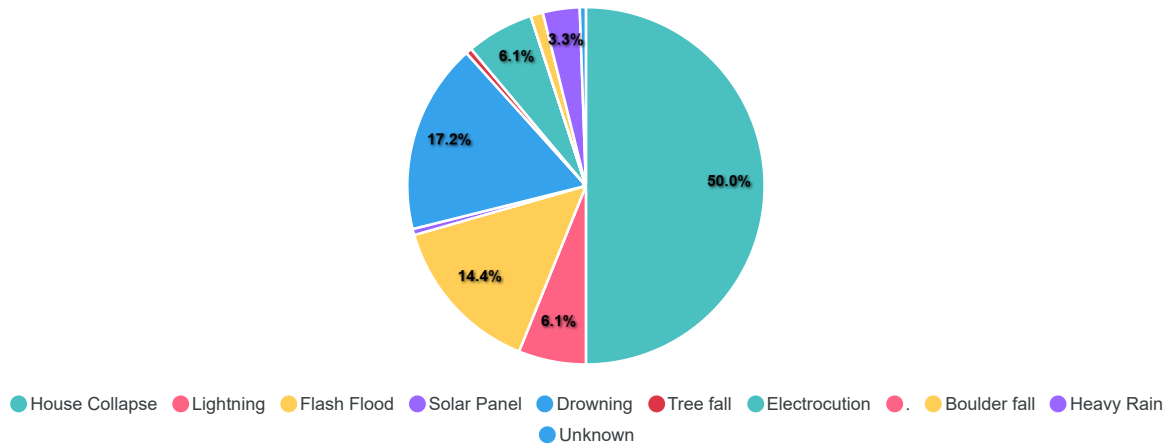

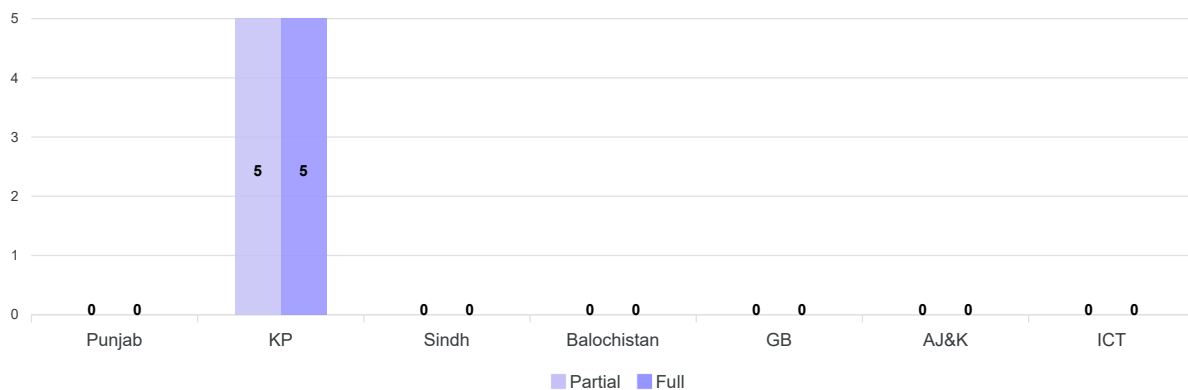

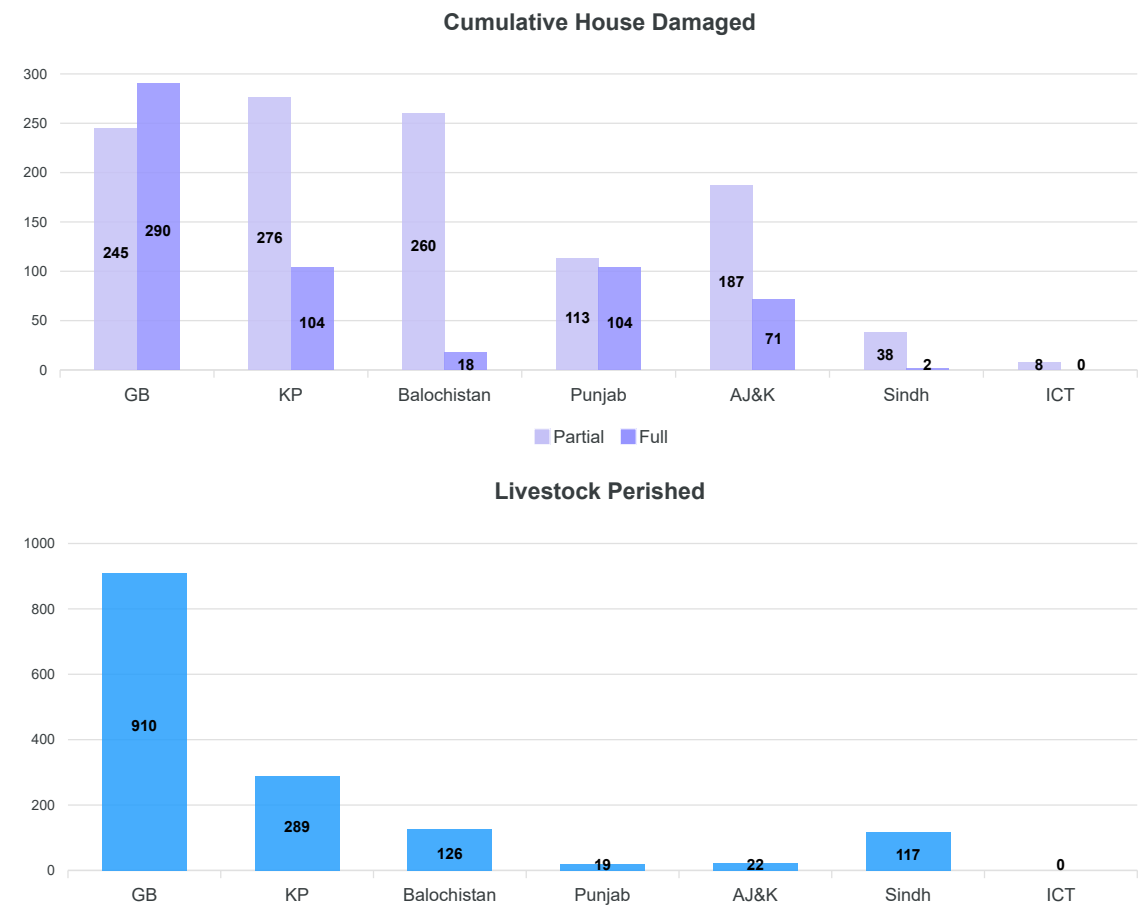

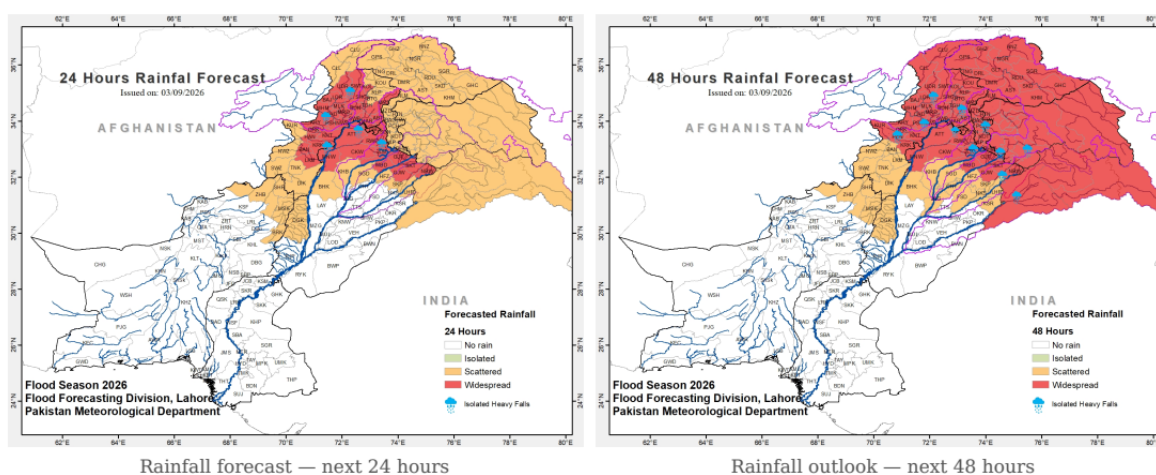

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Yesterday's westerly wave over west Afghanistan has moved eastwards and today lies over north western parts of the country.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northeast Balochistan.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over north Chattisgarh today lies over north east Madhya Pradesh.
- Moderate moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating into the upper parts of the country up to 3,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Scattered to widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated heavy to very heavy falls** is expected over the **upper catchments of all the major rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir, Gilgit Baltistan, upper Punjab and Upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa from 03rd evening to 05th September.**

- **Tarbela reservoir** is currently at its **Maximum Conservation Level**, while **Mangla reservoir** is 78% filled.
- **River Indus** at **Kalabagh** and **Chashma** is at **Low Flood Level**.
- All other major rivers are flowing in their normal flows at other gauging stations.

IV. HYDROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- Flows in **rivers Indus, Jhelum, Chenab and Ravi** along with **their associated tributaries** are expected to **increase moderately from 04th to 05th September**.
- **Flash Flooding** is expected in the **streams of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa** and **tributaries of river Kabul from 03rd evening to 05th September. September.**
- **Urban Flooding** is also expected in **Jhelum, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Sialkot, Narowal and Rawalpindi from 04th to 05th September.**

WEEKLY SIGNIFICANT OUTLOOK

(04th September, 2026 to 10th September, 2026)

I. RAINFALL OUTLOOK

- **Scattered to widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy** to **very heavy falls** is expected in the **upper catchments of all the major rivers, Islamabad, Kashmir, Gilgit Baltistan, upper Punjab and upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa** till **05th September**.

- **Medium to High Flows** in Nullahs of rivers **Jhelum (Suketar, Jabba, Kahan and Bunha), Chenab (Bhimber, Halsi, Palku, Aik, Dota, Doara and Dowara) and Ravi (Basantar, Bein, Deg, Sakki)** are expected from **04th to 06th September**.
- **Flash Flooding** is expected in the **streams of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and tributaries of river Kabul** from **04th to 05th September**.
- **Urban Flooding** is also expected in **Islamabad, Rawalpindi, Jhelum, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Sialkot and Narowal** from **04th to 05th September**.
