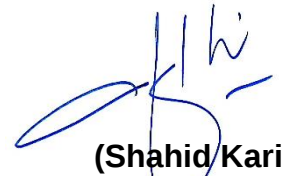

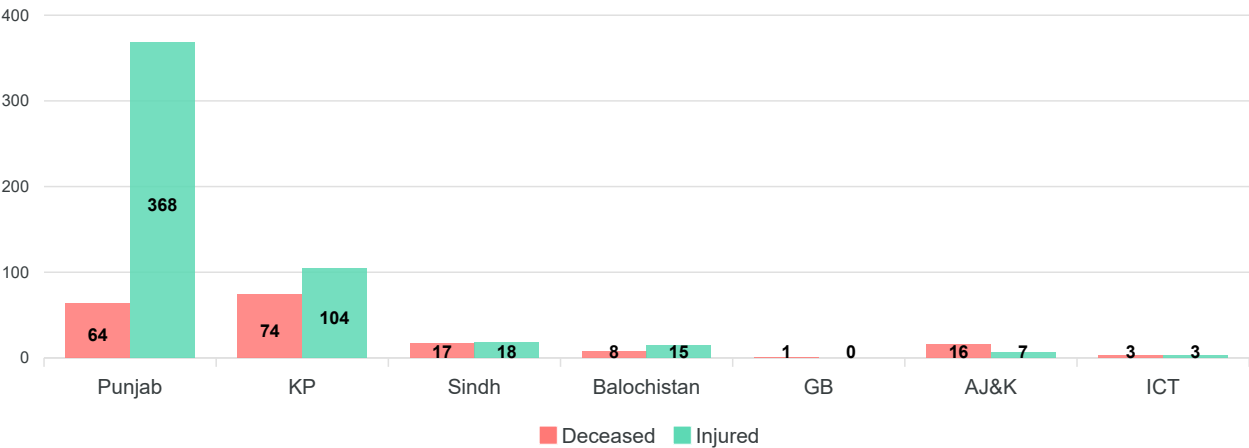

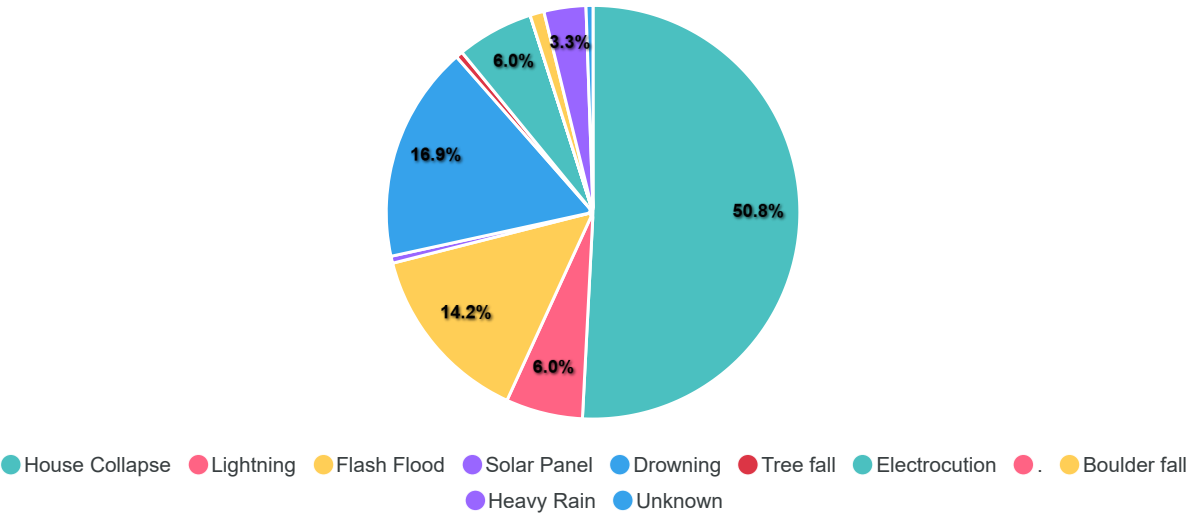

Causes of Death

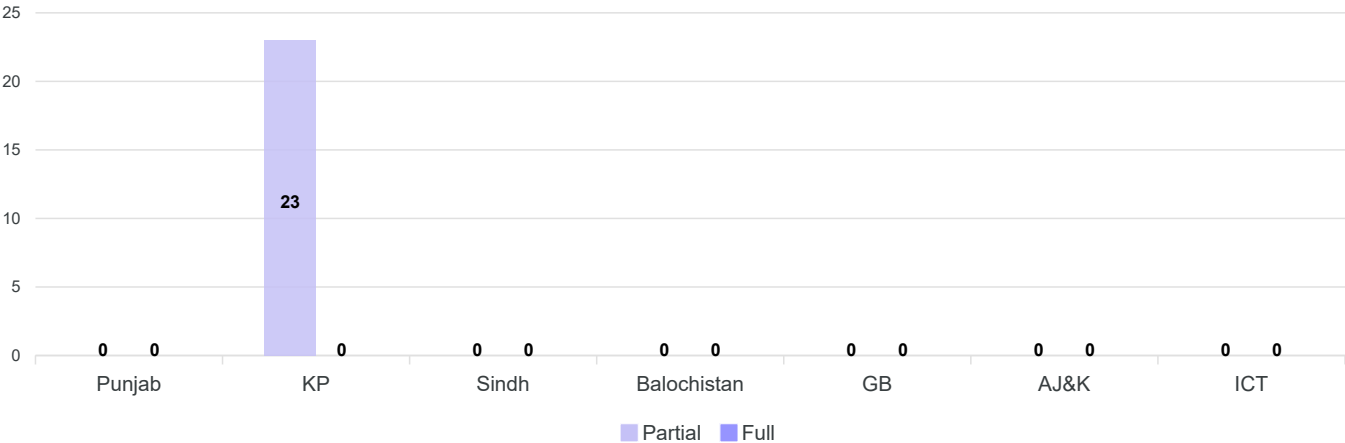

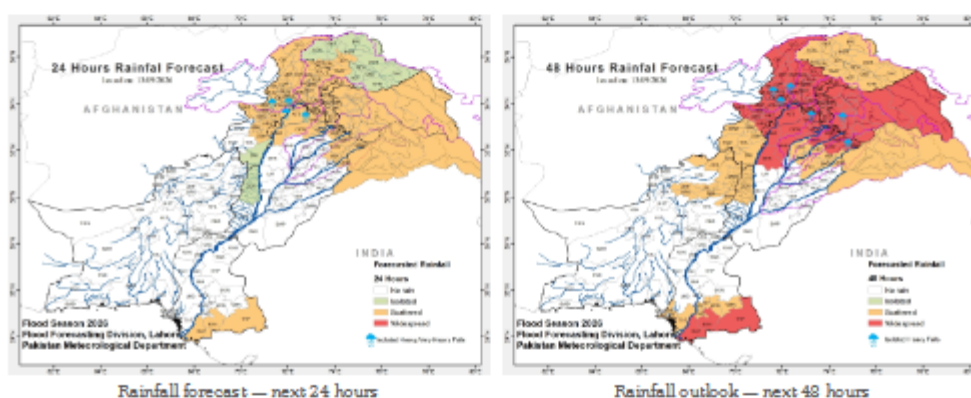

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- A shallow trough of westerly wave still persists over the northern parts of the country.
- Yesterday's westerly wave over north of Afghanistan persists there.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over west Chattisgarh and adjoining areas of Madhya Pradesh today lies over north of Maharashtra and adjoining areas of Madhya Pradesh and it is expected to move westwards.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over northwest Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Bay of Bengal are penetrating into the upper and south eastern parts of the country up to 3,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Scattered to Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated heavy falls is expected over the catchments of all the major rivers, Islamabad, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Kashmir, Gilgit-Baltistan, upper Punjab and Southeastern Sindh during next two days.**
