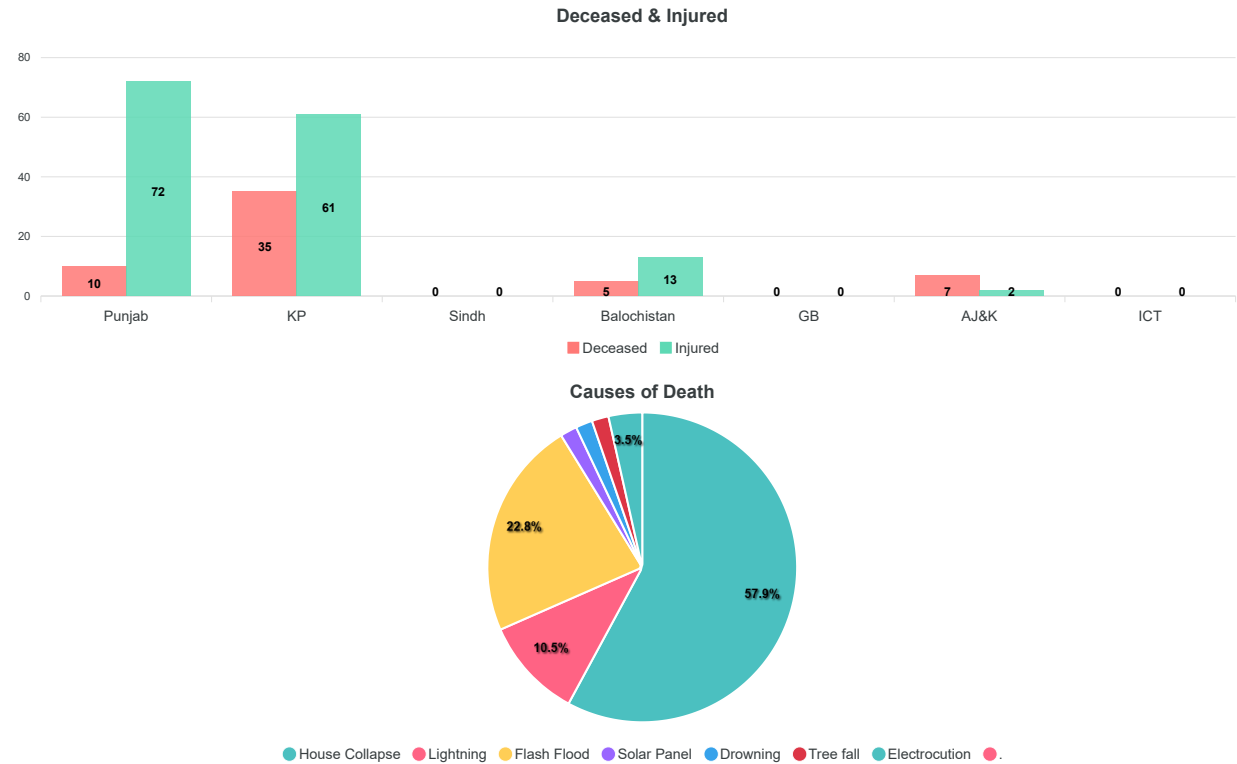

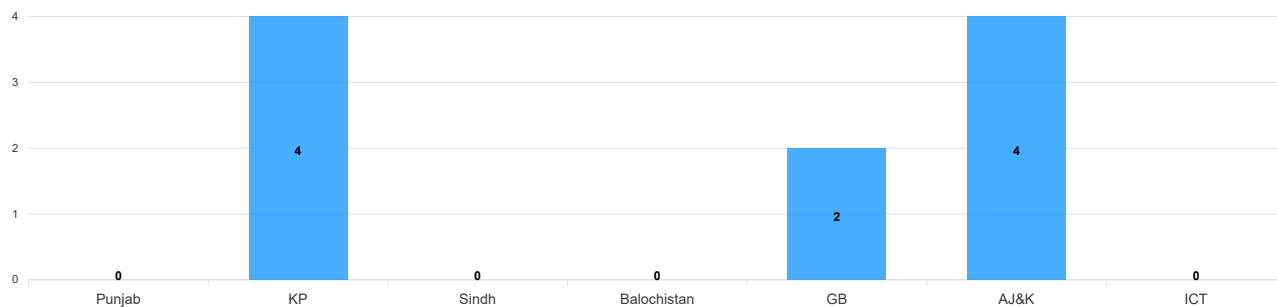

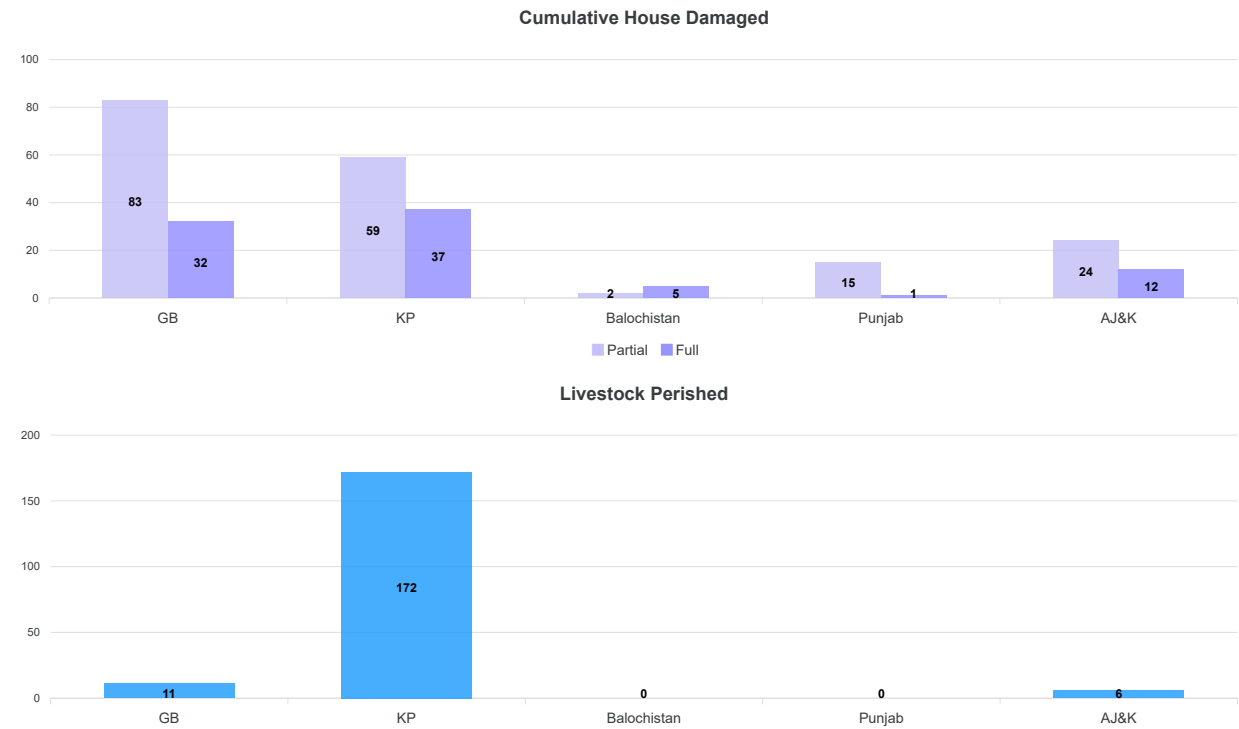

GB, Astore: District Administration/DDMA Astore, in coordination with local responders, proactively evacuated **330 individuals** to safer locations in **Louse Village, District Astore**, prior to the onset of the flash flood.

KP, Mansehra: Jheel Saif UI Malook Road at Naran was blocked, with one section washed away due to a flash flood, leaving approximately **500 tourist jeeps** stranded on the upper lake side of the road. In response, **KDA machinery** and **Rescue 1122** teams launched a coordinated evacuation operation, safely rescuing and relocating approximately **2,500 tourists** to secure locations.

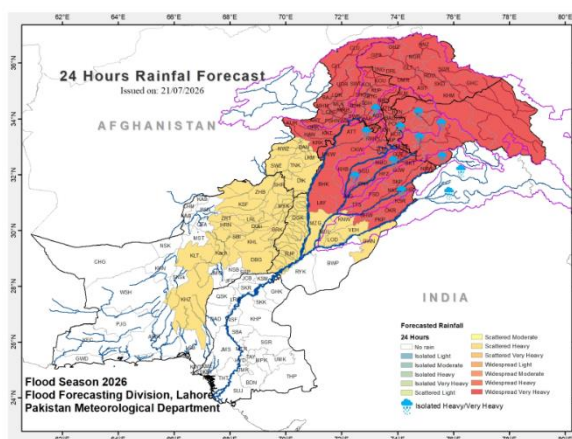

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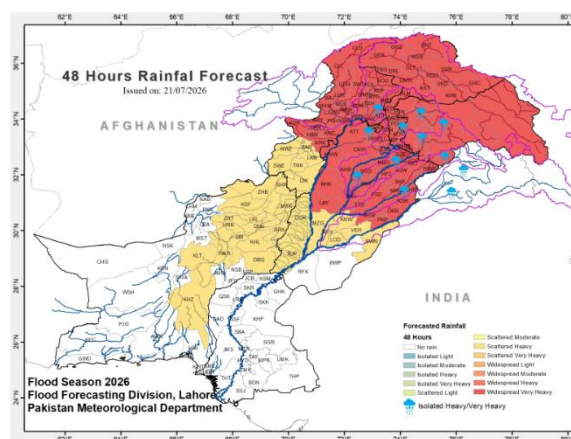

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- River Indus at Kalabagh, River Chenab at Khanki are in **Low flood level**. All other major rivers are in their normal flow.
- WARNING:** In the presence of a westerly weather system coupled with strong monsoon incursions from the Arabian Sea and the Bay of Bengal, **Fairly widespread to widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy to very heavy falls** is expected over the catchments of all major rivers, including upper Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Consequently, river flows are likely to increase significantly upto 24th July.
 - High Flood level** is expected in River Chenab at Marala, Jhelum at upstream Mangla and associated nullahs of Jhelum, Chenab (Dora, Dotta, Dowara, Bhimber, Halsi, Aik and Palkhu) and Ravi (Bein, Bassanter, Deg and Sakki).
 - High flows** are also expected in river Kabul and its associated tributaries.
 - Flash flooding** is expected in the hill torrents of **DG Khan**, the streams of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and northern Balochistan.
 - Urban Flooding** is also expected in Rawalpindi, Jhelum, Gujranwala, Sargodha, Mianwali, Mandi Bahauddin, Khushab, Sialkot, Gujrat, Narowal, Lahore, Okara, Sahiwal and Faisalabad.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northern parts of the country persists.
- Monsoon trough extends from northeastern parts of the country passes through northern parts of India along the foot hills of Himalaya.
- Yesterday's low-pressure area over south Utter Pradesh (India) has moved westwards and today lies as upper air cyclonic circulation at southwest Utter Pradesh (India).
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over Northwest Balochistan.
- Moist currents from Arabian sea and Bay of Bengal are penetrating into the central and upper parts of the country up to 5000 feet.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

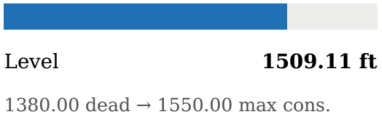
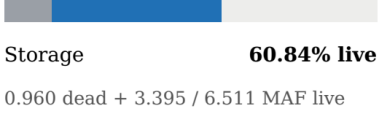
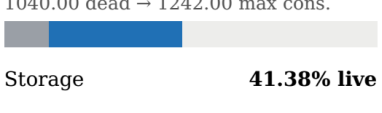
RAINFALL OUTLOOK:

- **WARNING:** In the presence of a westerly weather system coupled with strong monsoon incursions from the Arabian Sea and the Bay of Bengal, **Fairly widespread to widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy to very heavy falls** is expected over the catchments of all major rivers, including **Islamabad, Kashmir, Gilgit Baltistan, northeast Balochistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, upper and central Punjab**. Consequently, river flows are likely to increase significantly upto **24th July**.

FLOOD SITUATION IN MAJOR RIVERS:

- **High Flood level** is expected in River Chenab at Marala, Jhelum at upstream Mangla and associated nullahs of Jhelum, Chenab (Dora, Dotta, Dowara, Bhimber, Halsi, Aik and Palkhu) and Ravi (Bein, Bassanter, Deg and Sakki).
- **High flows** are also expected in river Kabul and its associated tributaries.
- **Flash flooding** is expected in the hill torrents of DG Khan, the streams of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and northern Balochistan.
- **Urban Flooding** is also expected in Rawalpindi, Jhelum, Gujranwala, Sargodha, Mianwali, Mandi Bahauddin, Khushab, Sialkot, Gujrat, Narowal, Lahore, Okara, Sahiwal and Faisalabad.
