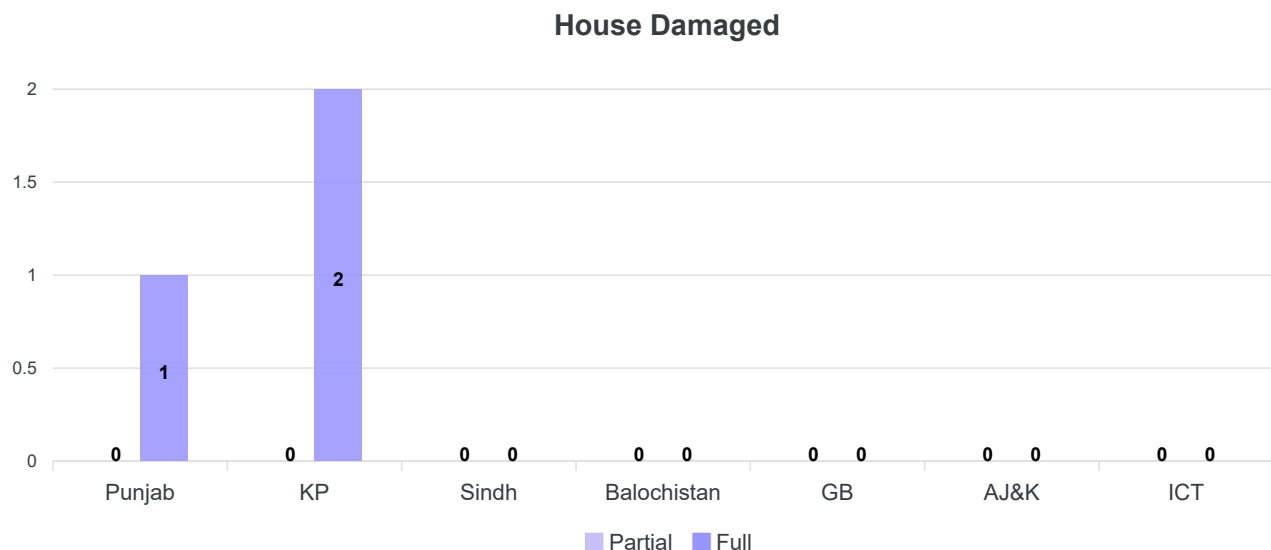

DAILY FLOOD BULLETIN

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- All the major rivers are flowing within their normal flows.
- Flows are expected to increase moderately in the nullahs of Rivers Ravi and Chenab.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northern parts of the country persists.
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over West Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating upper parts of the country up to 3000 feet.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Scattered to Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated heavy falls** is expected over upper catchments of all the major rivers, **Islamabad, Gilgit Baltistan and Kashmir**.
Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Abbottabad, Bajaur, Bannu, Batagram, Buner, Charsadda, Chitral, D. I. Khan, Haripur, Karak, Kohat, Kohistan, Kolai Palas Kurram, Lakki Marwat, Dir, Malakand, Mansehra, Mardan, Mohmand, Nowshera, Peshawar, Shangla, Swabi, Swat and Tor Ghar.
Punjab: Rawalpindi, Attock, Bhakkar, Chakwal, Gujranwala, Gujrat, Jhelum, Khushab, Lahore, Mandi Bahauddin, Mianwali, Dera Ghazi Khan, Narowal, Sargodha, Sheikhupura, Chiniot, Faisalabad, Jhang, Kasur and Sialkot.
- **Isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm is expected over Khyber Pakhtunkhwa:** Waziristan.
Punjab: Bahawalnagar, Layyah, Nankana Sahib and Okara.
Balochistan: Zhob, Barkhan, Musa Khel, Khuzdar and Sheerani.

IV: WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-HOURS

- **Scattered to Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated heavy falls** is expected over upper catchments of all the major rivers, **Islamabad, Gilgit Baltistan and Kashmir**.

2. WEEKLY WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR RIVER'S CATCHMENTS

(12th- July, 2026 to 18th- July, 2026)

➤ RAINFALL OUTLOOK:

Wet spell is likely to continue over the upper catchments of all major rivers, Islamabad, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Kashmir, Gilgit Baltistan and upper Punjab from 12th to 13th July and will reduce gradually afterwards.

➤ FLOOD SITUATION IN MAJOR RIVERS:

Flows are expected to slightly increase in all major rivers from 12th to 13th July.
