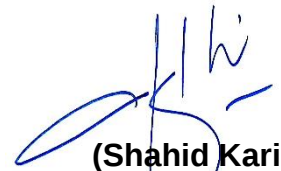

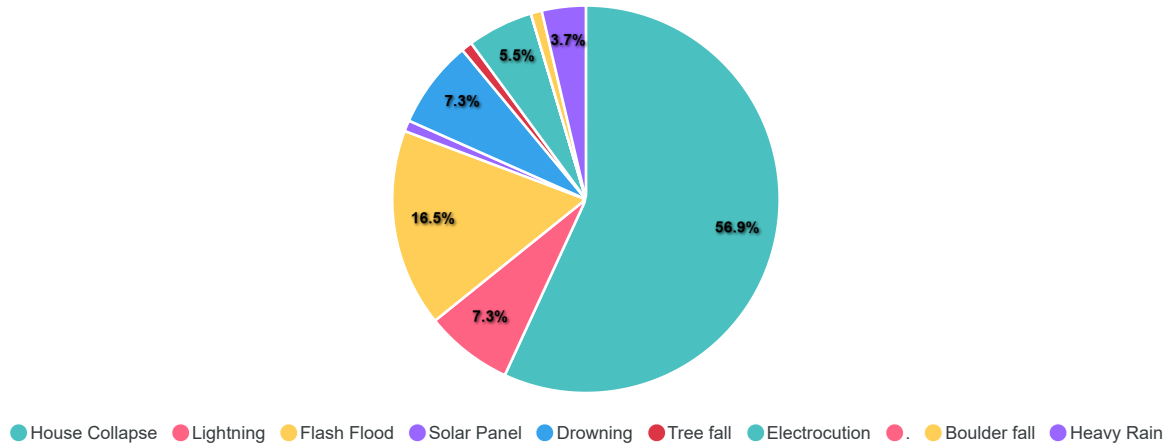

Deceased & Injured



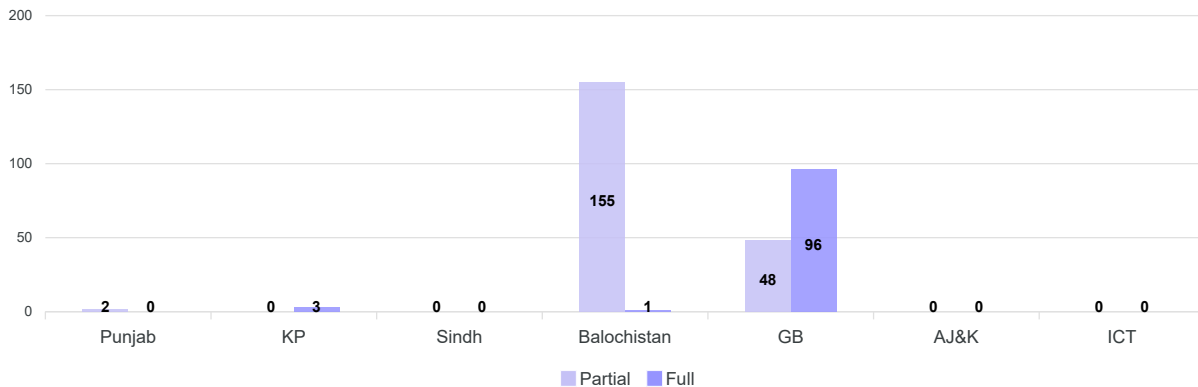

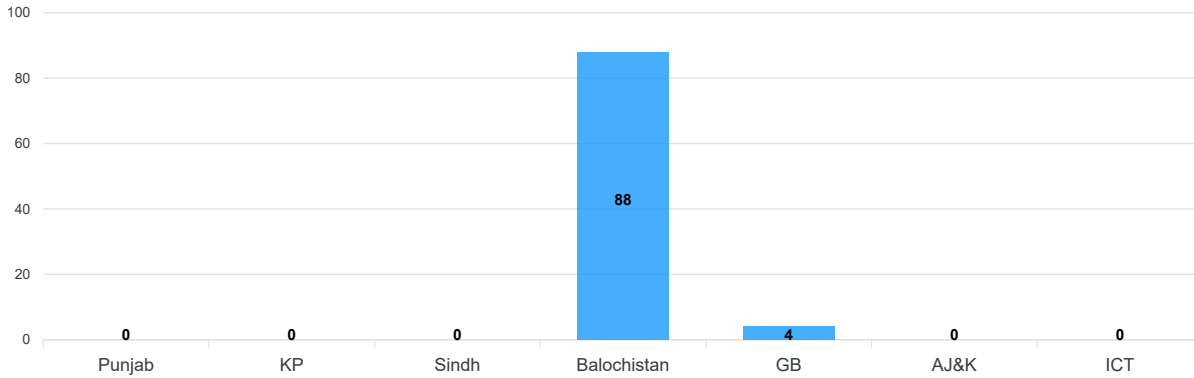

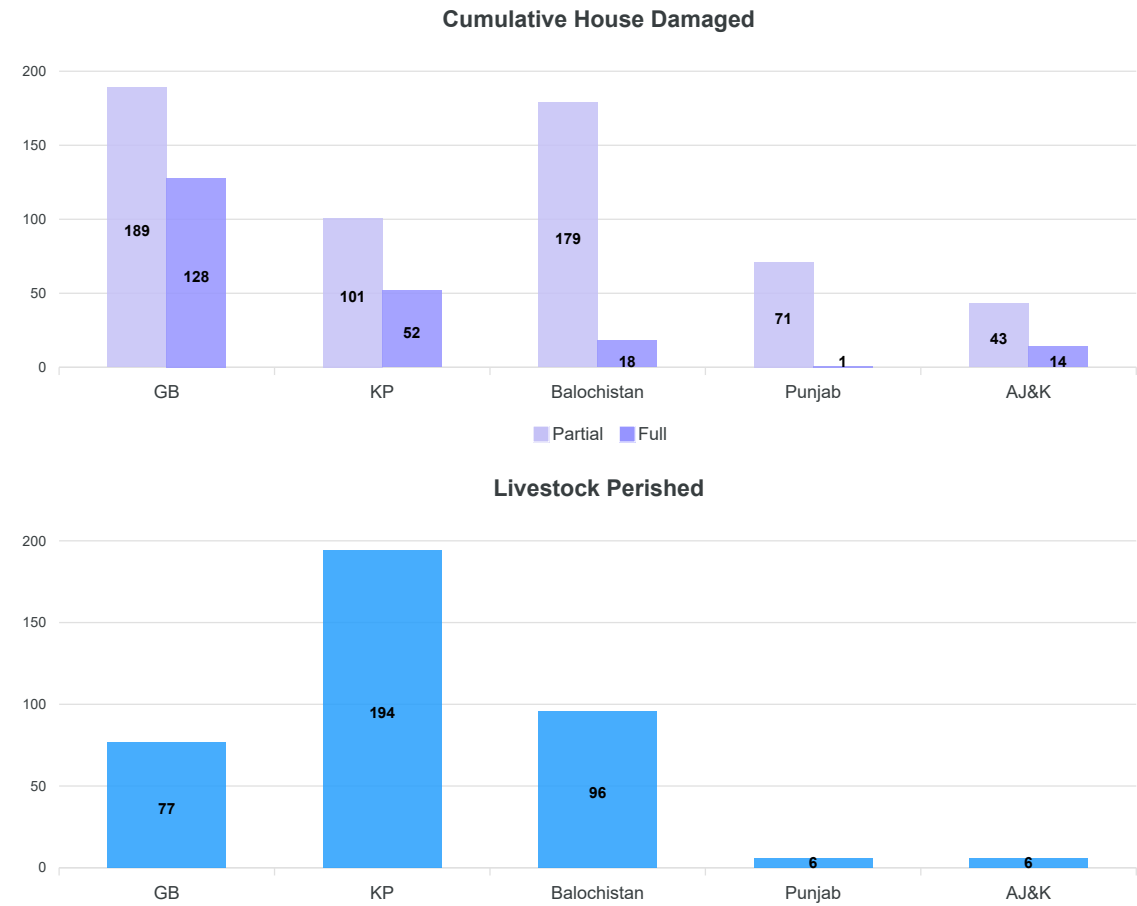

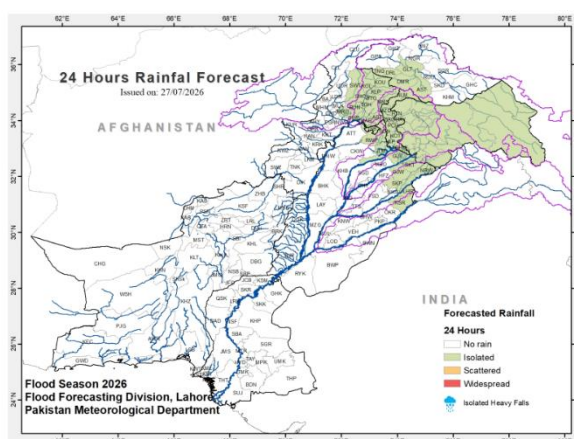

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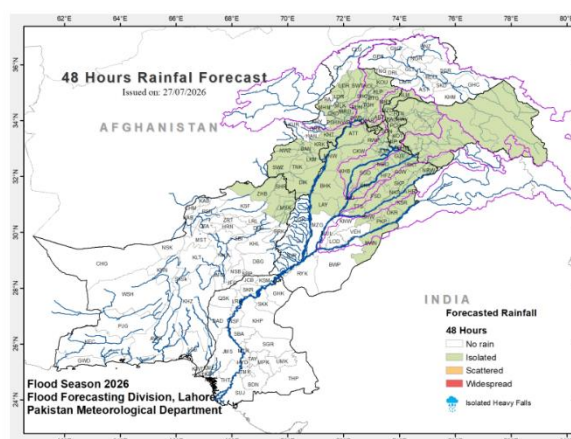

1. RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK

- **River Ravi** at Sidhnai is in **Medium flood level**. **River Indus** at Kalabagh, Chashma, Taunsa and Guddu, **river Chenab** at Khanki, Qadirabad and Trimmu are in **Low flood level**. All major rivers at other gauging stations are flowing in their normal flows.
- River Indus at Guddu is expected to attain **Medium flood level**, whereas, Sukkur will attain **Low flood level** in next 24 to 36 hours.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- A fresh trough of westerly wave lies over northwest Afghanistan.
- Yesterday's low-pressure area over west Rajasthan (India) has become insignificant.
- The seasonal low-pressure area lies over Northwest Balochistan.
- Weak moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating into the country up to 3,000 feet.
- Yesterday's low pressure over south of West Bengal (India) and adjoining Orissa (India) remained stationary and has become well-marked low (996 hPa). It is likely to move northwestwards towards northeast Orissa and adjoining Jharkand (India).
