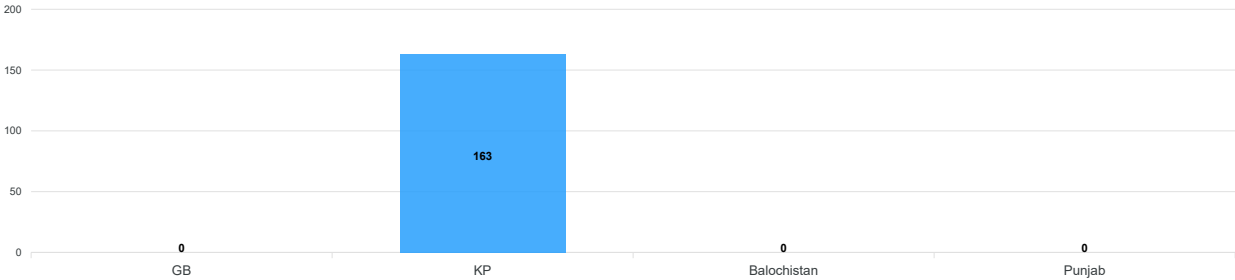

DAILY FLOOD BULLETIN

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- All the major rivers are flowing within their normal flows.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's shallow trough of westerly wave over north Afghanistan today lies over North of the country.
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over northwest Balochistan.
- Yesterday's well-marked low-pressure area over South Jharkhand (India), has moved westwards and now lies over Northwest Chhattisgarh and adjoining Madhya Pradesh (India) with central pressure of 993 hPa. It is likely to continue moving westward and is expected to reach central Madhya Pradesh (India) within the next 24 hours.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the upper catchments of **all the major rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir, Gilgit Baltistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa:** Abbottabad, Adam khel, Bajaur, Bannu, Buner, Charsadda, Dera Ismail Khan, Dir, Hangu, Haripur, Karak, Khyber, Kohat, Kohistan, Kurram, Lakki Marwat, Malakand, Mansehra, Mardan, Mohmand, Nowshera, Orakzai, Peshawar, Waziristan, Shangla, Swabi, Swat and Tank.
