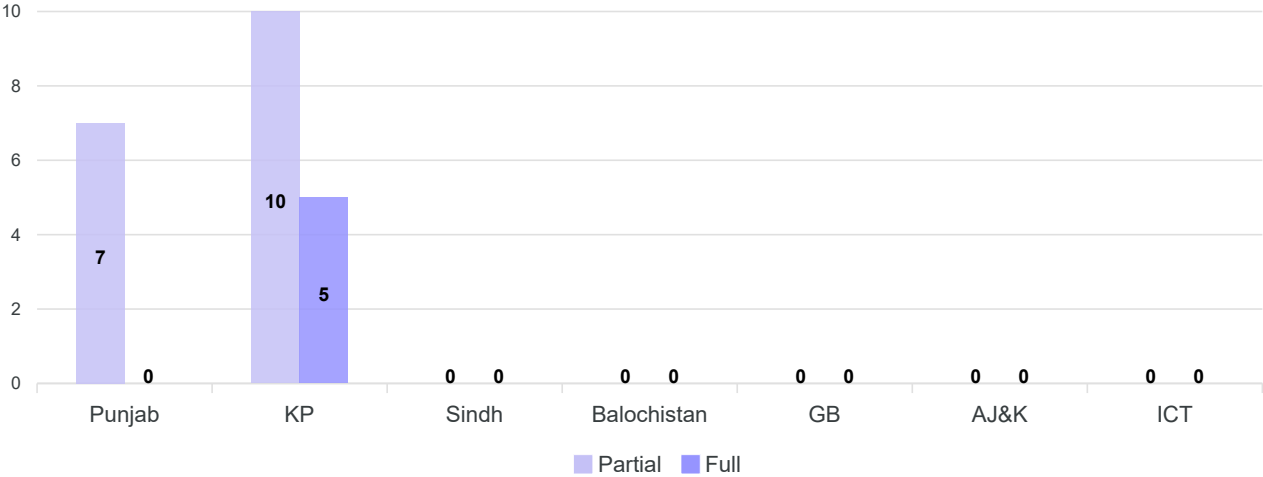

 3. Lodar in Tehsil Shahpur.

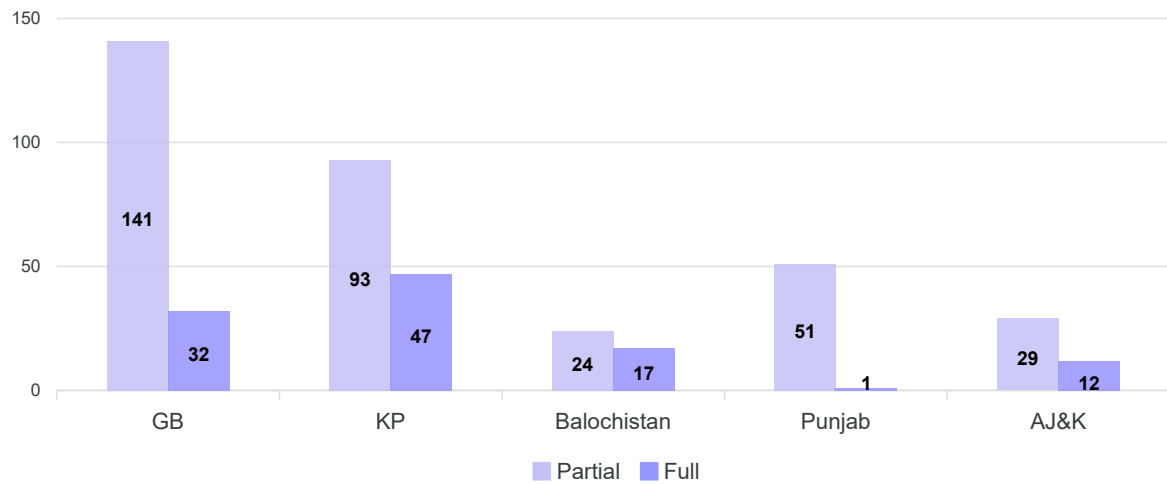

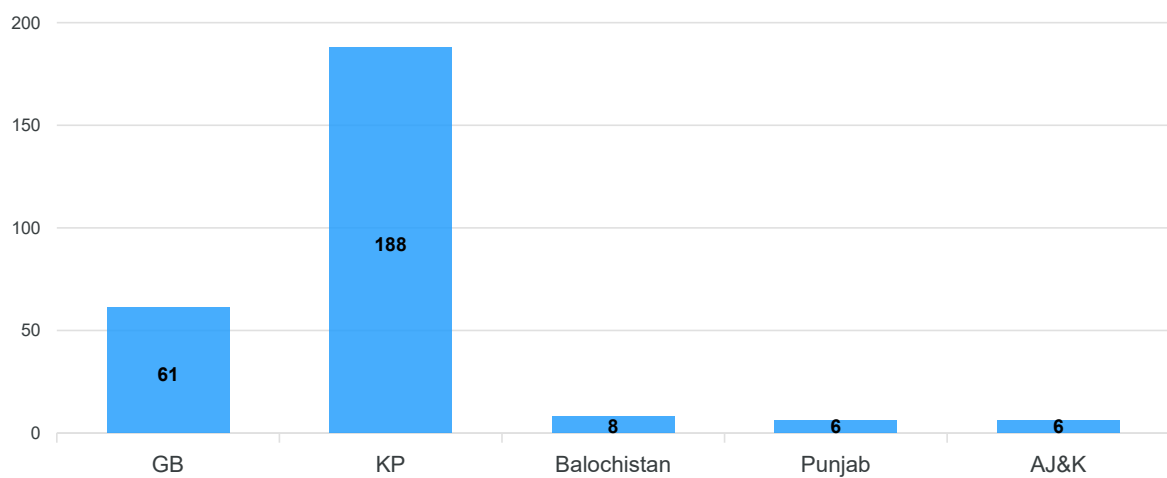

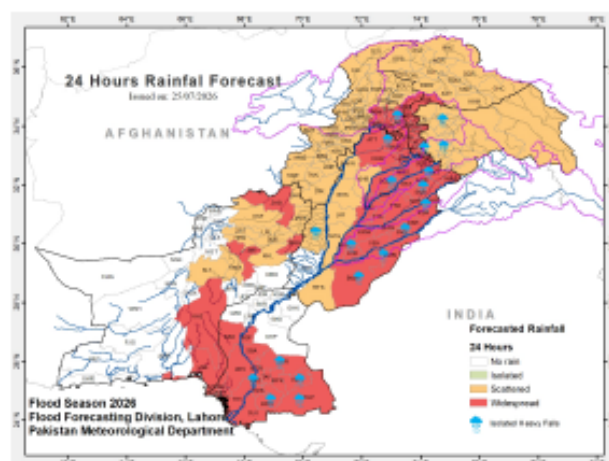

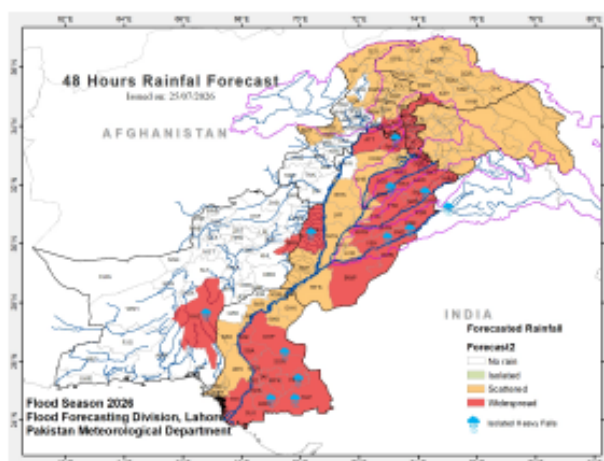

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- **River Chenab** at Khaniki, Qadirabad and Chiniot Bridge is in **Medium flood level**. **River Indus** at Kalabagh, Chashma, Taunsa, **river Kabul** at Nowshera, **river Chenab** at Marala and Trimmu and **river Ravi** at Balloki and Sidhnai are in **Low flood level**. All major rivers at other gauging stations are flowing in their normal flows.
- **Southeastern parts of Sindh** are likely to experience **Pluvial flooding** during next 24 to 36 hours.
- **Flash flooding** is expected in the hill torrents of **DG Khan** and **northeastern Balochistan**.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over north of Iran, today lies over northwest parts of the country.
- Yesterday's low-pressure area over southwest Rajasthan (India) and adjoining Gujarat remained stationary.
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over Northwest Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Arabian sea and Bay of Bengal are penetrating into the country up to 7,000 feet.
- A low pressure area with central pressure 999 hPa has developed over south of West Bengal and adjoining Orissa (India).

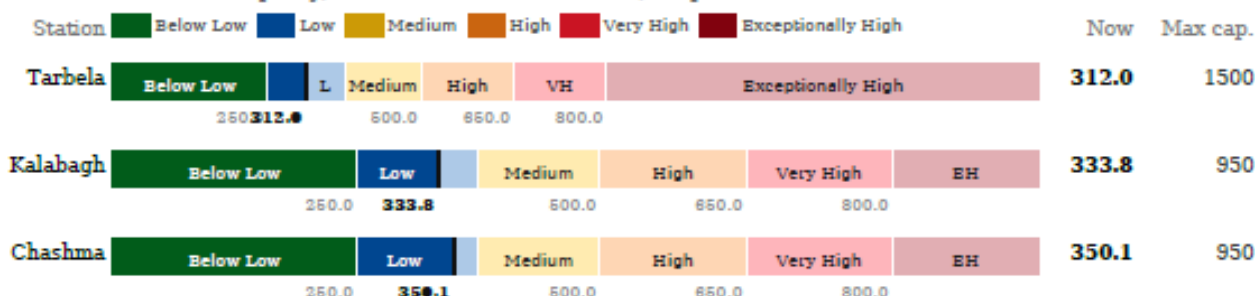

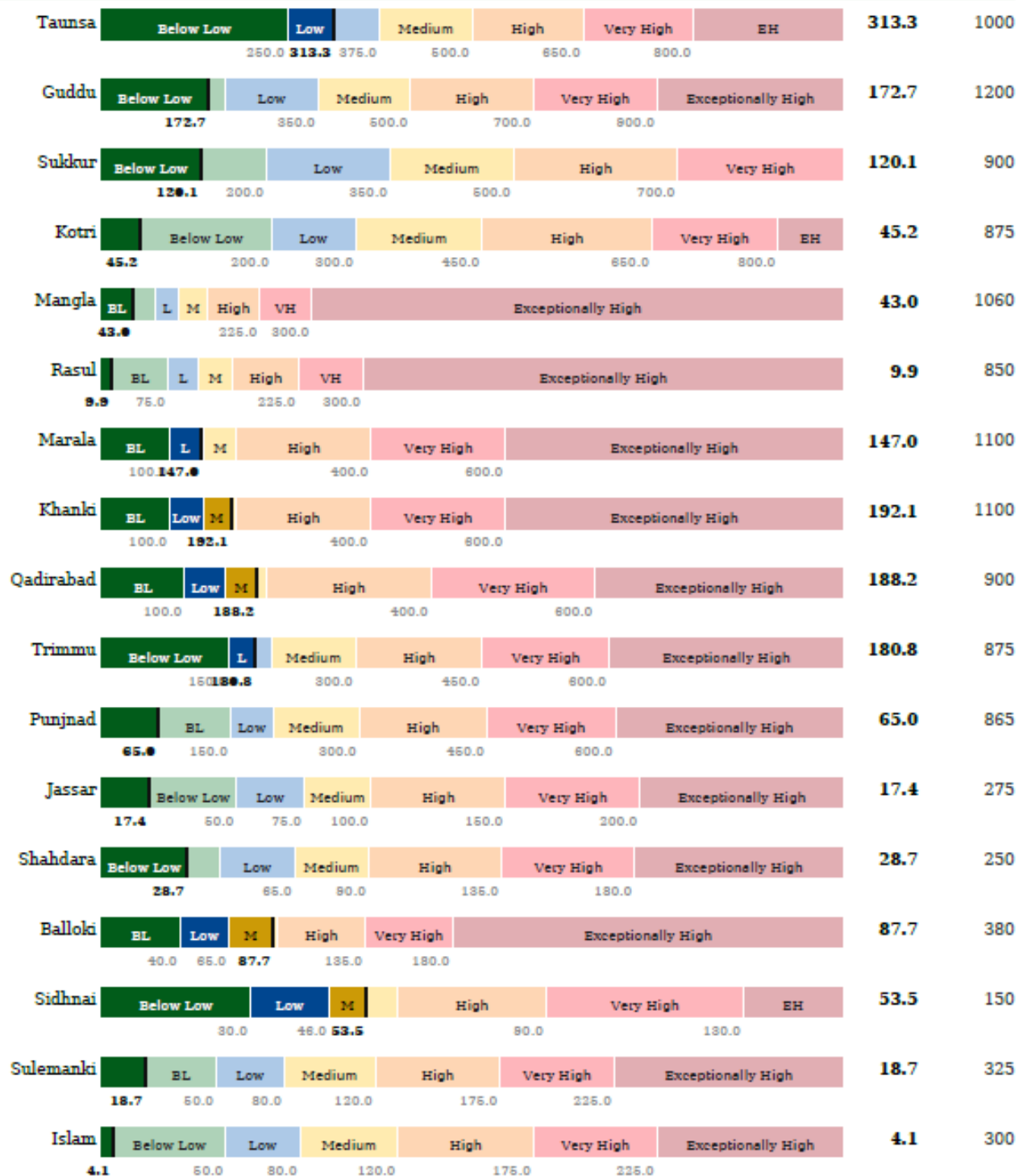
