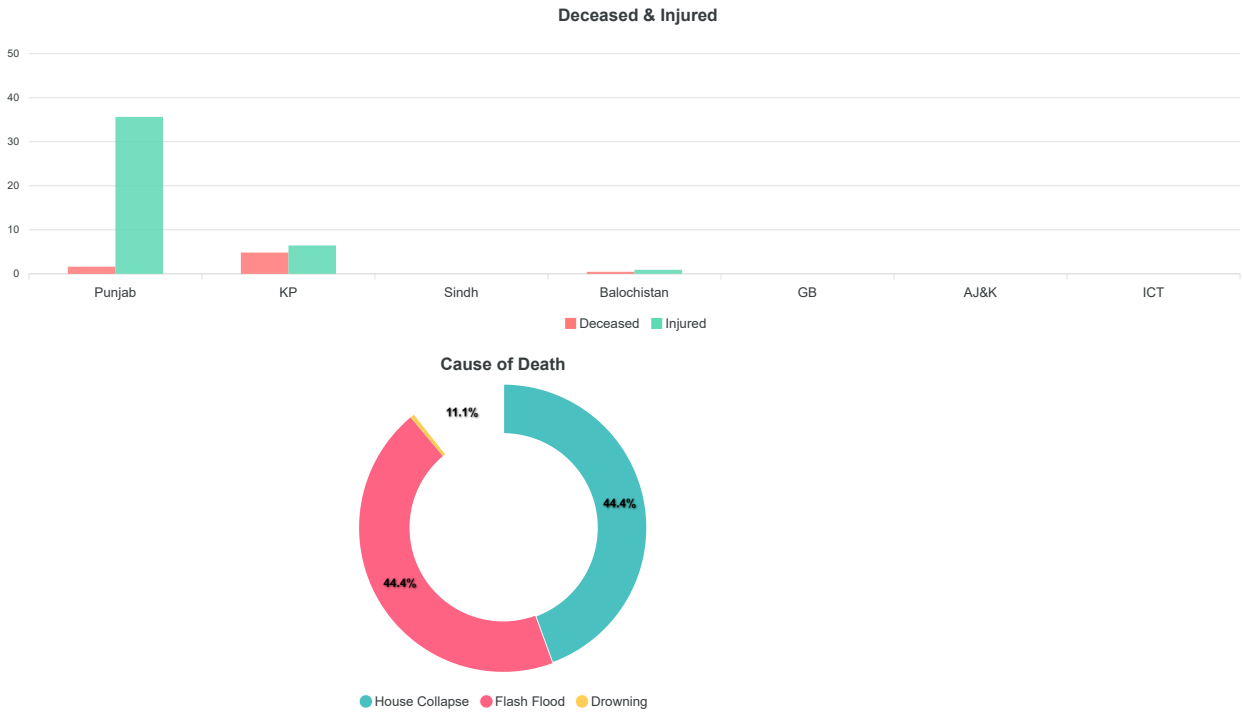

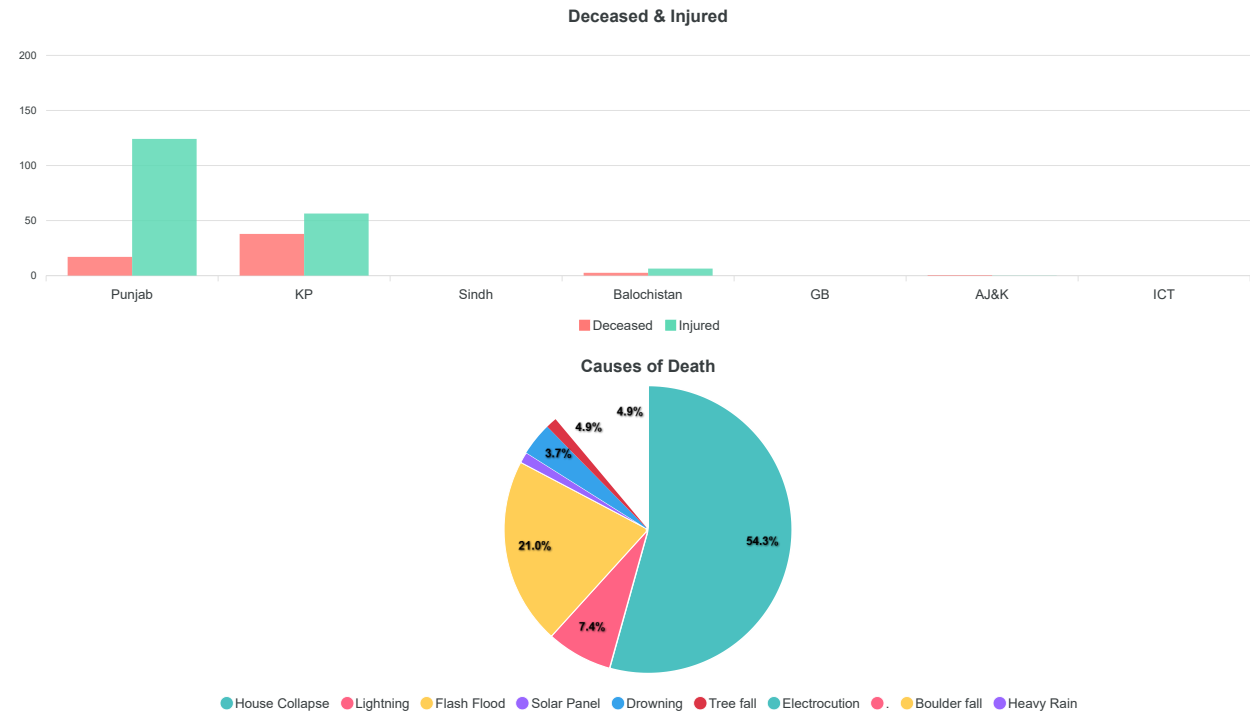

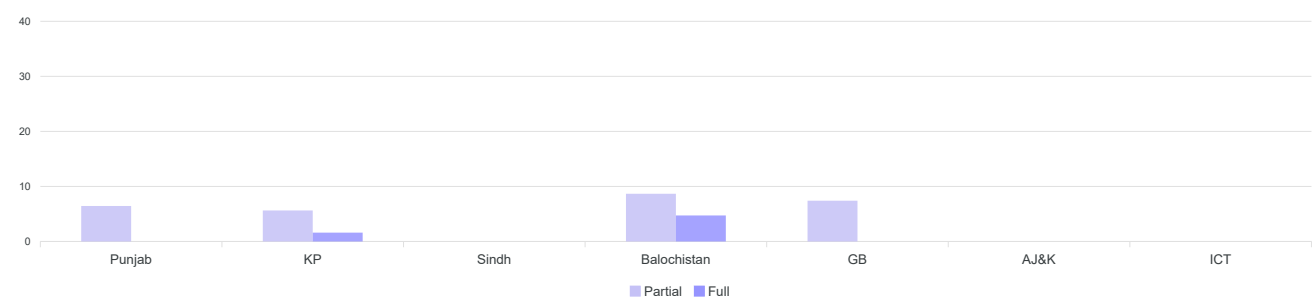
Cumulative Casualties and Injuries - (From 26 June 2026 to 23 July 2026)



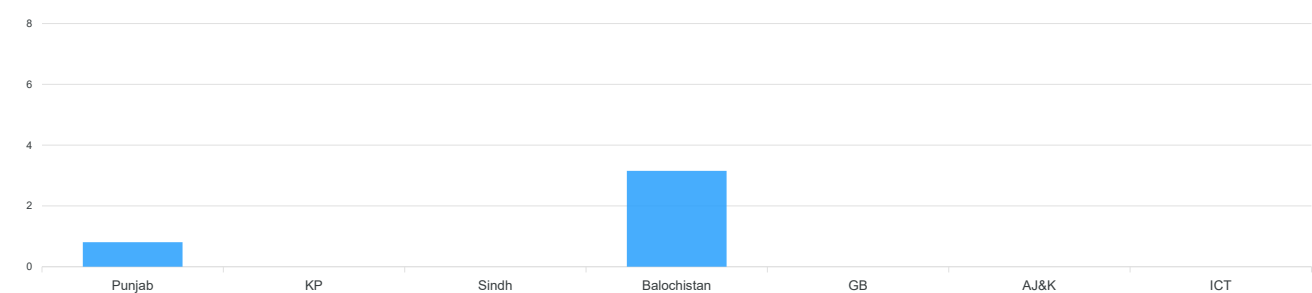

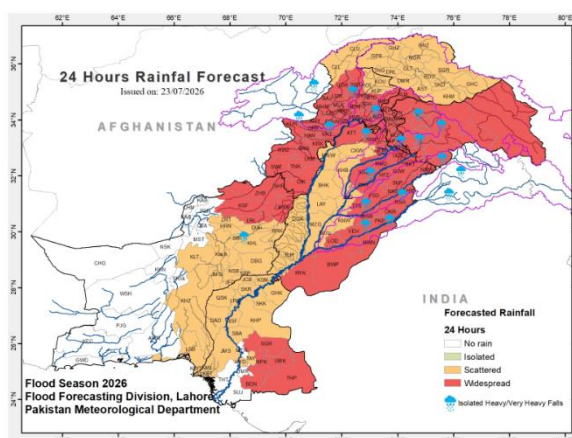

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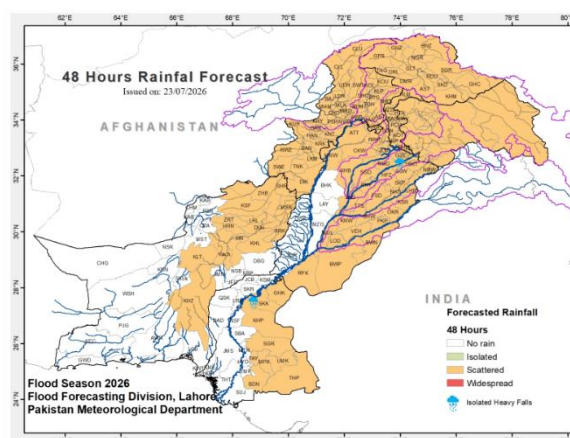

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- **River Chenab** at Khanki and Qadirabad is in **High flood level**. **River Chenab** at Marala is in **Medium flood level**. **River Indus** at Tarbela and Chashma, **river Kabul** at Nowshera, **river Chenab** at Chiniot Bridge and **river Ravi** at Balloki are in **Low flood level**. All other major rivers are flowing in their normal flows at other gauging stations.
- **WARNING:** In the presence of a westerly weather system coupled with strong monsoon deflected currents from the Bay of Bengal, **Scattered to widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy to very heavy falls** is expected over the catchments of all major rivers, including upper Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Consequently, river flows are likely to increase significantly upto 25th July.
 - **Medium to High flows** are also expected in **river Kabul** and its associated tributaries.
 - **Warsak and Munda Dam** in **Kabul river** basin is expected to be in **low to medium** level flood within next 24-hours.
 - Currently **High to medium level flows** in **river Chenab** is expected to decrease in next 24-hours.

- **Flash flooding** is expected in the hill torrents of **DG Khan**, the streams of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and northern Balochistan.
- **Urban Flooding** is also expected in **Rawalpindi, Lahore, Gujranwala, Mandi Bahauddin, Sialkot, Narowal, Sargodha, Faisalabad, Okara and Sahiwal.**

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northern parts of the country persists.
- Monsoon trough extends from central parts of the country passes through northern parts of India along the foot hills of Himalaya.
- Yesterday's low-pressure area over southeast Rajasthan (India) today lies over south Rajasthan and it is expected to move south westwards over northeast Gujarat (India) within next 24-hours.
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over Northwest Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Bay of Bengal are penetrating into the upper parts of the country up to 7,000 feet.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Widespread** rain-wind/thunderstorm with **isolated heavy** to **very heavy falls** is expected over upper catchments of all major rivers, **Islamabad, Kashmir, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa:** Abbottabad, Bajaur, Bannu, Batagram, Buner, Charsadda, DI Khan, Hangu, Haripur, Karak, Khyber, Kohat, Kurram, Lakki Marwat, Mansehra, Mardan, Mohmand, Waziristan, Nowshera, Orakzai, Peshawar, Shangla, Swabi, Swat, Tank and Dir.
Punjab: Rawalpindi, Attock, Bahawalnagar, Bahawalpur, Chiniot, Faisalabad, Gujranwala, Gujrat, Hafizabad, Jhelum, Kasur, Lahore, Lodhran, Mandi Bahauddin, Nankana Sahib, Narowal, Okara, Pakpattan, Rahim Yar Khan, Sahiwal, Sargodha, Sheikhupura, Sialkot, Toba Tek Singh and Vehari.

2. WEEKLY WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR RIVER'S CATCHMENTS

(24th - July, 2026 to 30th- July, 2026)

RAINFALL OUTLOOK:

- **WARNING:** In the presence of a westerly weather system coupled with strong monsoon incursions from the Bay of Bengal, **Scattered to widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy to very heavy falls** is expected over the catchments of all major rivers, including Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Consequently, river flows are likely to increase significantly up to 25th July.
- **Watch:** Yesterday's low-pressure area over southeast Rajasthan (India) today lies over south Rajasthan and it is expected to move south westwards over northeast Gujarat (India) within next 24-hours. It is expected to reach southeastern parts of Sindh during next 2 to 3 days.

FLOOD SITUATION IN MAJOR RIVERS:

- **WARNING:**
- **Medium to High flows** are also expected in **river Kabul** and its associated tributaries.
 - **Warsak and Munda Dam** in **Kabul river** basin is expected to be in **low to medium** level flood within next 24-hours.
 - Currently **High to medium level flows** in **river Chenab** is expected to decrease in next 24-hours.
 - **Flash flooding** is expected in the hill torrents of **DG Khan**, the streams of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and northern Balochistan.
 - **Urban Flooding** is also expected in **Rawalpindi, Gujranwala, Mandi Bahauddin, Sialkot, Narowal and Lahore.**
