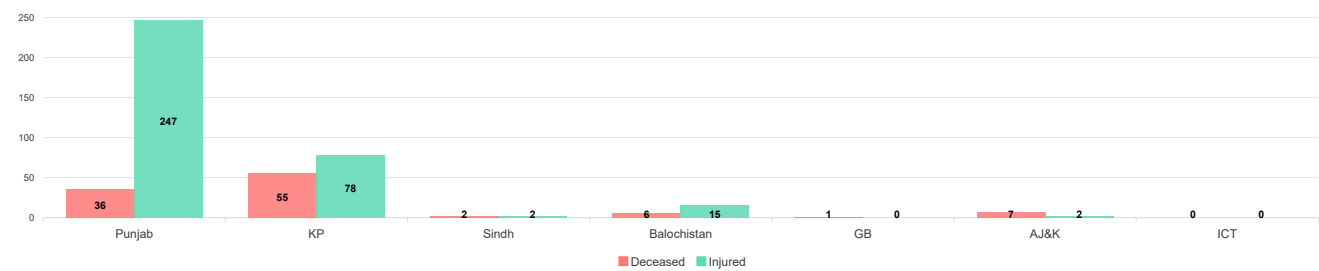

Deceased & Injured



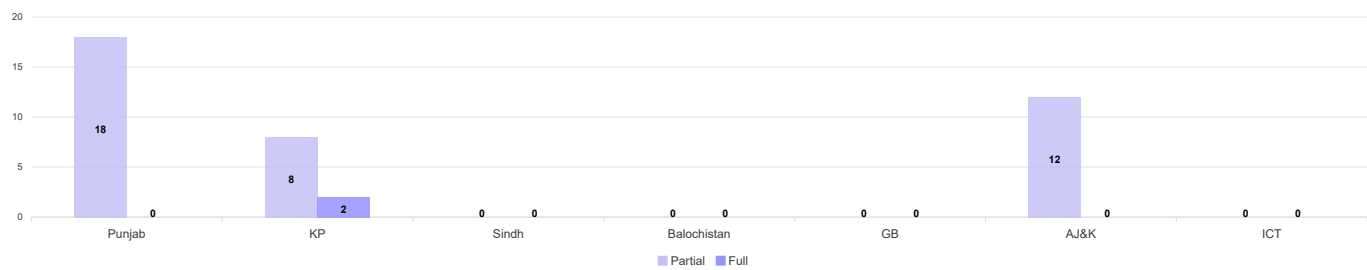

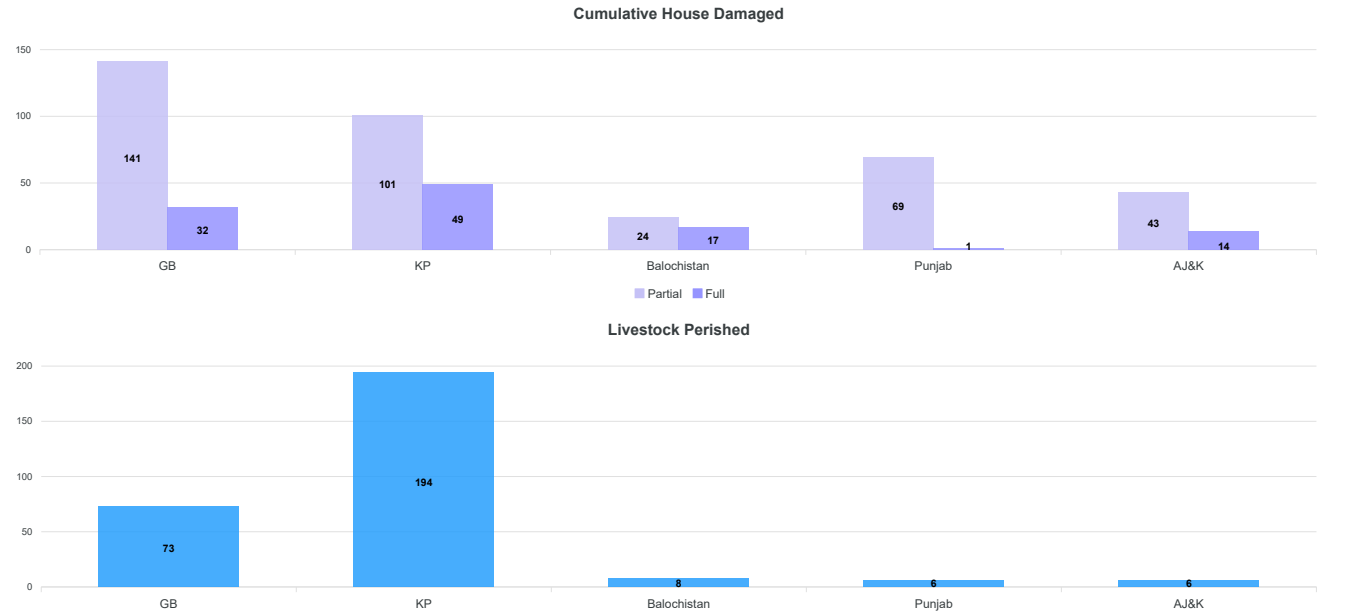

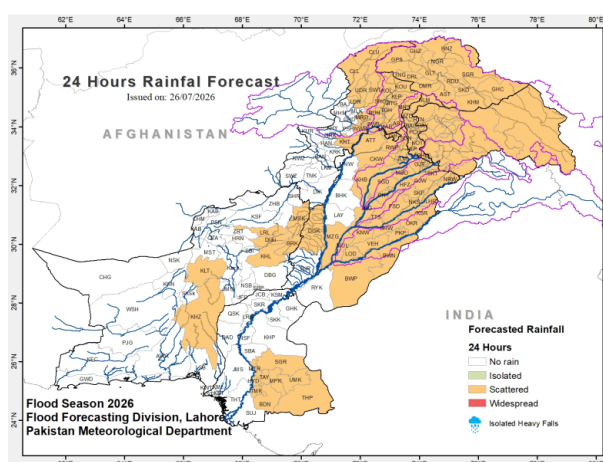

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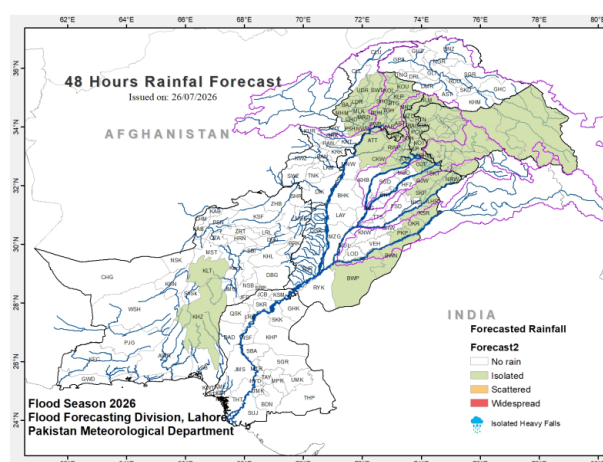

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- **River Indus** at Kalabagh, Chashma and Taunsa, **river Chenab** at Marala, Khanki, Qadirabad, Chiniot Bridge and Trimmu, **river Ravi** at Balloki and Sidhnai are in **Low flood level**.
- All major rivers at other gauging stations are flowing in their normal flows.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northwest parts of the country, today lies over northeastern parts of country.
- Yesterday's low-pressure area over southwest Rajasthan (India) and adjoining Gujarat, today lies over west Rajasthan (India) and has weakened.
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over Northwest Balochistan.
- Weak moist currents from Bay of Bengal are penetrating into the country up to 5,000 feet.
- Yesterday's low pressure over south of West Bengal (India) and adjoining Orissa (India) persists.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the upper catchment of all major rivers, **Islamabad, Kashmir, Gilgit-Baltistan,**
