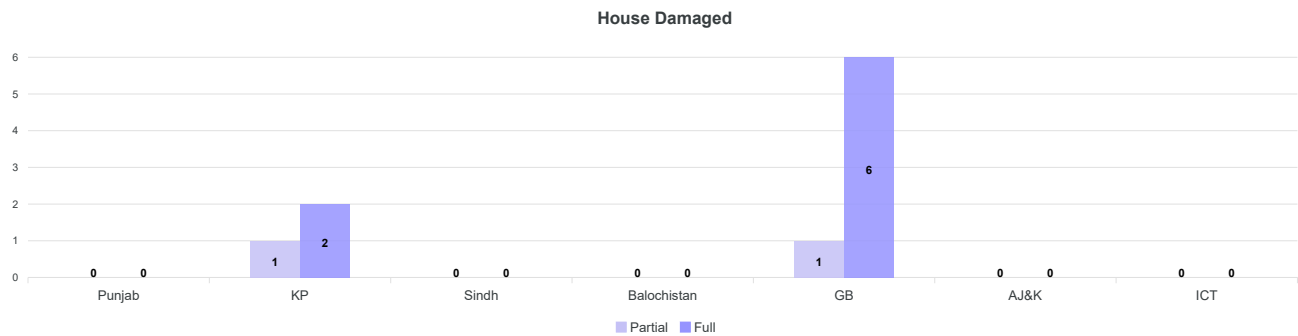

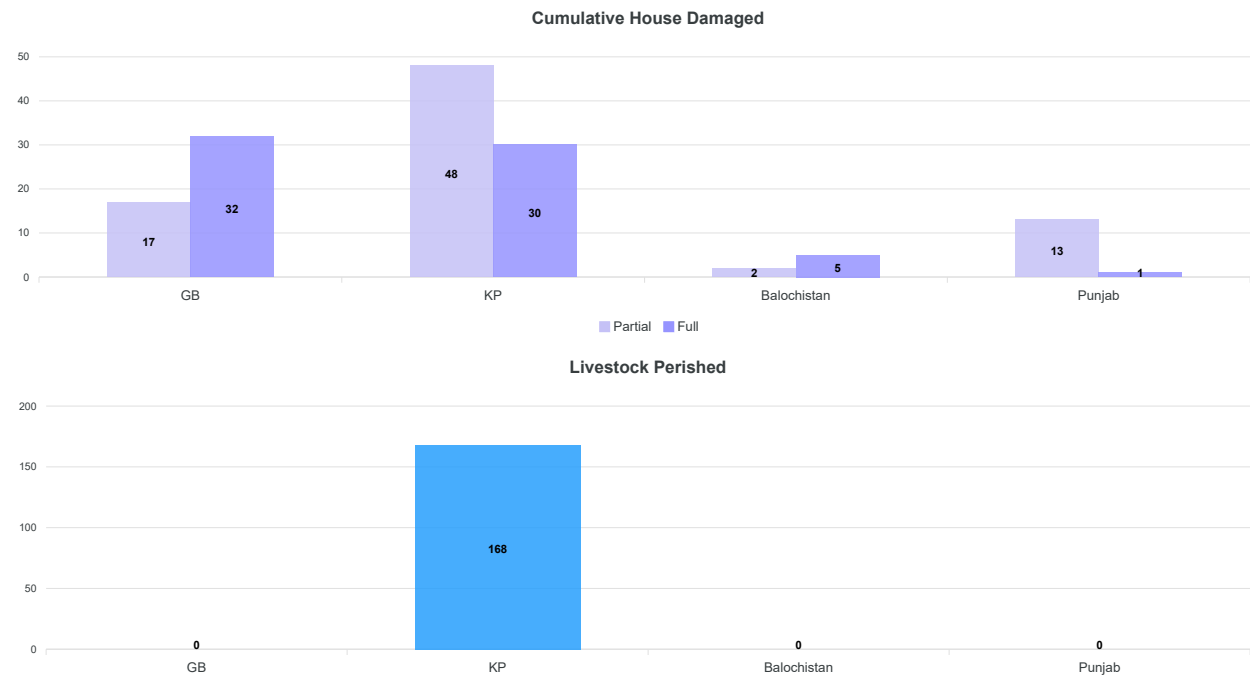

DAILY FLOOD BULLETIN

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- All the major rivers are flowing within their normal flows.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Shallow trough of westerly wave lies over northeastern parts of the country.
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over Northeast Balochistan.
- Moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating into central parts of the country up to 3000 feet.
- A low-pressure area has developed with central pressure 999 hPa over West Bengal (India).

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over upper catchments of all the major rivers, **Islamabad, Gilgit Baltistan and Kashmir.**
Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Abbottabad, Bajaur, Bannu, Batagram, Buner, Charsadda, Chitral, D. I. Khan, Hangu, Haripur, Karak, Khyber, Kohat, Kohistan, Kolai Palas, Kurram, Lakki Marwat, Dir, Malakand, Mansehra, Mardan, Mohmand, Waziristan, Nowshera, Orakzai, Peshawar, Shangla, Swabi, Swat and Tank.

Balochistan: Barkhan, Duki, Khuzdar, Musakhel, Sherani and Zhob.
Sindh: Dadu, Qamber-Shahdadkot and Larkana.
- **Isolated heavy falls** is also expected at Islamabad, Central Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Northwest Punjab, and DG Khan.

Wet spell is likely to continue with less intensity.
