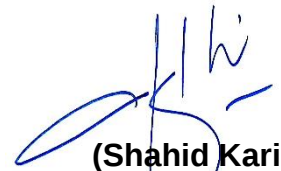

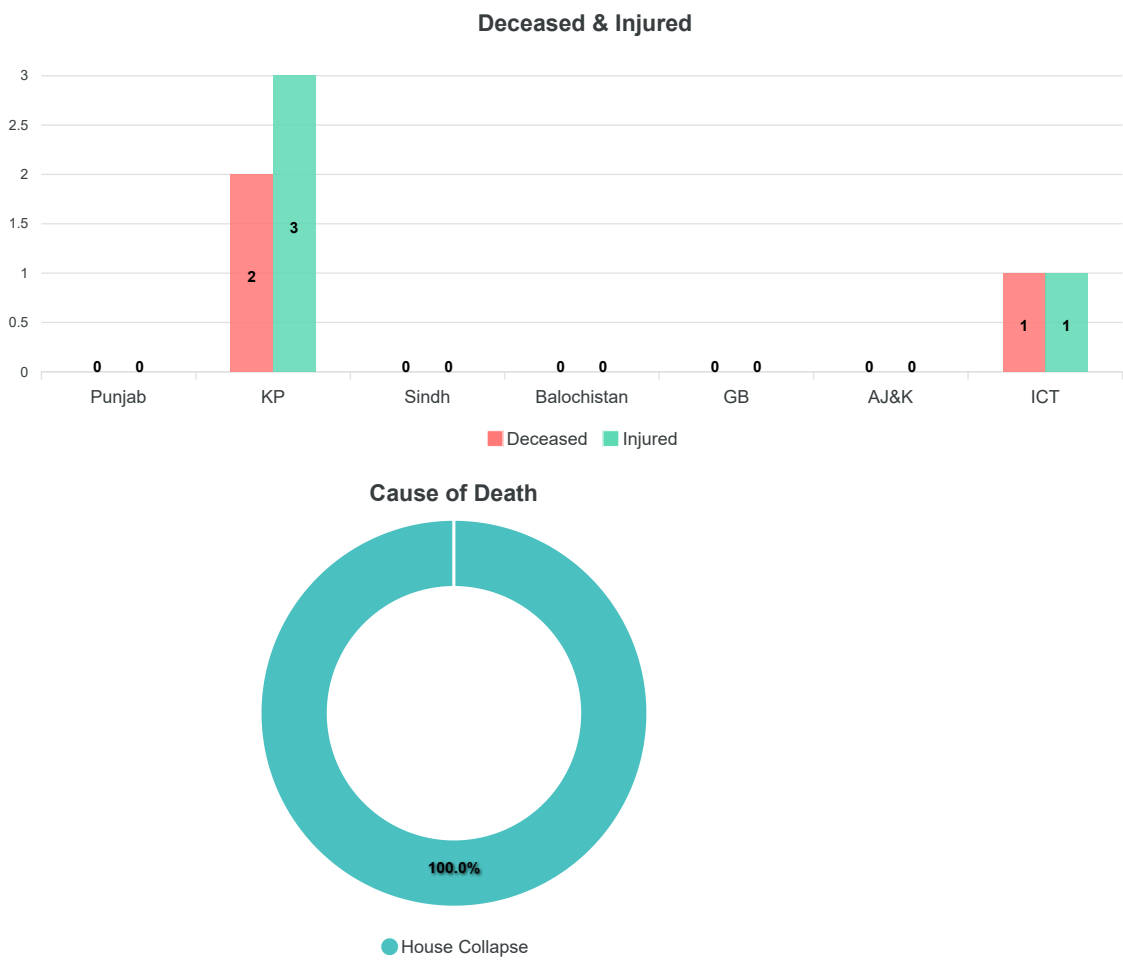

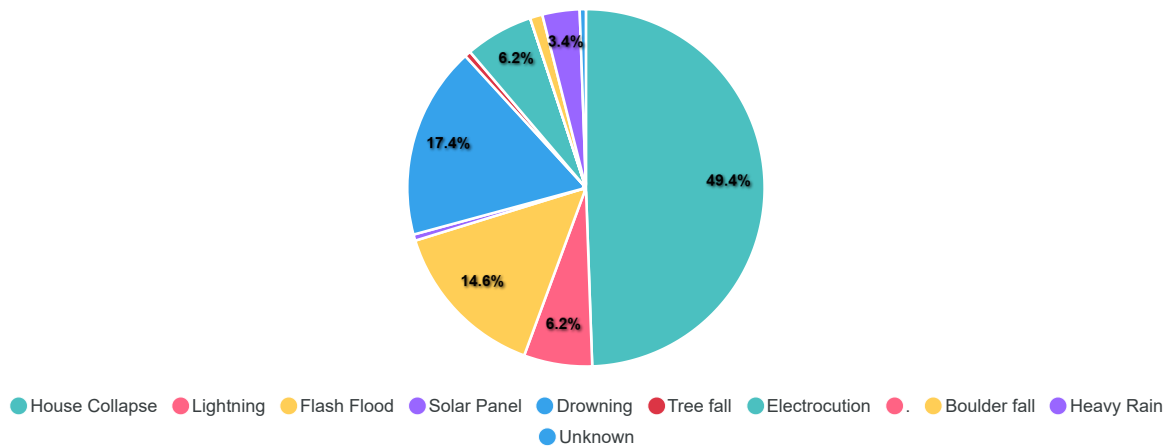

Deceased & Injured



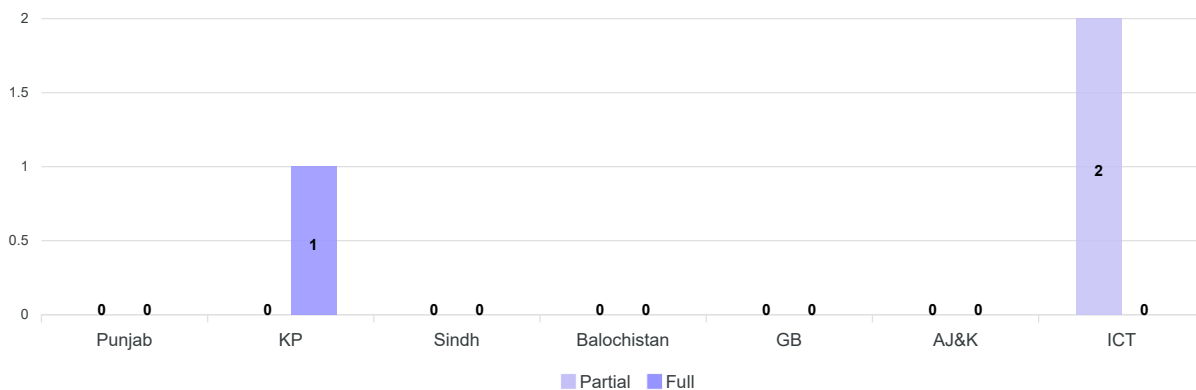
Causes of Death



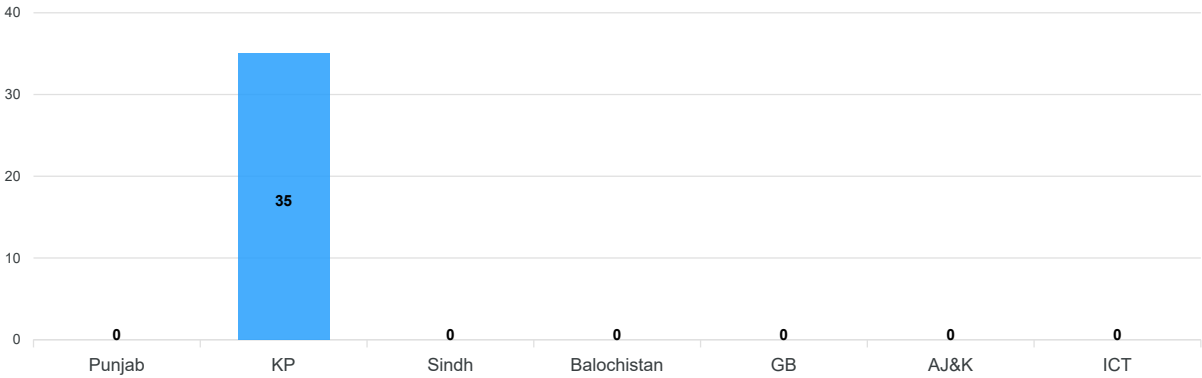

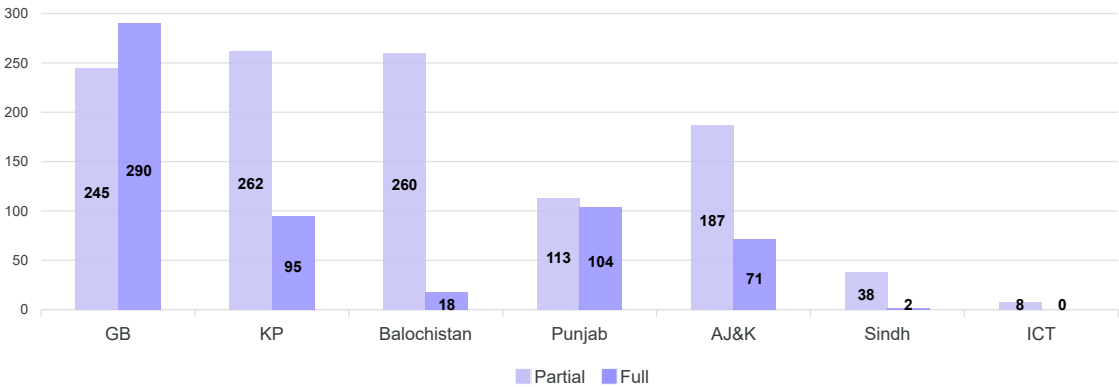

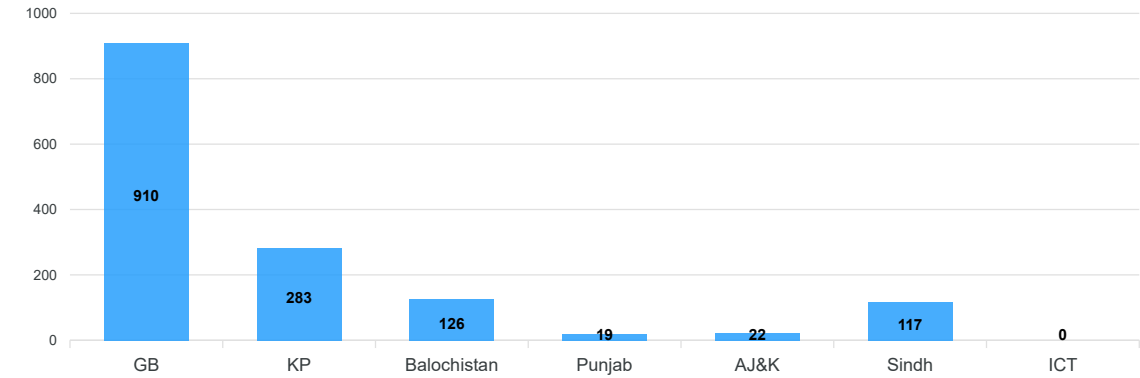

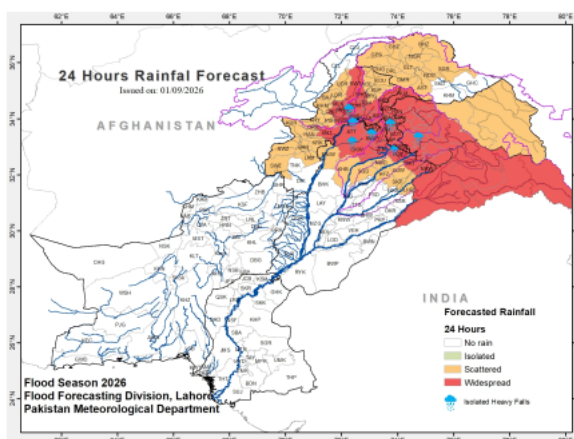

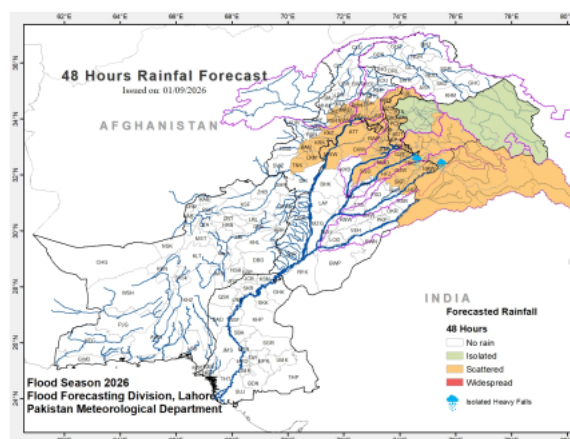

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's westerly wave over northeast Afghanistan persists and its trough is affecting northern parts of the country.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northeast Balochistan.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over north Bay of Bengal and adjoining northeast Orrisa (India) today lies over west West Bengal (India).
- Moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating into the upper parts of the country up to 3,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Scattered to widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the **upper catchments of all the major rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir, upper Punjab and Upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa** during **next 36-hours**. However, **isolated heavy fall** is also expected over **Islamabad, Kashmir, along with upper catchments of Indus, Jhelum and Chenab rivers** during the period.

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- **Tarbela reservoir** is currently at its **Maximum Conservation Level**, while **Mangla reservoir** is **77% filled**.
- All major rivers are flowing at normal levels.

IV. HYDROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **River Indus** at **Kalabagh** and **Chashma** is expected to attain **Medium Level Flood** during **next 24-36 hours**.
- Flows in **rivers Jhelum** and **Chenab** and **their associated tributaries** are expected to **increase moderately** during **next 48-hours**.

V. WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

- **Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy fall** is expected over the **upper catchments** of **Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi and Sutlej rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir,**
Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Abbottabad, Buner, Charsadda, Haripur, Kohat, Malakand, Mansehra, Mardan, Nowshera, Shangla, Swabi, Swat and Tor Ghar.
Punjab: Attock, Chakwal, Gujrat, Jhelum, Narowal, Rawalpindi and Sialkot.
- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the **upper catchments of Indus river,**
Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Bajaur, Bannu, Batagram, Hangu, Karak, Khyber, Kohistan, Kurram, Lakki Marwat, Mohmand, North Waziristan, Orakzai, Peshawar and Dir.
Punjab: Gujranwala, Hafizabad, Khushab, Lahore, Mandi Bahauddin, Mianwali, Sargodha and Sheikhupura.
Gilgit-Baltistan: Astore, Darel, Diamir, Ghizer, Gilgit, Gupis, Hunza, Nagar, Rondou, Shigar and Tangir.
- **Mainly hot and humid weather** is expected over remaining most parts of the country.

VI. WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-HOURS

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the **upper catchments** of **Chenab, Ravi and Sutlej rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir,** However, **isolated heavy fall** is also expected over the **upper catchments of Chenab and Ravi rivers.**
Khyber Pakhtunkhwa: Abbottabad, Bannu, Buner, Charsadda, Haripur, Karak, Kohat, Lakki Marwat, Mansehra, Mardan, Nowshera, Peshawar, Swabi, Tank and Tor Ghar.
Punjab: Attock, Chakwal, Gujranwala, Gujrat, Hafizabad, Jhelum, Lahore, Mandi Bahauddin, Mianwali, Narowal, Rawalpindi, Sargodha, Sheikhupura and Sialkot.
- **Isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the **upper catchments** of **Indus and Jhelum rivers.**
- **Mainly hot and humid weather** is expected over remaining most parts of the country.

- Flows in all the **major rivers** along with their **associated nullahs** are expected to **increase moderately** till **05th September.**
