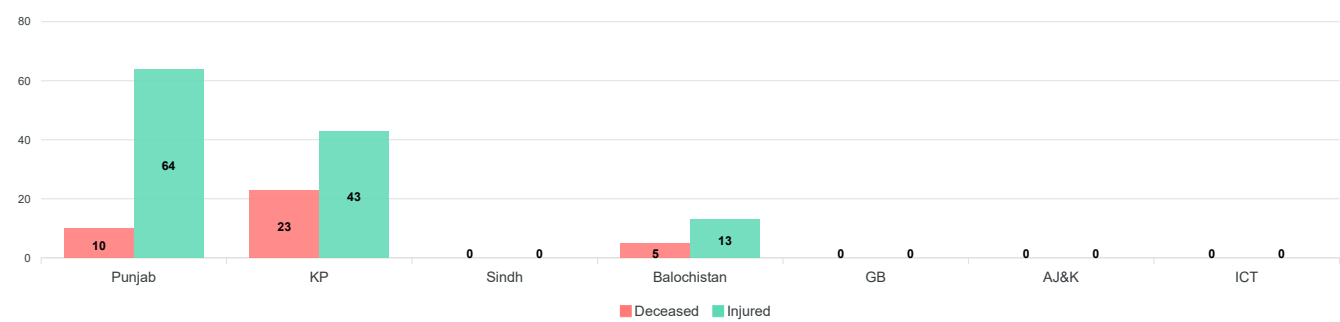

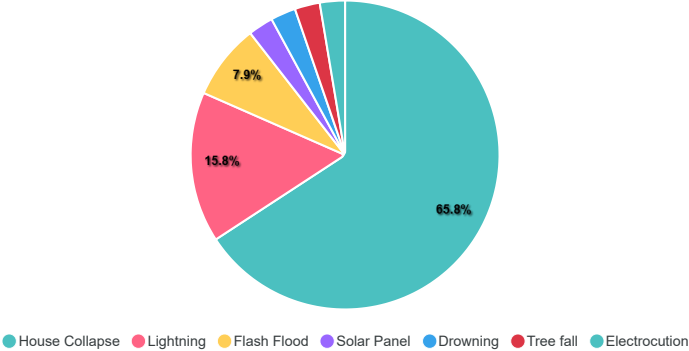

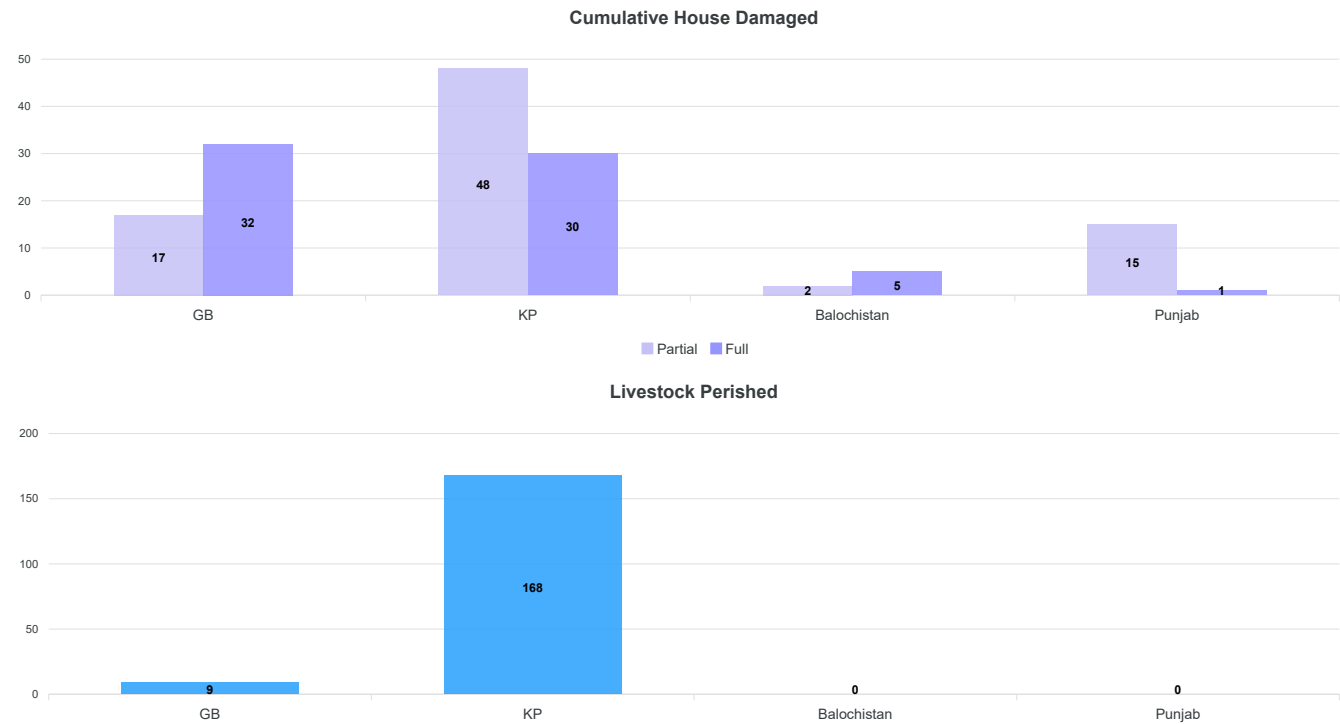

DAILY FLOOD BULLETIN

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- All the major rivers are flowing within their normal flows.

WATCH: On account of an approaching westerly wave coupled with a strong monsoon incursion, expected to commence from 20th July over the catchments of all major rivers, river flows are likely to increase **significantly**. Flows in the nullahs associated with the Rivers Ravi and Chenab are also expected to rise. Flash flooding is likely in the hill torrents of Dera Ghazi Khan, as well as in the streams of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and northern Balochistan.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over Northwest of Iran today lies over Northern parts of Iran.
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over Northwest Balochistan.
- Weak moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating into the central parts of the country up to 3000 feet.
- Yesterday's low-pressure area over West Bengal (India) today lies over southeast Jharkhand (India), with a central pressure of 999 hPa. It is expected to move westwards and reach central Jharkhand during the next 24 hours.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over upper catchments of rivers Sutlej, Ravi and Chenab.
- Mainly hot and humid weather is expected in most parts of the country.

IV: WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-HOURS

No significant change.

2. WEEKLY SIGNIFICANT WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR RIVER'S CATCHMENTS

(18th- July, 2026 to 24th- July, 2026)

➤ **RAINFALL OUTLOOK:**

WATCH: Widespread thunderstorm/rain with isolated heavy to very heavy falls/torrential rain is expected over upper catchments of all the major rivers along with Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Gilgit Baltistan, Kashmir and upper Punjab from 20th July 2026.

➤ **FLOOD SITUATION IN MAJOR RIVERS:**

WATCH: River flows are expected to increase significantly in all the major rivers due to the expected precipitation from 20th July 2026 onward. However, flows in the Ravi and Sutlej rivers will also depend on releases from upstream Indian reservoirs.
