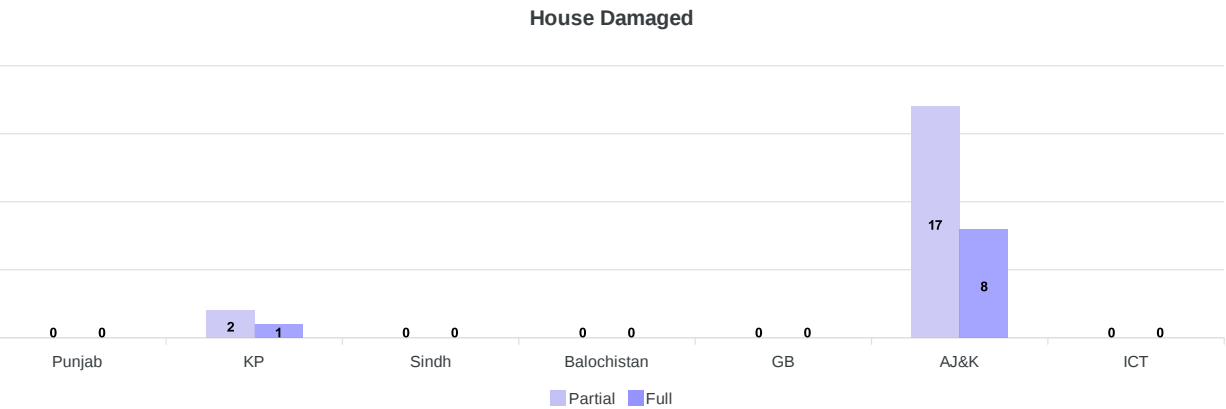

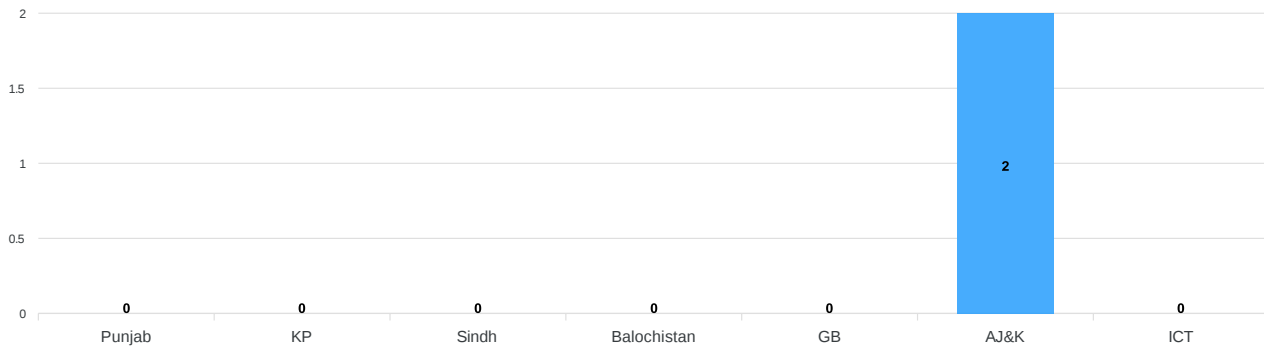

- Mansehra:** Following the flash flood in Darmina Village, the District Administration executed a rapid, multi-agency response by immediately deploying Rescue 1122, the Kaghan Development Authority (KDA), Revenue Staff, and the VC Secretary to mitigate risks from rising waters trapped behind blocked concrete culverts. The operation focused heavily on preemptive safety, fully activating the Early Warning System and utilizing local mosque loudspeakers to issue urgent evacuation orders to downstream residents, successfully neutralizing potential threats to human life through swift inter-departmental coordination.
- Khyber:** Rescue 1122 and local agencies successfully saved 14 individuals after flash floods swept away two vehicles in Landikotal, including one occupant near Zakria Mosque and 13 passengers at Nikki Khel. While a coordinated response force remains fully deployed on-site, extreme water levels at the Nadir Khan Kalay causeway temporarily blocked official access to the area, and teams continue active search operations for one missing child.

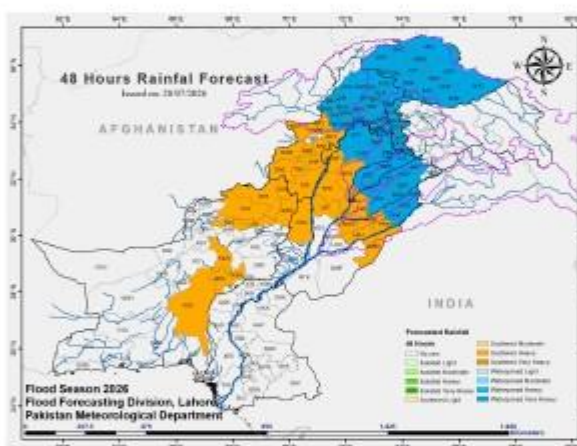
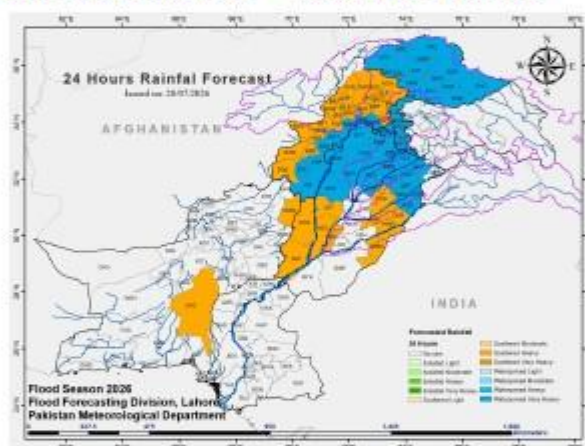

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- River Chenab at Khanki and Qadirabad are in **Low flood level**. All other major rivers are in their normal flow.

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over Afghanistan today lies over northern parts of the country.
- Monsoon trough extends from northeastern parts of the country towards northern parts of India along the foot hills of Himalayas.
- Yesterday's low-pressure area over northwest Jharkhand (India) today lies at south Utter Pradesh (India).
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over Northwest Balochistan.
- Moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating into the central parts and upper parts of the country up to 5000 feet.
