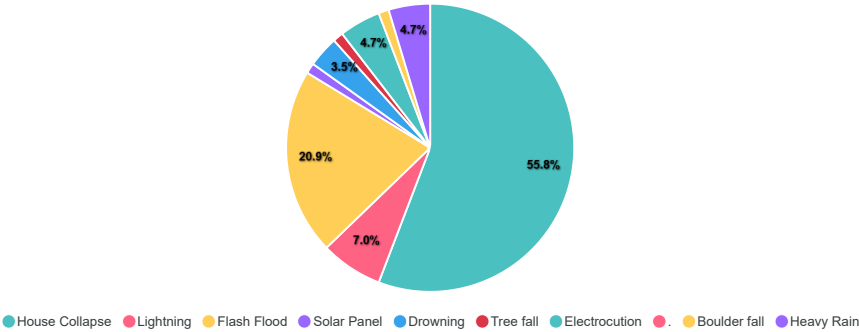

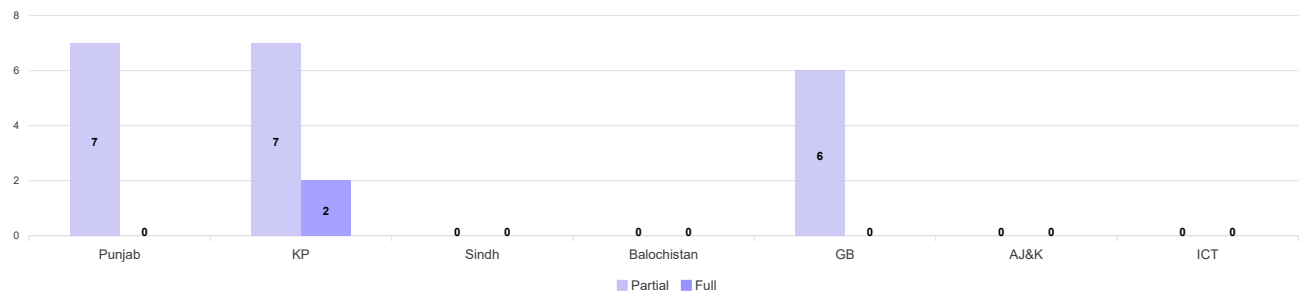

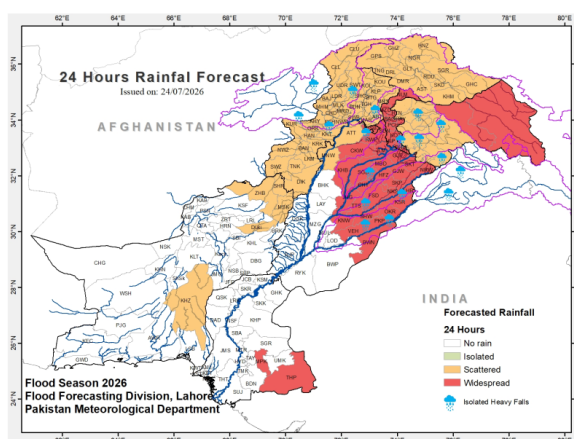

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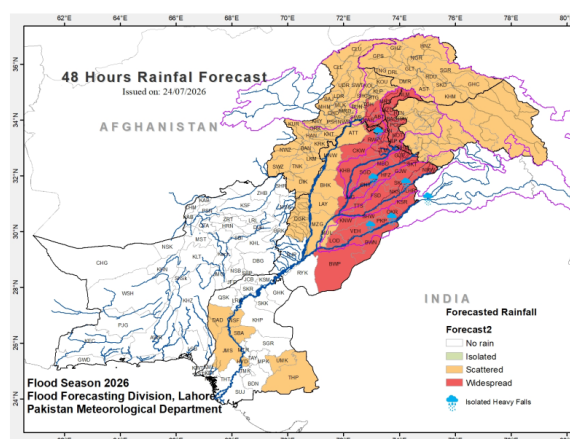

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- **River Chenab** at Chiniot Bridge is in **High flood level**. River Chenab at Marala, Khanki and Qadirabad is in **Medium flood level**. **River Indus** at Tarbela, Kalabagh, Chashma, Taunsa **river Kabul** at Nowshera and **river Ravi** at Balloki are in **Low flood level**. All other gauging points are in their normal state.

• **WARNING:**

- **Medium to High level flows** in **river Chenab** at Marala, Khanki and Qadirabad are expected during next 24-hours.
- **Flash flooding** is expected in the hill torrents of **DG Khan**, the streams of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and northern Balochistan.
- **Urban Flooding** is also expected in **Gujranwala, Mandi Bahauddin, Sialkot, Narowal, Faisalabad, Hafizabad and Lahore**.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northern parts of the country still persists.
- Monsoon trough extends from central parts of the country passes through northern parts of India along the foot hills of Himalaya.

Sindh: Mirpur Khas and Tharparkar.
- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over upper catchments of all other major rivers, **Gilgit-Baltistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa:** Abbottabad, Bajaur, Bannu, Batagram, Buner, Charsadda, Chitral, DI Khan, Hangu, Haripur, Karak, Khyber, Kohat, Kohistan, Kurram, Lakki Marwat, Mansehra, Mardan, Mohmand, Nowshera, Orakzai, Peshawar, Shangla, Waziristan, Swabi, Swat and Dir.

IV: WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-HOURS
