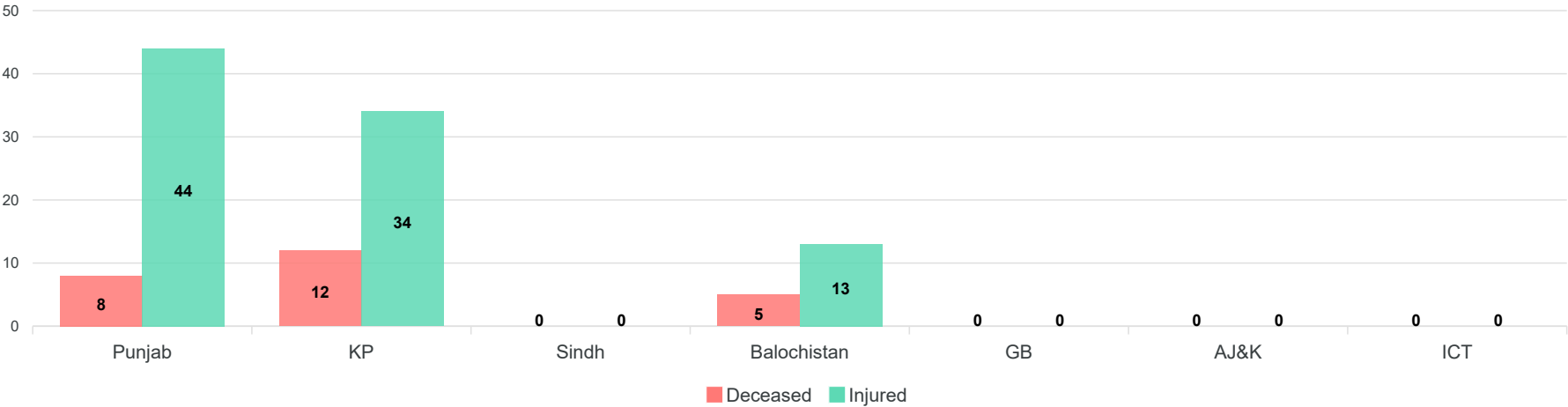

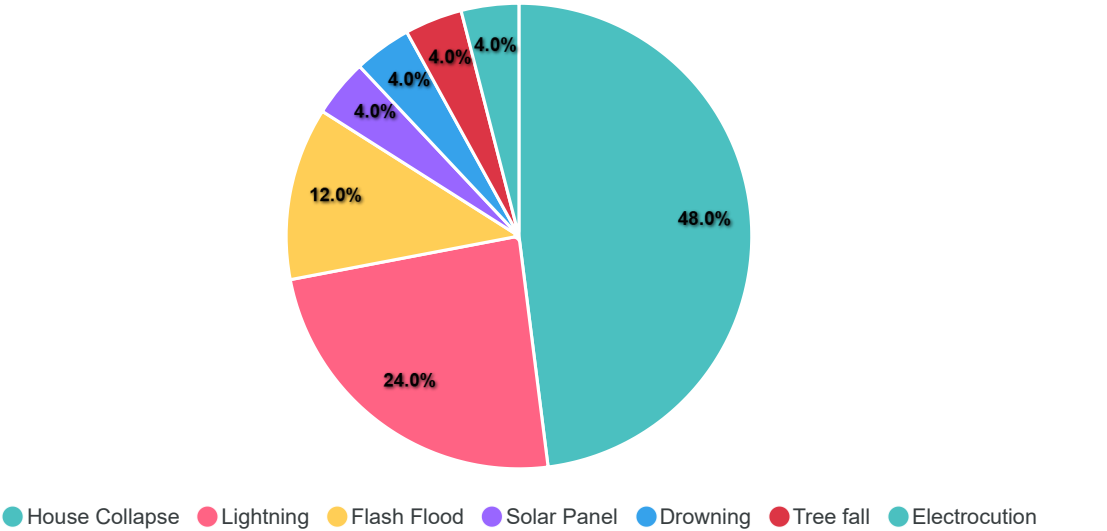

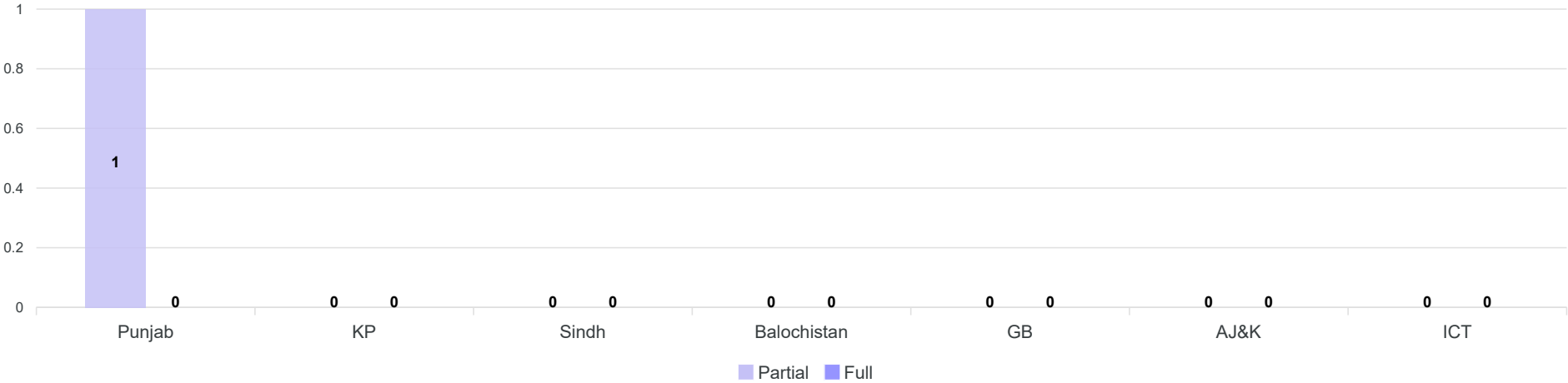

DAILY FLOOD BULLETIN

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- All the major rivers are flowing within their normal flows.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northern parts of the country persists.
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over Northeast Balochistan.
- Moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating upper parts of the country up to 3000 feet.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Scattered to Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with isolated heavy falls is expected over upper catchments of all the major rivers, **Islamabad, Gilgit Baltistan and Kashmir.**

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Bajaur, Bannu, Batagram, Buner, Charsadda, Chitral, Kohistan, Dir, Malakand, Mansehra, Mardan, Mohmand, Nowshera, Orakzai, Peshawar, Shangla, Waziristan, Swabi, Swat D. I. Khan, Hangu, Haripur, Karak, Khyber, Kohat, Kurram, Lakki Marwat and Tank.
