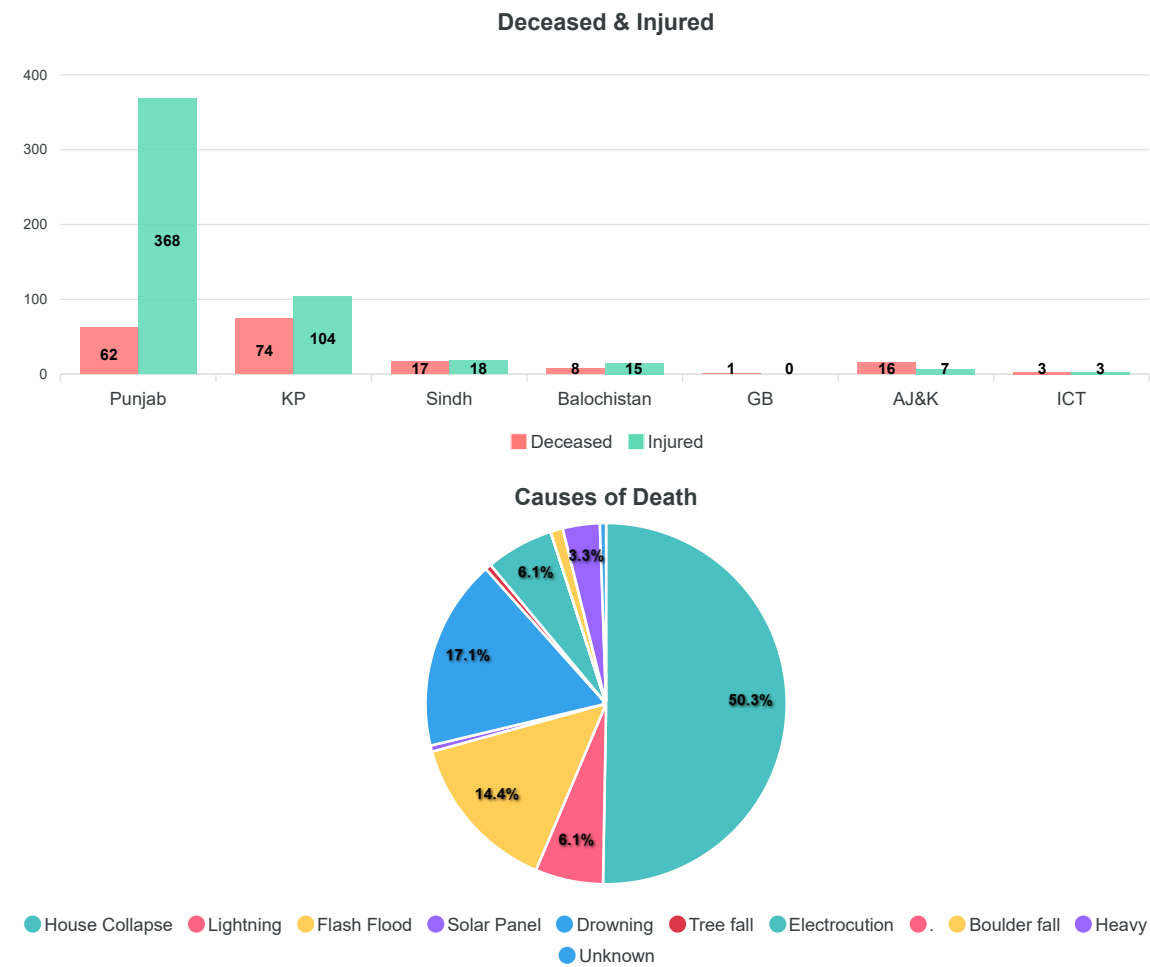

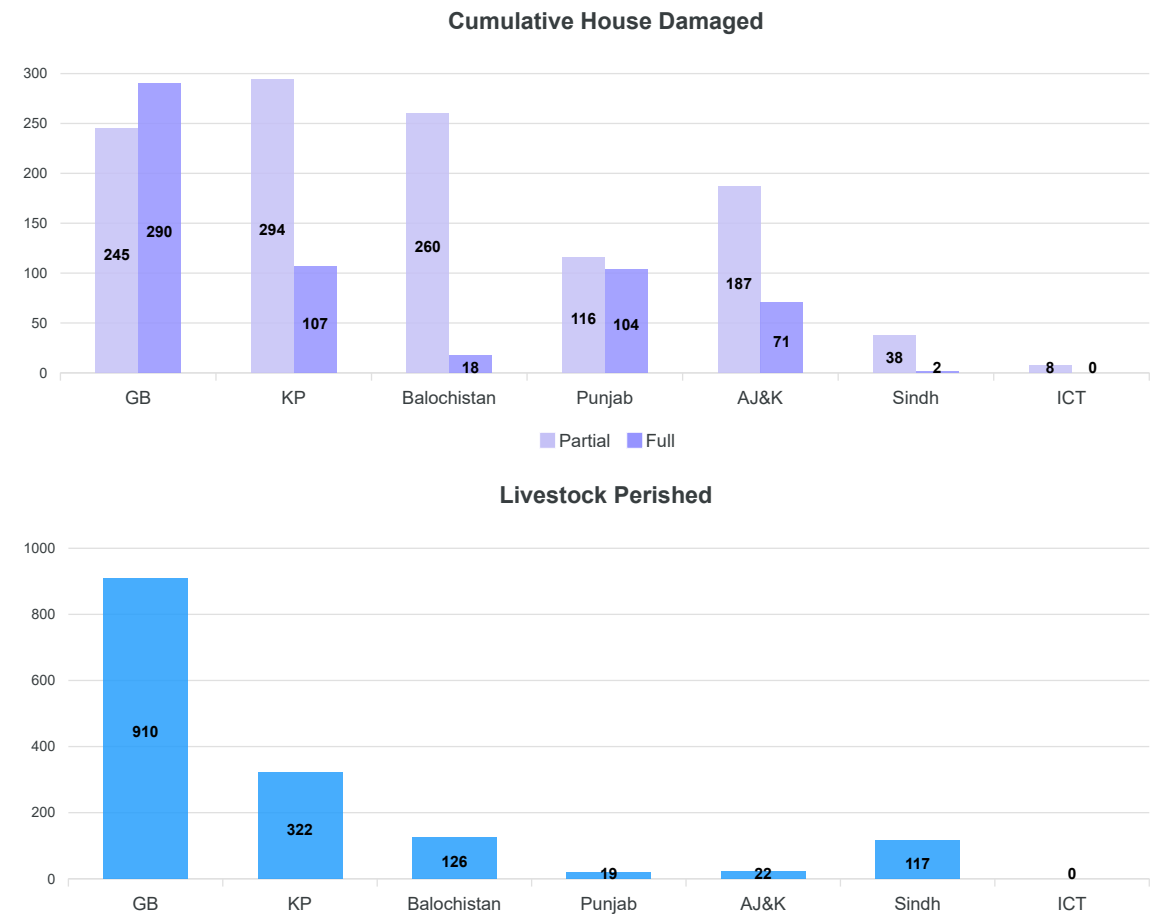

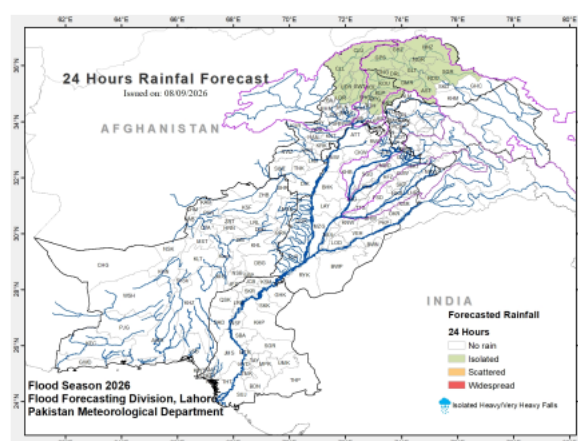

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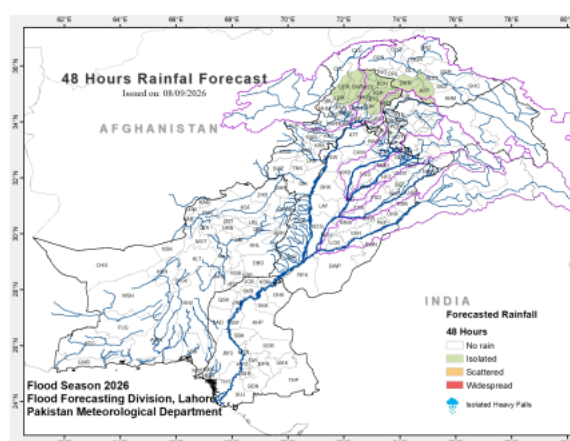

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- Continental air is prevailing over most parts of the country, however shallow trough of westerly wave lies over extreme northern parts of the country.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northwest Balochistan.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over central Uttar Pradesh (India) has weakened and today lies over east Uttar Pradesh (India).
- Weak moist currents from Arabian sea are penetrating into the upper parts of the country up to 2,500 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- Mainly dry weather** is expected over most parts of the country, however, **Isolated rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the **upper catchments of Indus river, upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Gilgit-Baltistan** during next 24 Hours.
