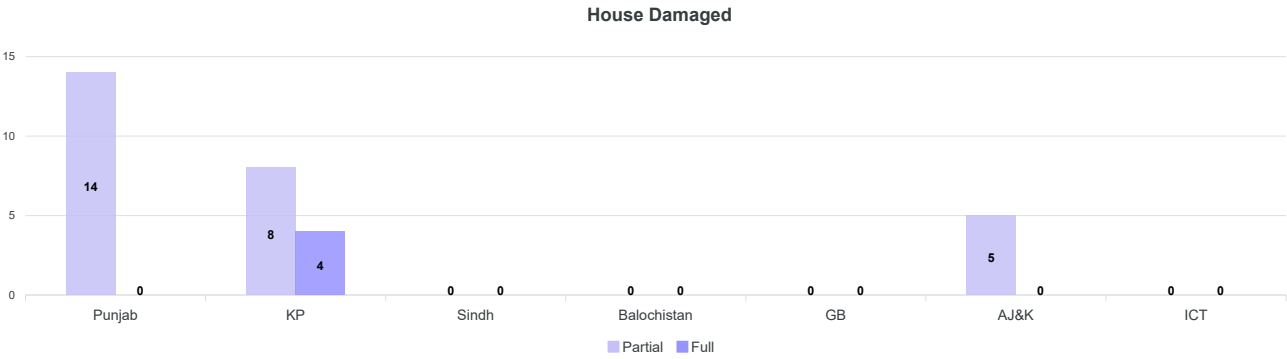

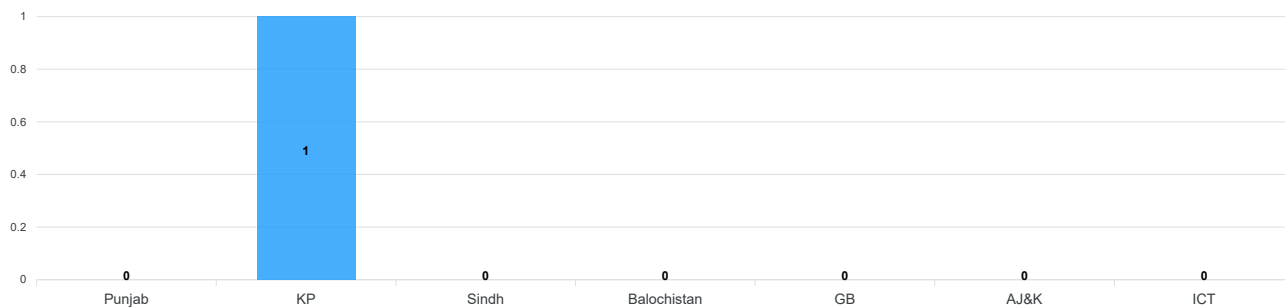

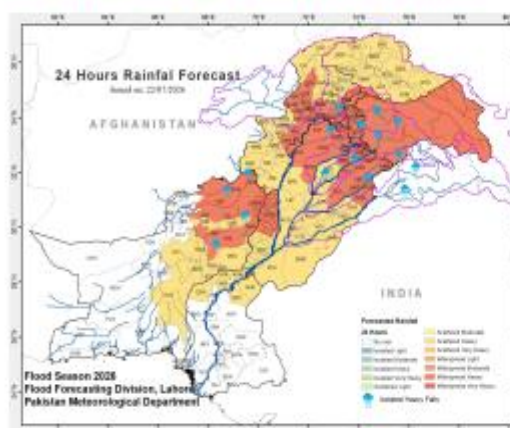

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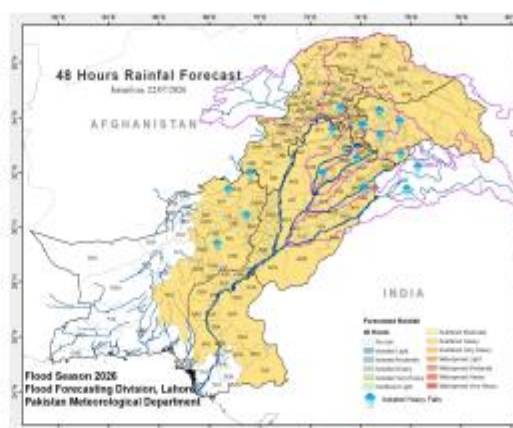

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

1.1: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- River Chenab at Khanki is in **Medium flood level**. River Indus at Kalabagh and Chashma, river Kabul at Nowshera, river Chenab at Marala and Qadirabad are in **Low flood level**. All other major rivers are in their normal flow.
- **WARNING:** In the presence of a westerly weather system coupled with strong monsoon incursions from the Bay of Bengal, **Scattered to widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy falls** is expected over the catchments of all major rivers, including upper Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Consequently, river flows are likely to increase significantly upto 24th July.
 - **Medium Flood level** is expected in River Chenab at Marala, Khanki & Qadirabad, Jhelum at upstream Mangla and associated nullahs of Jhelum, Chenab (Dora, Dotta, Dowara, Bhimber, Halsi, Aik and Palkhu) and Ravi (Bein, Bassanter, Deg and Sakki).
 - **Low to medium flows** are also expected in river Kabul and its associated tributaries.
 - **Flash flooding** is expected in the hill torrents of **DG Khan**, the streams of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and northern Balochistan.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northern parts of the country persists.
- Monsoon trough extends from central parts of the country passes through northern parts of India along the foot hills of Himalaya.
- Yesterday's low-pressure area at southwest Uttar Pradesh (India) today lies over southeast Rajasthan (India).
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over northwest Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Bay of Bengal are penetrating into the upper parts of the country up to 7,000 feet.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Widespread** rain-wind/thunderstorm with **isolated heavy falls** is expected over upper catchments of all major rivers, **Islamabad, Kashmir,**
- **Khyber Pakhtunkhwa:** Abbottabad, Bajaur, Buner, Charsadda, Haripur, Karak, Kohat, Dir, Malakand, Mansehra, Mardan, Mohmand, Nowshera, Peshawar and Swabi.

RAINFALL OUTLOOK:

- **WARNING:** In the presence of a westerly weather system coupled with strong monsoon incursions from the Bay of Bengal, **Scattered to widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy falls** is expected over the catchments of all major rivers, including **Islamabad, Kashmir, Gilgit Baltistan, northeast Balochistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, upper and central Punjab**. Consequently, river flows are likely to increase significantly upto **24th July**.
- **Watch:** A Low-pressure area currently lies over southeast Rajasthan (India) and is expected to move southwestwards towards southeastern parts of Sindh during 3 to 4 days.

FLOOD SITUATION IN MAJOR RIVERS:

- **Medium Flood level** is expected in River Chenab at Marala, Jhelum at upstream Mangla and associated nullahs of Jhelum, Chenab (Dora, Dotta, Dowara, Bhimber, Halsi, Aik and Palkhu) and Ravi (Bein, Bassanter, Deg and Sakki).
- **Low to medium flows** are also expected in river Kabul and its associated tributaries.
