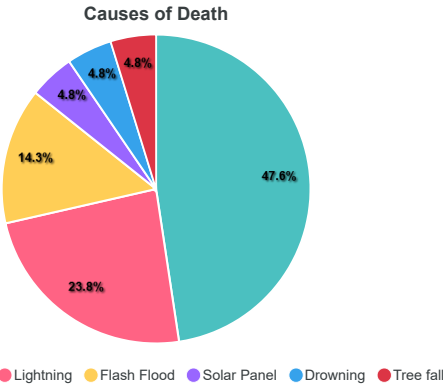
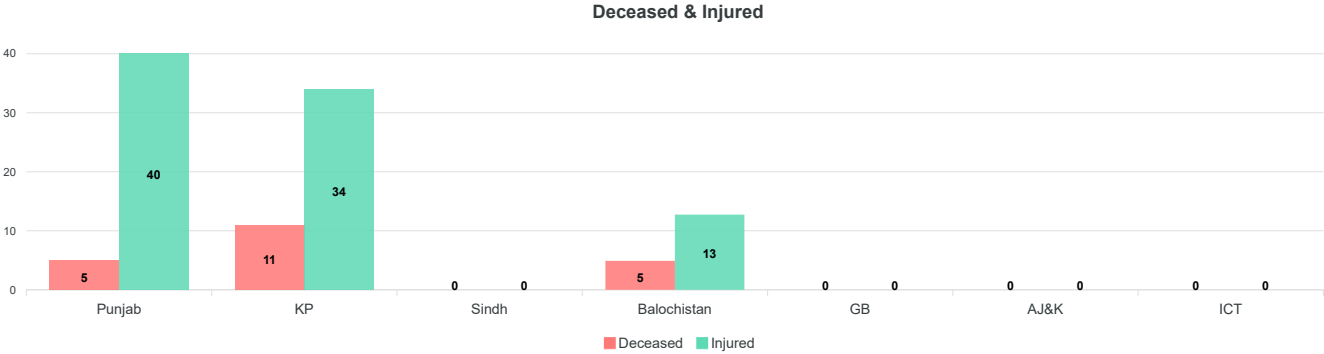

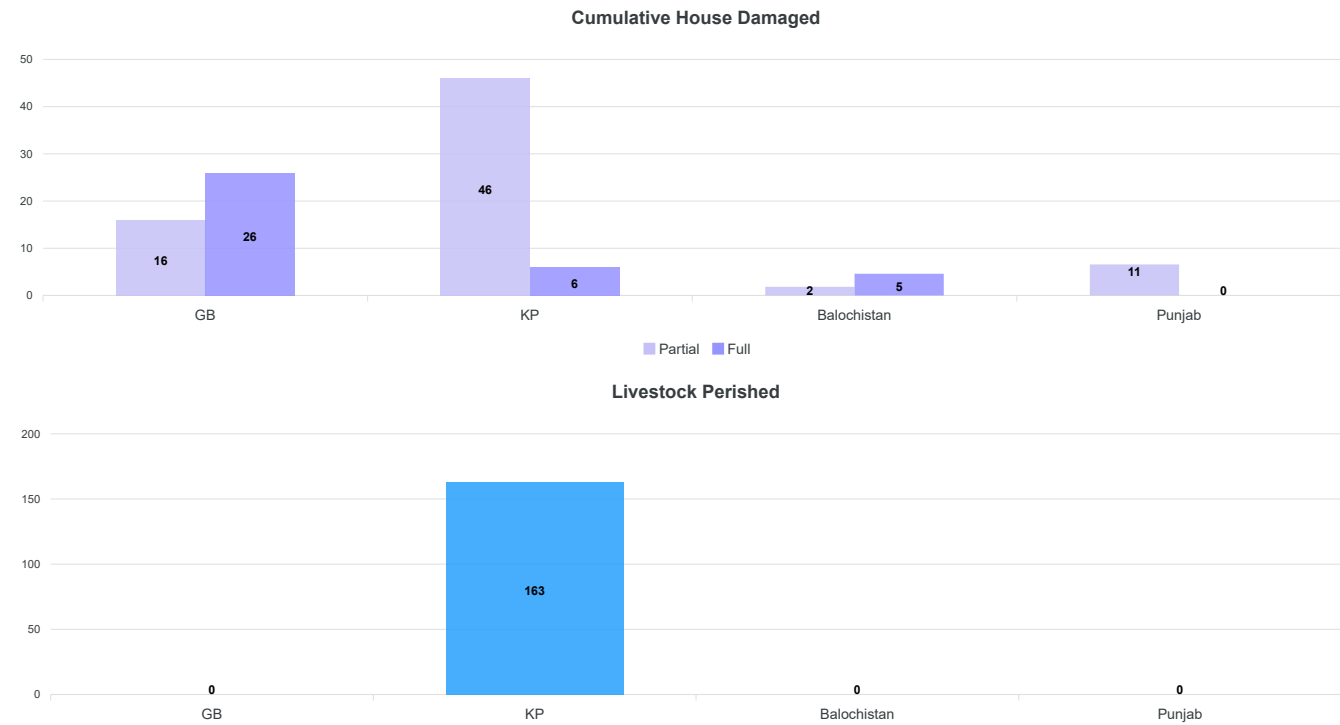

DAILY FLOOD BULLETIN

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- All the major rivers are flowing within their normal flows.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- A trough of westerly wave lies over northern parts of the country.
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over West Balochistan.
- Yesterday's low-pressure area over Northeast Rajasthan has become insignificant.
- Moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating upper parts of the country up to 3000 feet.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the upper catchments of all the major rivers, **Islamabad, Gilgit Baltistan and Kashmir**.
Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Abbottabad, Adam Khel, Bajaur, Battagram, Buner, Charsadda, Dir, Haripur, Karak, Khyber, Kohat, Lakki Marwat, Malakand, Mansehra, Mardan, Mohmand, Nowshera, Orakzai, Peshawar, Swabi and Swat;
Punjab: Rawalpindi, Attock, Gujranwala, Jhelum, Kasur, Lahore, Narowal, Sheikhupura and Sialkot.
- **Isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over

IV: WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-HOURS

➤ RAINFALL OUTLOOK:
