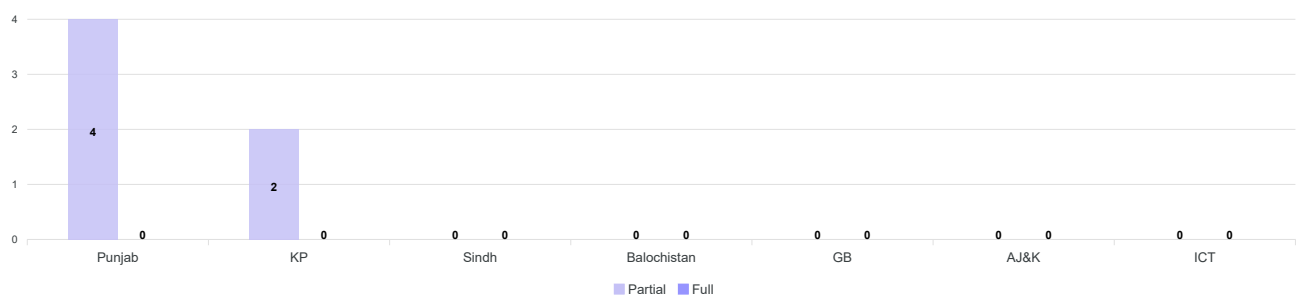

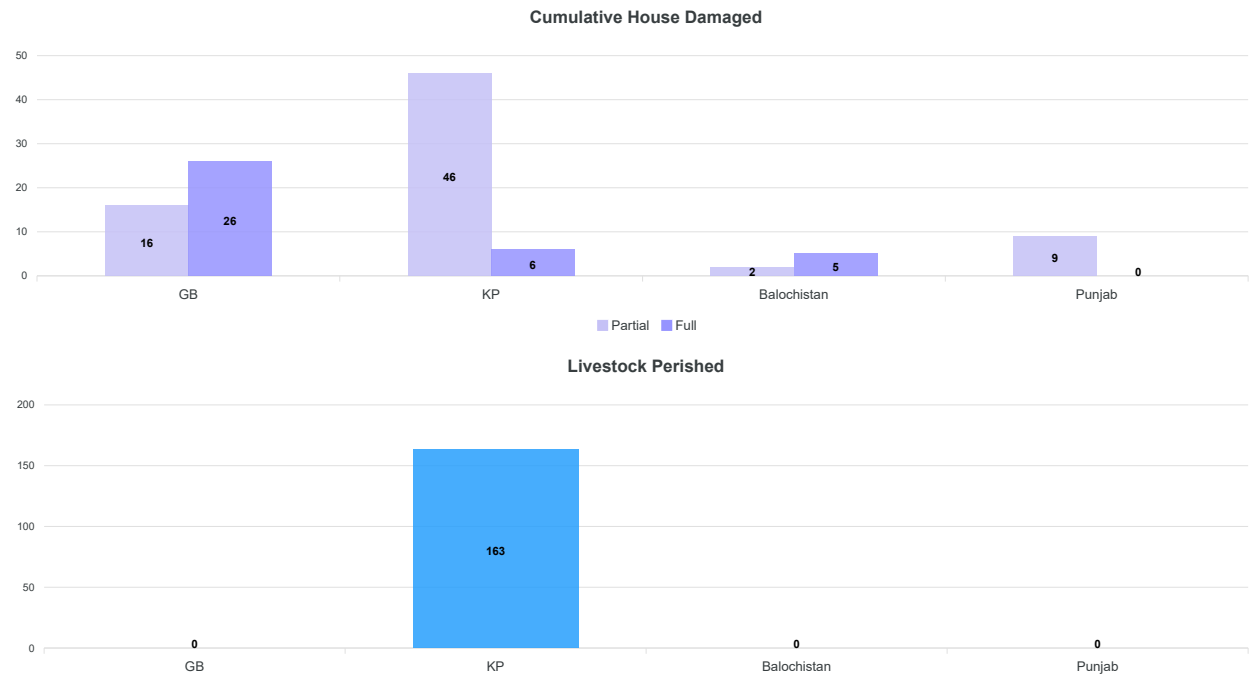

DAILY FLOOD BULLETIN

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- All the major rivers are flowing within their normal flows.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's shallow trough of westerly wave over northern parts of country has moved slightly and today lies over northeastern parts of the country.
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over northwest Balochistan.
- Yesterday's well-marked low-pressure area over Northwest Chhattisgarh and adjoining Madhya Pradesh (India) has weakened into a low-pressure area, with a central pressure of **994 hPa**, and now lies over North Madhya Pradesh (India). It is likely to continue moving northwestward within the next 24 hours and weaken further thereafter.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the upper catchments of Sutlej, Ravi and Chenab rivers, Islamabad and Kashmir.
Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Abbottabad, Bajaur, Battagram, Buner, Charsadda, Chitral, Dir, Haripur, Kohistan, Kurram, Malakand, Mansehra, Mohmand, Waziristan, Shangla, Swabi and Swat.
- **Isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected in the upper catchments of river Indus, Jhelum and Gilgit Baltistan
Punjab: Rawalpindi, Attock, Jhelum, Chakwal, Gujranwala, Narowal, Sialkot, Mandi Bahauddin, Gujrat, Hafizabad, Sargodha, Khushab, Faisalabad, Sahiwal, Multan, Okara, Bhakkar, Mianwali, Dera Ghazi Khan, Rajanpur, Lahore, Kasur, Sheikhupura and Nankana Sahib.
Balochistan: Barkhan, Kalat, Khuzdar, Loralai, Musa Khel and Zhob.

IV: WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-HOURS

Wet spell is likely to decrease.

2. WEEKLY WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR RIVER'S CATCHMENTS

➤ RAINFALL OUTLOOK:

Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated heavy falls is expected over the upper catchments of all major rivers, Islamabad, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Kashmir, Gilgit Baltistan and North Punjab from **11th to 13th July**.

➤ FLOOD SITUATION IN MAJOR RIVERS:

No significant increase in the flows is expected in all the major rivers.
