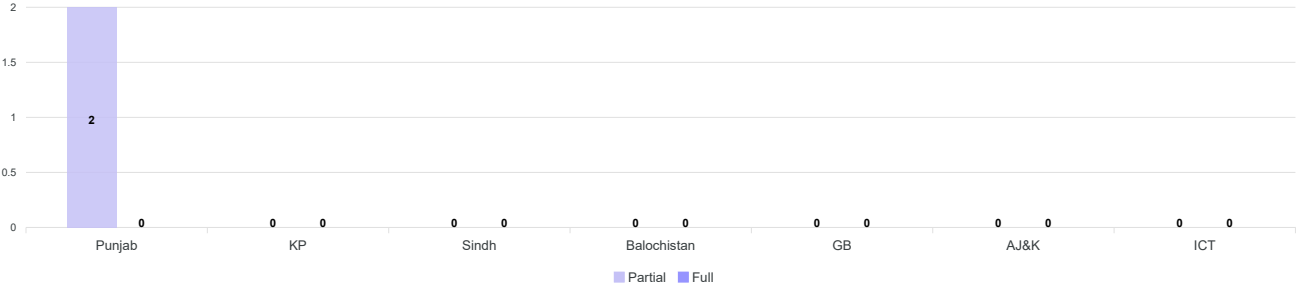

- All the major rivers are flowing within their normal flows.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- A fresh trough of westerly wave lies over northern parts of Iran.
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over northwest Balochistan.
- Yesterday's low-pressure area over North Madhya Pradesh (India) has moved slightly westwards and today lies over Northeast Rajasthan, with a central pressure of 995 hPa. It is expected to move northeastward, reach the central parts of Uttar Pradesh (India), and weaken further during the next 24 hours.
- Weak moist currents from Arabian sea and Bay of Bengal are penetrating upper parts of the country up to 3000 feet.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the upper catchments of all the major rivers, Islamabad and Kashmir.
Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Abbottabad, Buner, Dir, Kohistan, Mansehra and Swat.
Punjab: Rawalpindi, Jhelum, Gujrat, Narowal, Sialkot and DG Khan.
- Hot and humid weather is expected for rest of the country.

No significant change.
