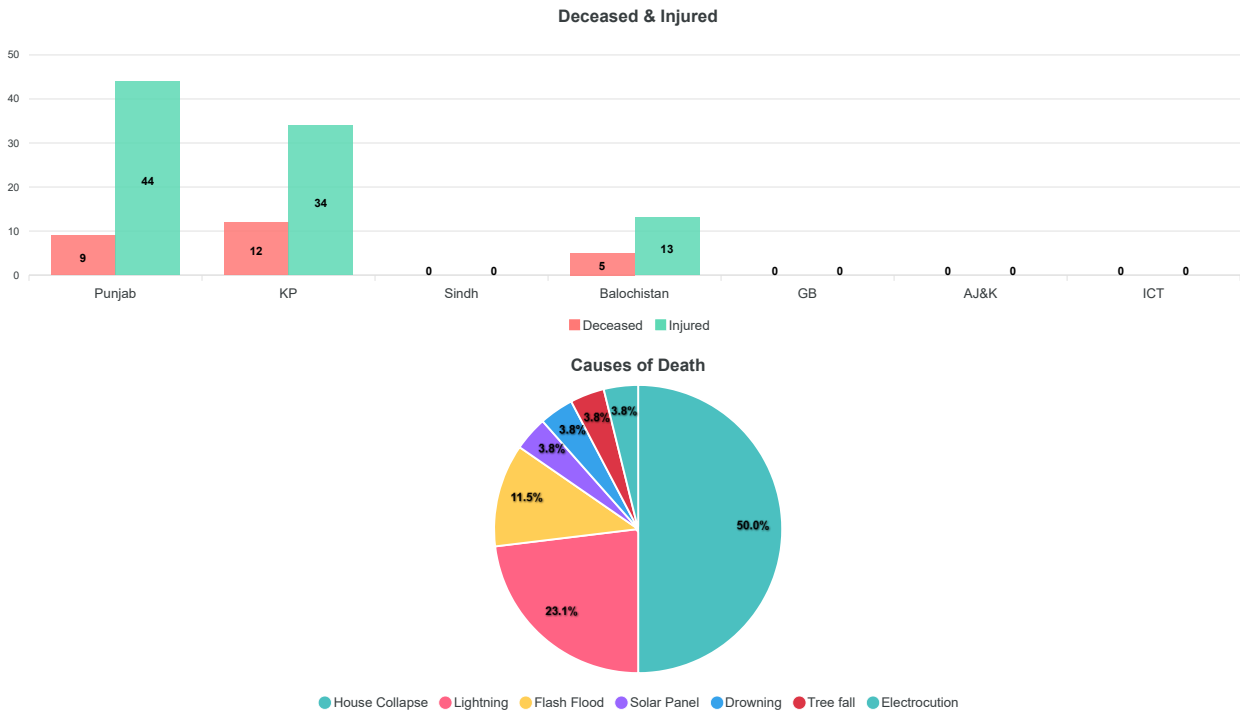

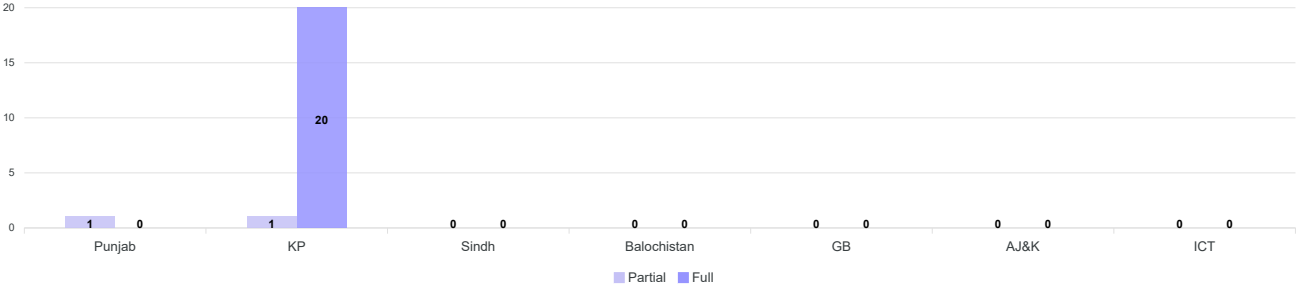

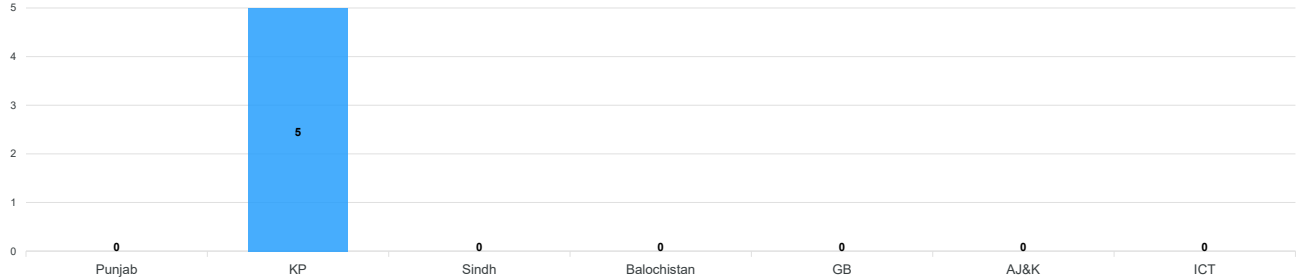

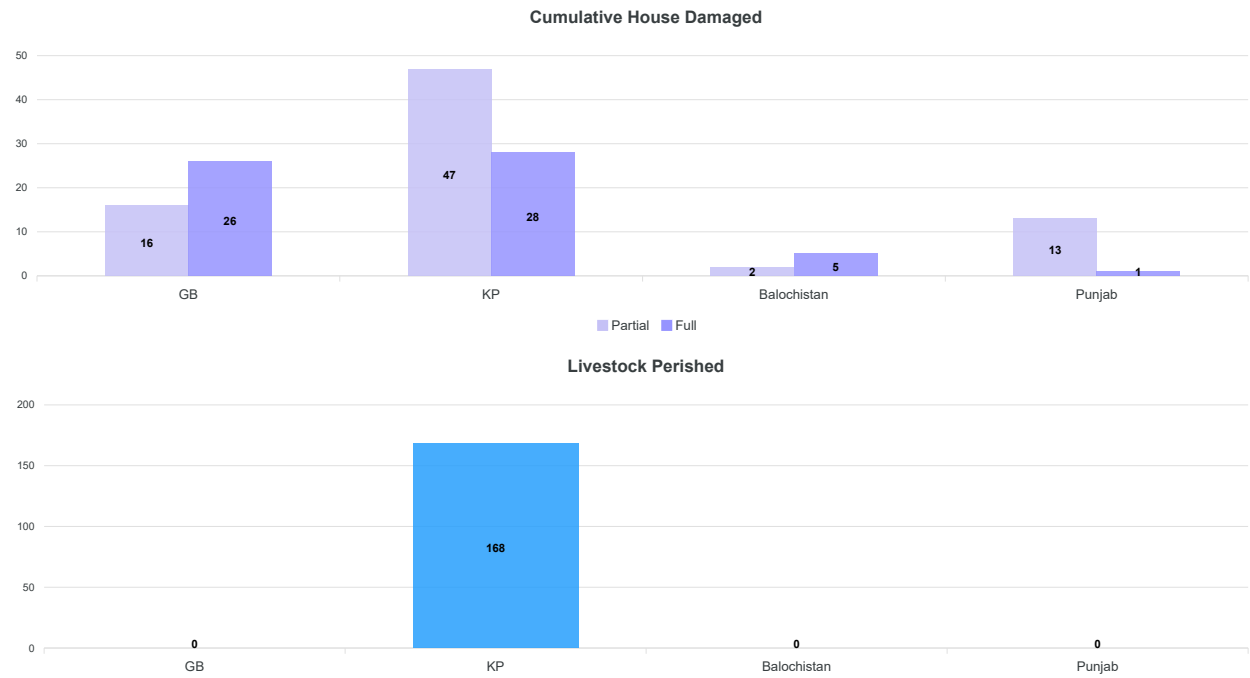

DAILY FLOOD BULLETIN

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- All the major rivers are flowing within their normal flows.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Weak trough of westerly wave over northern parts of the country has moved slightly eastwards.
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over Northeast Balochistan with central pressure 99 hPa.
- Moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating into the country up to 3000 feet.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over upper catchments of Indus and Jhelum rivers, Gilgit Baltistan and Kashmir.
Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Abbottabad, Bannu, Batagram, Buner, Chitral, DI. Khan, Hangu, Karak, Kohistan, Kurram, Mansehra, Orakzai, Shangla, Waziristan, Swat and Dir.
Punjab: Dera Ghazi Khan, Rajanpur and Layyah.
Sindh: Dadu, Naushahro Feroze and Qamber-Shahdad Kot.
Balochistan: Barkhan, Dera Bugti, Duki, Harnai, Jhal Magsi, Kachhi (Bolan), Khuzdar, Kohlu, Loralai, Musakhel, Nasirabad, Sherani, Sibi and Zhob.
- **Isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over
Punjab: Gujranwala, Sialkot, Narowal, Lahore, Bahawalnagar, Khanewal, Lodhran, Multan, Muzaffargarh, Pakpattan, Sahiwal and Vehari.
